METHODIST CHURCH (CANADA) MISSIONARY SOCIETY FONDS. – 1851-1950. – 15.43 m of textual records. – 35 photographs. --50 glass slides.

The Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church Canada Conference was established in 1824, and continued under the Methodist Episcopal Church in Canada when it formed in 1828. When this Church joined with the British Wesleyans to form the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada in 1833, the Society evolved into an Auxiliary of the Wesleyan Missionary Society (Great Britain) to support the growth of Aboriginal and domestic missions. This union was disrupted in 1840, but resumed in 1847. In 1854, the British Hudson's Bay Territory missions were transferred to the Missionary Society in Canada which gradually took over the responsibility of all mission work from Britain beginning in Central Canada and the Northwest. The Society, with some changes in administrative structure, existed as part of the Methodist Church of Canada, formed in 1874, and the Methodist Church (Canada), formed in 1884. The object of the Society came to be the support of domestic, Indigenous, immigrant, new Canadian, French Canadian, and other missions carried on under the direction of a central committee and board, and later also under the Conferences. In 1906, the missions were divided between two new Departments-Foreign and Home. Missions to European immigrants and domestic missions fell under the care of the Home Department. Missions abroad and, until 1920, missions to Japanese, Chinese, and Indigenous People in Canada came under the direction of the Foreign Department.

SERIES 1: RECORDS OF THE GENERAL BOARD AND MISSIONS. – 1851-1926. – 1.08 m of textual records. – 5 microfilm reels : positive and negative.

The Missionary Committee of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada Missionary Society met annually to review missions sustained by the Society, make decisions regarding the future of the work, apportion and appropriate funds, and select and appoint missionaries for Canada and abroad. The functions of the Committee were continued under the Central Missionary Board, established with the formation of the Methodist Church of Canada in 1874, and under the General Board of Missions, established with the formation of the Methodist Church (Canada) in 1884. Commencing in 1833, the operations and finances of the Missionary Society of the Weslevan Methodist Church in Canada were administered by a Board of Managers, elected annually by the Society, and audited by the Missionary Committee. In 1858, the Board was replaced by the Committee of Consultation and Finance appointed by the Missionary Committee. The Committee of Consultation and Finance continued under the Central Missionary Board of the Methodist Church of Canada, and under the General Board of Missions of the Methodist Church (Canada). The name of the Committee changed in 1894 to Executive Committee. The Committee on Estimates was appointed by the Executive Committee in 1907 to report to the General Board of Missions regarding projected income and expenditures. It met twice yearly. The Local Sub-Committee was appointed by the Executive Committee to deal with business arising from General Board or Executive meetings which required attention before the next meeting of the larger body.

Series includes: minutes of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada Missionary Committee, 1865-1874; minutes of the Central Missionary Board of the Methodist Church of Canada, 1874-1883; minutes and correspondence of the General Board of Missions of the Methodist Church (Canada), 1884-1925; minutes of Executive Committee and antecedent committees, 1851-1924; minutes of Committee on Estimates, 1907-1915; and minutes of Local Sub-Committee and the Officers' Council, 1906-1926. The minutes provide insight into the operational, administrative, and financial concerns of the Missionary Society, occasionally touching on broader mission issues, and serve as a point of reference in tracing the development and scope of the work, as they cover the entire mission field including foreign missions in Japan and China, domestic missions, city missions, work with Indigenous People in Ontario, Quebec and Western Canada, work with immigrants and new Canadians throughout Canada.

SERIES 2: CORRESPONDENCE OF THE GENERAL SECRETARIES. – 1868-1923. – 6 m of textual records.

CONTENT WARNING: This series describes archival material that relates to Residential and Day Institutions, Missions, and uses language that is offensive, outdated and harmful. Residential and day institutions, historically referred to as residential and day schools, were institutions that forced Indigenous children from their families, homes, cultures, and languages and contributed to a legacy of harm still pervasive today. Residential and day institutions divided children by Judeo-Christian gender binaries and structured the institution in this manner. Materials of this nature can be upsetting and may be unsuitable for some uses. Please make any necessary preparations prior to viewing. The Indian Residential Schools Crisis Line at 1-866-925-4419 is available as needed.

The General Secretaries of the Missionary Society, among other duties, were to make themselves acquainted with the entire mission field by official correspondence and visitation, and to publish the annual report of the Society. From 1868 to 1925, they were: Enoch Wood and Lachlin Taylor, 1868-1874; Enoch Wood, 1874-1878; Alexander Sutherland, 1878-1906. After 1906 there were General Secretaries for the Foreign Department: Alexander Sutherland, 1906-1910; T.E. Egerton Shore, 1910-1913; James Endicott, 1913-1925; and for the Home Department: James Allen, 1906-1918 and Charles E. Manning, 1918-1925.

