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DIGEST OF MINUTES

EXECUTIVE OF THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

May 16th, 1956

The Executive of the Board of Home Missions met in the Board Room, Wesley Buildings, Toronto, on Wednesday, May 16th, 1956. The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. E. C. Armstrong, who occupied the Chair until the arrival of the Chairman.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, R. W. K. Elliott, D. M. J. Buttars, E. C. Armstrong, Wm. Fingland, Messrs. E. R. Mattinson and A. W. Zurbrigg. Mr. Neil A. Campbell was present as a corresponding member.

Regrets were received from Mr. Arthur H. Webster and Dr. George Telford.

On motion, Rev. D. M. J. Buttars was appointed Minute Secretary.

Appointment of Superintendent of Missions

Dr. Macdonald stated that he had attended a joint meeting of representatives of the Executives and of the Home Mission Committees of the Montreal and Ottawa and Bay of Quinte Conferences, held in Brockville, May 10th, in order to consult regarding the appointment of a successor to Dr. J. I. MacKay, whose removal to the Toronto Superintendency, created a vacancy in the Superintendency of the Montreal and Ottawa Conference and the Eastern Presbyteries of the Bay of Quinte Conference.

In addition to the five nominations sent forward by the joint committee, it was stated that Rev. Melville Buttars had been nominated by the Oshawa Presbytery and that a letter had been received from the Rev. W. G. Prosser, indicating his interest in the superintendency. Mr. Buttars asked that his name be withdrawn.

After reviewing the nominations from the Joint Committee, the application referred to above and other names under consideration, the Executive gave direction to the Secretaries regarding the procedure to be followed in approaching certain individuals, with a view to securing a Superintendent. The Secretary was further instructed to report his negotiations to the next meeting called to deal with this matter.

Licences to Administer Sacraments

1. It was agreed to recommend to the Sub-Executive of General Council that licences to administer the Sacraments be granted, for one year, to the following lay missionaries:

- 2. It was agreed to approve the granting of a licence to Mr. Mark Parsons, lay supply, LaRiviere, Carman Presbytery, subject to approval of Presbytery.
- 3. The request from Bruce Presbytery that a licence be granted to Mr. R. G. Brown, lay supply, Lion's Head, was referred to the June Executive, pending further information.
- 4. No action was taken on the request of Arcola-Estevan Presbytery that a licence be granted to Mrs. C. A. Clarkson, Manor.

Fund for Retired Workers

It was agreed to refer to the Secretaries, with power to issue, the case of Miss Sadie Farquhar, left without resources on the death of her brother, Mr. John Farquhar, for whom she had kept house and who had served the Church as a lay supply since 1922.

Toronto, Downtown Survey

It was agreed to empower the Secretaries to make payment of the expenses of the Downtown Survey, now being conducted in Toronto, from the Euphemia Mitchell Trust Fund, in accordance with the terms of the Trust.

Hospital Work

Bella Coola General Hosnital

- 1. The Secretary reported on the result of Judge Buchanan's visit to Bella Coola to negotiate a settlement with Dr. G. A. Vanner, as authorized by the Advisory Committee. A summary of the terms of settlement, as agreed upon between Judge Buchanan and Dr. Vanner, was reported as follows and was approved:
- (a) That Dr. Vanner's employment with the Church as Medical Superintendent of the Bella Coola General Hospital cease as of Monday, May 14th, 1956, and on that date he vacate the doctor's residence.
- (b) That the Board pay to Dr. Vanner the sum of \$3,000, being the total of five months' salary.
- (c) That the debt of \$635.02 owing by Dr. Vanner to the Board on account of an advance made to him be cancelled.
 - (d) That the Board purchase from Dr. Vanner such of his household

furniture and equipment as he is willing to sell to it and at the cost price paid therefor, the furniture and equipment being practically new.

