UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA BOARD OF EDUCATION FONDS. – 1925-1933. – 24 cm of textual records.

The Board of Education was set up at Church Union in 1925 and was to have responsibility for colleges and secondary schools. In 1932 the Board was amalgamated with the Board of Religious Education to form the Board of Christian Education. In 1942, the responsibility for colleges and secondary schools was given to the Board of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The Secretary of the Board was the Reverend J.W. Graham.

Fonds consists of minutes of the Board and Executive, 1926-1933, and correspondence, 1925-1932.

Some restrictions may apply.