Series consist of records relating to foreign and home missions, including missions in West China and Japan; domestic missions; work with Indigenous People in Quebec, Ontario and Western Canada; work with Japanese and Chinese immigrants and new Canadians, mainly in British Columbia; work with European immigrants and new Canadians; work with French Canadians in Quebec; and work with people in cities. Series is divided into the following subseries: 1. copybook of outgoing correspondence of Enoch Wood, Lewis Peake, Lachlin Taylor, and Alexander Sutherland 1868-1880; 2. correspondence of Alexander Sutherland, 1875-1910; 3. correspondence of Frank H. Langford, 1908-1909; 4. incoming correspondence of the General Secretary, Alexander Sutherland, 1900-1910; 5. correspondence of T.E. Egerton Shore, 1907-1912; 6. correspondence of the Assistant Secretary, Allan C. Farrell, 1910-1912; and 7. correspondence of General Secretary, James Endicott, and the Assistant Secretary, Jesse H. Arnup, of the Foreign Department 1912-1923.

Subseries 1: Copybook of Outgoing Correspondence of Enoch Wood, Lewis Peake, Lachlin Taylor and Alexander Sutherland. – 1868-1880. 7 cm of textual records.

Enoch Wood and Lachlin Taylor served jointly as General Secretaries until 1874, after which Wood served alone until 1878. He was succeeded by Alexander Sutherland who held the office until 1906. Lachlin Taylor was also Secretary-Treasurer until 1874 when he was succeeded by Alexander Sutherland who served the office from 1874 to 1878. Lewis Peake served as Accountant.

Subseries consists of copybook of outgoing letters, memoranda and reports written mostly by Enoch Wood and Lewis Peake, but also by Lachlin Taylor and Alexander Sutherland in their various capacities. Correspondence relates to domestic missions; missions to Indigenous People in Quebec, Ontario, and Western Canada; the mission to the Chinese in British Columbia; missions to Germans in Ontario; missions to French Canadians in Quebec; and, after 1873, to missions in Japan.

Subseries 2: Correspondence of Alexander Sutherland. – 1875-1910. – 3 m of textual records.

Alexander Sutherland served as Secretary-Treasurer from 1874 to 1878, as General Secretary, from 1878 to 1906, and, after the division of the Society's work into Home and Foreign Departments in 1906, as General Secretary of the Foreign Department until 1910.

Subseries consists of copybooks of outgoing correspondence including general correspondence, 1875-1910; correspondence with the Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs (Ottawa), 1875-1898; correspondence re missions in China and Japan, 1891-1910; correspondence while on Western Canada trips, 1894-1903; also copybook of "Documents," 1886-1910; and daily agenda book, 1902-1903.

Correspondence of A. Sutherland and occasionally of his assistant relating to all types of mission fields prior to 1906, and thereafter to the work of the Foreign Department (West China, Japan, Orientals in Canada, Native Indian of Canada). Correspondents include: missionaries in the field and prospective missionaries; Conference officials responsible for appointment to domestic (English-speaking) missions; ministers in charge of collecting contributions; officials of other denominations or countries; etc. Subjects include: placement and relocation of missionaries; institutions and schools for Indigenous Peoples; requests for funds; new buildings; legacies to the Society; controversies in the field; international missionary meetings; etc.

Letters, memoranda and reports from A. Sutherland and occasionally from John Shaw (Assistant Secretary) to Indian Affairs are generally addressed to the Superintendent-General, but sometimes in the early years to the Hon. or Right Hon. Minister of the Interior, and sometimes in the later years to the Deputy Superintendent-General. The material relates mostly to Indigenous Residential and Day Institutions administered by the Methodist Church; some items are critical of the government's policies and practices.

Subseries 4: Incoming Correspondence of General Secretary, Alexander Sutherland. – 1896-1910- 1.2 m of textual records.

Alexander Sutherland served as General Secretary of the Foreign Department from its creation in 1906 until his death in 1910.

Subseries consists of incoming correspondence relating to foreign missions in Japan and West China; work with Chinese and Japanese immigrants and new Canadians, mainly in British Columbia; and work with Indigenous People in Quebec, Ontario and Western Canada. There is also a small amount of material relating to domestic missions in Ontario, Quebec, and the Prairie and Maritime Provinces; work with other immigrant groups and new Canadians including Italians, Ukrainians, and Scandinavians; work with French Canadians in Quebec; finances of the Society; and cooperation with other missionary societies.

T.E. Egerton Shore served as Assistant Secretary, 1906-1910, and as General Secretary, 1910-1913.