- (e) That the Board pay the freight costs, Bella Coola to Vancouver, on personal household goods and equipment, such as linen, medical books, medical instruments and equipment.
- (f) That the Board pay personal transportation costs of Dr. Vanner and family from Bella Coola to Toronto.
- 2. Appointment of Superintendent: On motion, the appointment of Dr. W. Donald Watt as Acting Superintendent, from May 14th, was confirmed; salary to be at the rate of \$650 a month, with furnished house, and that he retain \$500 a year out of the Medical Services Fund for post graduate and special study
- 3. Moving Expenses: Payment of Dr. Watt's moving expenses from Queen Charlotte City to Bella Coola was authorized.
- 4. Banking Authority: Agreed that the officers authorized to sign cheques and conduct business with the Canadian Bank of Commerce, Vancouver, be Rev. R. G. Bracewell, Dr. W. Donald Watt and Miss Lottie Franklin, or any two of them.
- 5. The Secretary reported receipt of a communication with regard to the formation of a Hospital Society at Bella Coola, with the idea of negotiating re the possibility of taking over the Hospital from the Board of Home Missions. This was received for information.

Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital

- 1. It was agreed to confirm the appointment of Dr. Mairi MacLean, on a temporary basis, with salary at the rate of \$6,000 a year and living quarters
- 2. The Secretaries were authorized to appoint a second doctor as soon as a suitable arrangement can be made.
- 3. Banking Authority: Agreed that authorization of officers to sign cheques and conduct business with the Bank be referred to the June Executive

Enquiry from Terrace, B.C.

It was decided that no action be taken on an enquiry from the Secretary of the Hospital Research Group, Terrace, B.C., as to whether the Board might consider the financing, construction and operation of a modern fifty bed hospital at Terrace.

Northern Saskatchewan Superintendency

The Secretary stated that Dr. Hall, having cleared with his doctor, has indicated that it was his wish to continue as Superintendent for Northern Saskatchewan, with the understanding that there would necessarily be some modification in his working schedule.

It was agreed that Dr. Macdonald should ask Dr. Hall to designate what duties he felt he could undertake, so that some provision might be made for caring for any part of his work he felt he was not able to perform.

It was decided, further, that the Secretary should discuss informally with the Sub-Executive of General Council the matter of procedure to be followed when persons become ill while in office and cannot carry full responsibility, with the idea of some authority competent to deal with such situations being designated.

Winnipeg, Church Extension Director

On motion, it was resolved to approve, in principle, the appointment of Rev. F. J. Douglas as Church Extension Director for the City of Winnipeg, with the understanding that at the end of the next Conference year the matter be reviewed in the light of the work done and of what remains to be done from the standpoint of prosecuting the campaign for funds and promoting Church Extension work.

Non-Anglo-Saxon Publications

It was agreed to approve the appointment of Dr. G. A. McMillan to succeed Dr. C. H. Best on the Board of the "Canadian Ranok" and to act as Treasurer, from the date of his assuming office as Superintendent of Missions.

Indian Work

Norway House Residential School

Dr. Macdonald reported progress in the securing of a Principal for the Norway House School, there being two suitable prospects in mind.

Morley Residential School

It was agreed that Mr. Fraser M. Shaw, Principal, be authorized to transact business with The Royal Bank of Canada, Cochrane, Alberta, on behalf of the School, to implement which the following resolution was adopted:

Be It Resolved: That Fraser M. Shaw, Principal of the Morley Indian Residential School, is hereby authorized for and in the name of the said Morley Indian Residential School, Morley, Alberta, to sign cheques upon The Royal Bank of Canada, Cochrane, Alberta, on behalf of the said School;

Also That the said Fraser M. Shaw is hereby authorized on behalf of the said School to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the said School account only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said School, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or signer of such Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes and negotiable paper to discount the same or to deposit the same otherwise than for collection purposes with the said Bank:

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said School and the Bank and to receive all paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release;

And That all other powers heretofore given in this matter be and are hereby revoked.

Congratulations

Heartiest congratulations were extended to Rev. J. R. Leng on the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity to be conferred May 19th by Queen's University.

Pointe-Aux-Trembles French Institute .

