**PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS AND SOCIAL SERVICE
FONDS. – 1857-1925. – 1.5 m of textual records.**

The Home Mission Committee was established in 1875 and was divided into two sections, the Eastern Section for the Maritime Provinces, and the Western Section for the rest of Canada. In 1912, the Home Mission Committee Western Section, the Augmentation Committee Western Section, and the Board of French Evangelization amalgamated, along with other mission work in Canada including work among the Aboriginal and Jewish peoples, to form the Board of Home Missions. In 1915, the Board of Social Service and Evangelism (see fonds 124) merged with the Board of Home Missions to form the Board of Home Missions and Social Service. The Home Mission Committee Eastern Section continued independently from the Western Section until 1921 when it also became part of the Board of Home Missions and Social Service.

Fonds consists of the following series: letterbooks of the Home Mission Committee Eastern Section, 1857-1915; records of the Board of Home Missions and Social Service and antecedent bodies, 1907-1925; records pertaining to missions to the Aboriginal People in Manitoba and the Northwest, 1875-1923; and records of the Committee on the Augmentation of Stipends Western Section, 1896-1903.

Presbyterian Church in Canada Board of Foreign Missions fonds (122) for records pertaining to missions to the Chinese in Canada (122/12), and East Indians in British Columbia (122/13), as these missions remained under the administration of the Board of Foreign Missions until 1925.

Presbyterian Church in Canada Board of Foreign Missions fonds (122) for records pertaining to missions to Aboriginal People (122/14) and Jews in Canada (122/15) prior to 1912, as, until this date, these missions were under the administration of the Board of Foreign Missions.

**SERIES 1: LETTERBOOKS OF THE HOME MISSION COMMITTEE EASTERN SECTION. – 1857-1914.
– 12 cm of textual records.**

This Committee was established in 1875 as a continuation of the Board of Home Missions of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces of British North America, 1860-1874, which was itself a continuation of the Board of Home Missions of the Presbyterian Church of Nova Scotia. It became part of the Board of Home Missions and Social Service in 1921.

Series consists of letterbooks of the above three denominations.

SERIES 2: RECORDS RELATING TO WORK OF THE BOARD. – 1907-1925. – 36 cm of textual records.

The Board of Home Missions and Social Service formed in 1915 when the Board of Home Missions and the Board of Social Service and Evangelism amalgamated.

Series consists primarily of correspondence received by the Board's General Superintendents, A.S. Grant and J.H. Edmison. Some material predates the Board, and reflects the work of the Home Mission Committee Western Section, and the Board of Home Missions. Records relate to work with Aboriginal People, including boarding schools such as the Birtle Indian Boarding School, Birtle, Man., and missions such as Swan Lake, Man. and Cote Indian Reserve, Sask. 1911-1925; work with immigrants and new Canadians, particularly Ukrainians in Western Canada, 1907-1922; institutions such as the Presbyterian College, Saskatoon, Sask., the Hugh Waddell Memorial Hospital, Canora, Sask., and St. John's Hall, Quebec, 1912-1923; and individuals serving with the Board.

SERIES 3: RECORDS PERTAINING TO MISSIONS TO THE ABORIGINAL PEOPLE IN MANITOBA AND THE NORTHWEST.

Missions to the Aboriginal People in Western Canada were transferred in 1912 to the Board of Home Missions which became part of the Board of Home Missions and Social Service in 1915. From 1875 to 1912, these missions were administered by the Foreign Mission Committee Western Section/Division which changed its name in 1912 to the Board of Foreign Missions Western Section, and in 1915, to the Board of Foreign Missions.

See Presbyterian Church in Canada Board of Foreign Missions fonds (122/14) for a complete description of records pertaining to missions to the Aboriginal People for the period 1875 to 1923. Post-1912 records comprise only 4 cm of the records.