Subseries consists of correspondence related primarily to missions work with Indigenous People in Quebec (Caughnawaga, Oka), Ontario (Cornwall Island, Alderville, Chemong, Scugog, Muncey, Oneida, Mount Elgin Residential School, Grand River, New Credit, Six Nations, St. Clair, Walpole Island, Rama, Georgina Island, Christian Island, Gibson, Cape Croker, Saugeen, Parry Island), the Prairie Provinces (Brandon Residential School, Red Deer Industrial Institute, Cross Lake, Oxford House, Nelson House, Norway House, Valley River, Berens River, Fisher River, White Fish Lake, Good Fish Lake, Battle River, Hobbema, White Whale Lake, Saddle Lake, Morley); British Columbia (Kishpiax, Kitselas, China Hat [Klemtu], Sea Island, Port Simpson [Lax Kw'alaams], Kitamaat, Hazelton, Bella Bella, Rivers Inlet, Coqualeetza Residential School, Clayoquot, Quamichan, Koksilah, Victoria, Duncans, Nanaimo, Skidegate, Bella Coola, Cape Mudge, Port Essington) work with Chinese and Japanese immigrants and new Canadians, mainly in British Columbia ; and foreign missions in Japan and West China. A small extent of the correspondence relates to Shore's tour of missions in Japan and China; work with other immigrant groups in Canada including East Indian and Europeans; administrative matters; fund-raising; Laymen's Missionary Movement; and cooperation with other missionary societies including the Women's Missionary Society.

Previously known as Shore Papers.

Microfilm copy available on 13 microfilm reels (positive and negative); records were reordered after finding aid was created. The records relating to West China listed as Box 11 to 15 exist only on microfilm in the format described. The original papers were removed from this accession and interfiled into West China Mission records - 78.096C and West China Union University records - 78.097C.

The records in this accession which related to the West China Mission were re-located (probably in 1978) to an artificial collection titled West China Mission Collection (Accession 78.096C). Likewise, the records relating to West China Union University were re-located to another artificial collection titled West China Union University Collection (Accession 78.097C, described in finding aid 13).

Unfortunately, the re-located records were interfiled with material from other sources. As a result, it is sometimes difficult to trace the records listed in this finding aid to their new locations as indicated in finding aids 19 and 13.

In general, the contents of Boxes 11-15 listed in this finding aid are now located in Boxes 8 to 12 and 17 in the West China Mission Collection. This generalization does not apply to records formerly in Box 14 Files 278-292 which are now located in Box 4 of the West China Union University Collection.

Fortunately, the records listed in this finding aid were microfilmed before the West China material was removed. As a result, the previous arrangement of these records can be studied by viewing the microfilms.

The original party of missionaries consisted of Rev. Dr. and Mrs. Virgil C. Hart, veterans of missionary work in China under the Methodist Episcopal Church, U.S., their daughter, Miss Stella Hart (later Mrs. Hare), Dr. and Mrs. Omar L. Kilborn, Rev. and Mrs. G.E. Hartwell and Dr. and Mrs. David W. Stevenson. The group landed at Shanghai on November 3, 1891, remaining there throughout the winter. In mid-February they left for the interior, arriving at Chengtu, the capital of Szechwan, on May 21, 1892.

The first reinforcements, Rev. James Endicott and his wife and Dr. H.M. Hare, arrived in Chengtu in the spring of 1894. They were accompanied by Miss Sara C. Bracbill and Dr. Retta Gifford (later, the second Mrs. Kilborn) sent out by the Women's Missionary Society (W.M.S.). In 1896, Dr. and Mrs. W.E. Smith joined the group in Chengtu.

The mission grew slowly at first, by 1901 there were only 19 missionaries under the General Board and Woman's Missionary Society together. In 1917, however, the mission staff included 75 men (67 of whom were married), and 35 single women; by 1919, there were 155 under the General Board and 32 women under the W.M.S. At the time of Union in 1925, there were a total of 218 missionaries in the field of West China.

As the number of missionaries increased, the territory of the mission expanded. In 1894, Kiating, 100 miles south of Chengtu, was opened in addition to the capital city. In 1905, Junghsien and Jenshow were opened; in 1907, Penghsien and Tzeliutsing; in 1908, Luchow. In 1910, the mission inherited control of the London Missionary Society (L.M.S.).

Medical Work: While there was a primary emphasis laid on Evangelical and Educational work, emphasis within the mission was also laid on medical work, and two of the original four men sent out to China were doctors. During 1894, two hospital buildings were erected in Chengtu and medical work began in 1895. However, these structures were completely destroyed in the riots of 1895. The year 1897 witnessed the second hospital built with a dispensary, waiting room, and two wards for 25 patients.

By 1917, there were 21 doctors, 15 men and 6 women, working in eleven hospitals in the then central stations. A medical college was created in 1914 in connection with the West China Union University, in an attempt to create native medical workers. Dental hospitals were opened in Chengtu and Chungking, and in 1920, a Faculty of Dentistry was established within the University.

The first foreign missionaries of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada were sent to Japan in 1873. Davidson Macdonald, a medical doctor and ordained minister who had trained in business, served as missionary in Japan from 1873 to 1898. He taught, preached, acted as business adviser, and carried on a medical practice until his return to Canada in 1904.