On recommendation of the Montreal Presbytery, the resignation of Dr. H. Joliat was accepted from the Board of the Institute.

MONCTON

Mountain View, Church—Agreed to vote grant of \$700 from Church Extension Fund for improvements to church hall.

MONTREAL

Caughnawaga, Mission House—Agreed to vote grant for repairs to roof, subject to Presbytery action.

Pointe-Aux-Trembles French Institute—Agreed to confirm payment of \$117.18 for damage to car owned by Mr. Goupil, while parked on school property during windstorm, and legal fees.

TORONTO CENTRE

Toronto, 306 Woodbine Ave.—Payment of \$139.68, for supplying and installing Domestic hot water tank, was confirmed.

BRANTFORD

Grand River, Ohsweken Manse—Agreed to pay for cost of repairs to motor for pump.

HAMILTON

Fruitland (Winona-Fruitland Charge), Manse—Request for loan of \$8,000 and grant of \$1,000 was referred to Secretaries, with power.

Hamilton, Manse for Japanese Missionary—Agreed to purchase property for \$11,000.

ESSEX

Windsor, Walker Road Manse—Agreed to vote loan of \$6,000 and grant of \$2,000; loan repayable in four years.

NORWAY HOUSE

Cross Lake, Mission House—Agreed to confirm payment of \$28.50 for freight on lighting plant and fares, Cross Lake to Norway House, for Mr. and Mrs. King.

WINNIPEG

Altona (Emerson Charge) Church—Agreed to grant of \$500 and to extend time for repayment of loan to December 31st, 1956 and 1957.

Winnipeg, Oxford Church—Application for grant of \$15,000 and loan of \$25,000 from Grace Church Fund was referred to June Executive.

Winnipeg, St. Paul's Church—Application for loan of \$20,000 from Grace Church Fund was referred to the June Executive.

Winnipeg, Silver Heights Manse—Agreed to vote loan of \$6,000 and grant of \$3,000; loan to be repaid in ten years.

ARCOLA-ESTEVAN

Antler (Antler-Sinclair Charge) Church Basement—Agreed to vote loan of \$500 and grant of \$500.

PRINCE ALBERT

Uranium City, Church—Agreed to vote grant of \$6,000 and loan of \$6,500, repayable in ten years.

EDMONTON

Duffield, Manse—Agreed to authorize repairs to plaster in front room, due to moisture from heavy rains, redecoration of kitchen and hall, and finishing of bathroom, at cost of \$259.20, on the understanding that the source of the trouble in the first item mentioned will be corrected.

PEACE RIVER

Spirit River, Manse—Agreed to recommendation of Presbytery that all monies held in trust from the farm be returned and that the Secretary-Treasurer of the Farm Supervisory Committee be given permission to keep all receipts from the farm until mortgage on the new manse is paid in full.

RED DEER

Hobbema, Mission House—Agreed: (a) to confirm payment of \$110.80 for materials and labour, re coils for water system; (b) to purchase of new combination door at cost of \$27.80 and \$5.55 for installation; (c) to refer to Secretaries, with power, estimate of \$525 for forced air gas furnace, and (d) cost of new well—\$300.

SOUTH ALBERTA

Seven Persons, Student Cabin—Agreed to vote grant of \$202 for lumber, provided the field supplies the labour and other outfitting.

PRINCE RUPERT

Queen Charlotte City, Doctor's Residence—Agreed to purchase of electric refrigerator and washing machine, owned by Dr. W. D. Watt, for \$150.

VANCOUVER

Vancouver, Chinese Manse—Agreed: (a) to approve purchase of three storey frame structure for \$8,900 cash and to make available up to half the difference in cost between the sale price of the present manse and the purchase price of the new house; and (b) to pay up to \$400 towards repairs totalling \$1,200 to present manse.

Maintenance Claim

VANCOUVER

Vancouver, Sanford Memorial—Grant at rate of \$850 salary, \$720 rent and \$400 travel was voted by the Board for 1956, with the understanding that no grant would be paid after December 31st. In the light of information from the Superintendent and Home Mission Convener, it was agreed to authorize payment of the grant for the first quarter of 1957, with the suggestion that, beginning January 1st, there will be a substantial reduction; the first Executive in the new year to review the situation

Adjournment

The Board was adjourned with the Benediction.

DIGEST OF MINUTES

EXECUTIVE OF THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

May 23rd, 1956

A special meeting of the Executive of the Board of Home Missions was held in the Frontenac Arms Hotel, Toronto, on Wednesday, May 23rd, at 12.15 noon.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, R. W. K. Elliott, A. B. Irwin, D. M. J. Buttars, Geo. Telford, E. C. Armstrong, Wm. Fingland, and Mr. A. W. Zurbrigg.

Rev. George Telford was appointed Minute Secretary.

Superintendency of Missions

Re appointment of Superintendent of Missions for the Montreal and Ottawa Conference and the Eastern Presbyteries of the Bay of Quinte Conference: The Secretary, on instruction of the meeting of the Executive, May 16th, reported progress. The Secretaries were authorized to proceed with making the appointment, if deemed advisable.

Property

HALTON PRESBYTERY

Lyndwood, Church—A request for assistance to this new congregation was received from the Chairman of the Toronto Home Missions Council, as the result of an approach made to him by Mr. Harold Day, Chairman of the Halton Presbytery Church Extension Committee. Before a change in boundaries was made, this charge was within the Toronto West Presbytery and the Toronto Home Missions Council had given assistance to the amount of \$9,822.08 for purchase of the land. Under the Council's procedure, Lyndwood would be entitled to a loan up to \$25,000, and the Chairman of the Council asked if we would follow the same course as in the case of Applewood Acres—that is, make a loan of \$15,000 from Church Extension Funds to The Toronto Home Missions Council, ear-marked for Lyndwood; the Council to give an agreement to repay over a five year period, with interest at 3 per cent.

EXECUTIVE OF THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

June 27th, 1956

The Executive of the Board of Home Missions met in the Board Room, Wesley Buildings, Toronto, on Wednesday, June 27th. The Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, R. W. K. Elliott, D. M. J. Buttars, E. C. Armstrong, Wm. Fingland, Messrs. E. R. Mattinson and A. W. Zurbrigg.

Regrets were received from Rev. A. B. Irwin and Mr. A. H. Webster.

Rev. Gordon W. Porter, the newly appointed Superintendent of Missions, was made a corresponding member.

Rev. E. C. Armstrong was appointed Minute Secretary.

Confirmation of Minutes

Minutes of meetings of the Executive held May 16th and 23rd were circulated and, on motion, adopted, with a slight correction in the Minutes of the meeting of May 23rd.

Communication

A letter was received from Rev. R. DeWitt Scott, Secretary of the Montreal Presbytery, expressing appreciation on behalf of the Presbytery for the Board's action in providing assistance to the Finance and Extension Board by the appointment of Dr. Best and provision for a woman worker and a summer student, involving a total grant of \$6,110.00.

Resolutions

Sympathy

It was requested that the Secretary send a letter of sympathy on behalf of the Executive to the families of the following persons, who have recently passed away: Rev. H. G. Smith, Mrs. W. R. Auld, wife of the Home Mission Convener of Simcoe Presbytery, Mrs. L. J. King, wife of the Home Mission Convener of the Miramichi Presbytery, Rev. Y. Yoshioka, Mr. John Farquhar, and the Rev. Dr. George B. King.

Congratulations

(1) It was directed that the congratulations of the Executive be extended to the following on their election to the presidency of their

respective Conferences: Rev. Dr. W. S. Taylor, British Columbia; Rev. Ellis King, Saskatchewan; Rev. D. B. Sparling, Manitoba; and Rev. Dr. A. D. Matheson, Toronto.

(2) It was requested, also, that congratulations be extended to the following on whom the degree of Doctor of Divinity has recently been conferred: Rev. Isaac Davis, Rev. A. E. MacKenzie, Rev. W. G. Berry, Rev. J. G. Gorwill.

Report of Action of Executive of General Council

It was reported for information that the following action was taken by the Executive of General Council, at its meeting in May, on matters affecting Home Missions:

- (1) James Robertson Memorial Committee: The Executive adopted the following:
 - (a) That the Committee in the future be made up of: -
 - (i) Three College representatives.
 - (ii) Three Home Mission representatives (one of these to be the Secretary of the Board of Home Missions).
 - (iii) Three other members, ministerial or lay.
 - (b) That the centre of administration be Toronto and that five members of the Committee be members who are resident in the Central Conferences, the other four members to be chosen from the other Conferences to represent as fully as possible every part of the Church.
 - (c) That the incoming Committee consider the possibility of the publication from time to time of material from the lectures in whole or in part.
 - (d) That it become the responsibility of the Board of Home Missions to promote the Robertson-Morrin Essay Competition in our College centres, and that the Board be requested to report to the James Robertson Memorial Committee for direction and action.
 - (e) That the appointment of the Committee and naming its Chairman be referred to the Committee on Nominations.
- (2) Request of Board for addition to Secretariat: The Executive received the resolution for forwarding to the General Council, and the Secretary was instructed to send a notification to all Presbyteries asking for nominations for the position of Assistant Secretary of the Board of Home Missions
- (3) Cote Indian Reserve: Re proselytizing of Protestant Indians by Roman Catholic Priest: The Executive directed "that when the facts

concerning the actions of the priest in removing Protestant children to R.C. schools have been verified and are in order, a protest be made to the Department of Indian Affairs."

Superintendencies of Missions

Montreal and Ottawa

Dr. Macdonald stated that he was happy to report that the Rev. Gordon W. Porter had accepted the position of Superintendent of Missions for the Montreal and Ottawa Conference and the Eastern Presbyteries of the Bay of Quinte Conference and that his appointment had been approved by the members of the Executive.

The new Superintendent was welcomed into the fellowship of the Board by the Chairman and Secretary. Mr. Porter spoke briefly in reply.

The Secretary spoke of the difficulty experienced by the two recently appointed Superintendents of Home Missions, because acceptance of the appointment involved a serious reduction in income and created hardship in making the necessary financial adjustment. It was decided that the Secretary should make enquiry of the Treasurer regarding the possibility of securing, if necessary, a short-term loan for either or both of the Superintendents.

After discussion, Mr. Buttars, Dr. Mustard and Mr. Mattinson were appointed a committee to draft a communication to be forwarded to Dr. Harold Vaughan, Chairman of the Vacancy Committee, and a copy to be sent to the Secretary of the General Council.

At a later session, Mr. Buttars submitted a letter, which it was agreed should be sent to Dr. Vaughan.

Northern Saskatchewan

Dr. Macdonald stated that, as directed by the Executive on May 16th, he had written to Dr. Hall to enquire along what lines he felt there would necessarily be modification in his duties as Superintendent. Dr. Hall had replied to the effect that he felt he was able to undertake all normal duties, provided he avoided excessive strain as a result of overloaded daily agenda and preaching engagements.

Central and Northern Alberta

A letter to Dr. Hart had elicited the reply that, with reasonable care, he felt able to undertake all the work that was required of him.

Supervision, Yorkton Presbutery

It was decided that the new Presbytery of Yorkton, which by directtion of the Saskatchewan Conference was formed by a combination of the Yorkton-Abernethy and Kamsack Presbyteries, should be attached to the Northern Superintendency.

Winnipeg, Church Extension

The Secretary stated that he had received a letter from Rev. Fred Douglas, making alternative suggestions with regard to supervision of Church Extension work in the Winnipeg Presbytery.

It was decided to secure an Assistant to Mr. Douglas in the work of Central Winnipeg Institutional set-up, thus making available to him additional time to prosecute the work of Church Extension in Winnipeg Presbytery. Failing such an arrangement before October 1st, it was decided to re-affirm the position taken by the Executive at its meeting on May 17th—namely, to approve in principle the appointment of Mr. Douglas as Church Extension Director for the Winnipeg Presbytery, with the understanding that at the end of the next Conference year the matter be reviewed in the light of the work done and of what remains to be done from the standpoint of prosecuting the campaign for funds and promoting Church Extension work.

Institutional Missions and Non-Anglo-Saxon Work

All People's, Sault Ste. Marie

It was reported for information that at its meeting May 8th, the Algoma Presbytery had adopted the following: "That in reply to the

resolution of the Conference Home Mission Committee in reference to the status of All People's Church, Sault Ste. Marie, we believe that its present status as an Institutional Church should be maintained."

Church of All Nations, Montreal

Dr. Macdonald reported that Dr. R. G. Katsunoff, who is not in good health, is prepared to retire on the appointment of a successor—perhaps at the end of this calendar year, or, if not, at the end of the Conference year. In the meantime, the Montreal Presbytery is making a complete survey of the down-town work.

It was moved and carried, That the Secretaries be given authority to carry on negotiations or take any necessary action following report from the Montreal Presbytery.

Vancouver, Non-Anglo-Saxon Work

Re resolution of the Vancouver Presbytery, adopted on June 19th, urging "the Executive of the Board of Home Missions to explore all possibilities with a view to appointing Dr. H. Neufeld to Non-Anglo-Saxon Work under the Vancouver Council for Institutional Work beginning July 1, 1956": Agreed to approve the appointment of Dr. Neufeld, terms of employment to be referred to the Secretaries in co-operation with the Vancouver Presbytery.

Compassionate Grants

- 1. Dr. Macdonald stated that the heavy expenses in connection with the illness and hospitalization of Rev. E. Csendes had placed Mrs. Csendes in serious financial difficulty. It was agreed to authorize the Secretaries to pay Mrs. Csendes an allowance of \$50.00 a month until November 1st, when her husband will be eligible to receive the Old Age Pension.
- 2. It was agreed to authorize payment of \$100.00 as a compassionate grant to Miss Sadie Farquhar, sister of the late Mr. John Farquhar, lay supply, for whom she had acted as housekeeper for many years, and was now left without resources.

Division of Home Missions (U.S.A.)

It was agreed to recommend to the Board that grants for 1957 to the Division of Home Missions of The National Council of Churches in the U.S.A. be as follows: General—\$550; Town and Country—\$100; Urban Church—\$200.

Bay of Quinte Conference Resolution

It was reported that the Bay of Quinte Conference at its meeting in June had requested that the recommendation of the Board of Home

Missions to the General Council—"That where the cost of heating a manse or parsonage goes above a level that should be regarded as normal heating cost, the charge provide the difference"—be amended to read: "Where the cost of heating a manse or parsonage exceeds \$200.00, the excess cost be assumed by the pastoral charge." This was received for information.

Indian Work

Tape Recorder

It was agreed to confirm purchase of a Tape Recorder at cost of \$290.83, to be used for Indian Work and to be the property of the Board of Home Missions, at present in possession of Rev. J. L. McFadden, Cape Croker

Norway House, Banking Authority

On motion, the following resolution was adopted:

Be It Resolved: That Mr. John Dennys, Principal, is here authorized for and in the name of the Norway House Indian Residential School, Norway House, Manitoba, to sign cheques upon The Canadian Bank of Commerce, Portage and Donald Branch, Winnipeg, Manitoba, on behalf of the said School, and from time to time to borrow money from the said Bank, either by overdrawing the account or otherwise, the said borrowing at no time to exceed the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000) Dollars;

Also That the said John Dennys be and is hereby authorized on behalf of the said School to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the said School account only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said School, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or signer of such Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes and negotiable paper to discount the same or to deposit the same otherwise than for collection purposes with the said Bank;

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said School and the Bank and to receive all paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release;

. And That all other powers heretofore given in this matter be and are hereby revoked.

Salary Scale, Residential School Principals

The Secretary drew attention to the fact that in comparison with the Government's new salary scale for teachers in residential schools, the Board's salary scale for certain of the Principals was low. The Secretary was authorized to make an adjustment in the case of Mr. Fraser Shaw, Principal of the Morley Residential School, and Mr. John Dennys, Principal of the Norway House School, who were not eligible for the increase in salary given for length of service.

Oriental Work

Chinese, Calgary

Re request of the Board of the Chinese Church in Calgary that the Rev. Stephen Yee Tong be appointed assistant minister and given authority to visit Chinese in outlying areas: Agreed that this be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent after receipt of Presbytery and Conference recommendation.

Japanese

Re policy for serving Nisei congregations: Dr. Leng stated that at the recent Conference of Japanese pastors, discussion had taken place regarding the desirability of reviewing the present policy, laid down by the Board a number of years ago, whereby the Nisei were encouraged to find their church home in the ordinary white congregations of the United Church. It was felt that as far as possible Nisei work should be developed by our Japanese ministers. It was decided that a letter to this effect should be sent to all our Japanese pastors.

Date of Board Meeting

It was decided that the Board should meet April 2, 3 and 4, 1957, with pre-Board meetings beginning March 26th.

Hospital Work

George McDougall Hospital

- 1. Dr. Macdonald reported that the Hospital District was taking over the hospital at July 1st at the purchase price previously agreed upon—namely, \$40,000—\$32,000 for land and building and \$8,000 for hospital contents. This was received for information.
- 2. It was agreed to accept Judge Buchanan's suggestion that sale of patients' accounts to the new Hospital Board be negotiated at a discount of 20%, if possible, and, if not, at a discount of 33½%; the amount to apply on the Hospital's debt of \$4,900 to the Board.
- 3. It was directed the Secretary write to Chief Judge Buchanan, expressing appreciation of the great amount of time and work he has given to our Hospitals in Alberta, and especially in negotiating the sale of the George McDougall Hospital, and also in solving the situation at the Bella Coola Hospital.

Bella Coola General Hospital

- 1. It was decided that, after correspondence with Dr. W. D. Watt, the Secretaries be authorized to fix the remuneration to be paid him as Administrator of the Hospital.
- 2. Hospital Board: Appointment of the Hospital Board was confirmed as follows: Rev. R. G. Bracewell, Chairman; J. L. Homan (Indian Dep't); C. Allerston (Prov. Gov't); A. Levelton; N. Saugstad; O. Pedersen; Alex Pootlass (Native); Mrs. G. Christensen; Dr. W. Donald Watt (ex officio)
- 3. Hospital Constitution: The Secretaries were authorized to frame a Constitution along the lines of that set up for the Wrinch Memorial Hospital, Hazelton.
- 4. It was directed that in reply to the communication of Mr. Curtis Urseth, advising of the formation of a Hospital Committee with the idea of taking over operation of the Hospital, he be informed that the Board of Home Missions has no intention of relinquishing control of the Hospital.
- 5. It was agreed that an overdraft up to \$5,000 at the Bank be authorized and, on motion, the following resolution was adopted:

Be It Resolved: That the Rev. R. Grant Bracewell, Dr. W. Donald Watt and Miss Lottie Franklin, or any two of the afore-named, are hereby authorized for and in the name of the Bella Coola General Hospital to borrow money from The Canadian Bank of Commerce, Hastings and Granville Streets, Vancouver, either by overdrawing the account or otherwise, the said borrowing at no time to exceed the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars.

Queen Charlotte Islands Hospital

- 1. Acting Administrator: It was agreed that Dr. Mairi M. MacLean be appointed Acting Administrator, with the suggestion that, in addition to her salary of \$500 a month as Superintendent, she be paid \$75.00 a month for her duties as Administrator, the latter amount being part of remuneration paid for these services by the B.C.H.I.S., and that any additional amount paid by it be turned into the Medical Services Fund. The Secretaries were authorized to complete negotiations with Dr. MacLean in this regard.
- 2. Assistant Doctor: It was decided that Dr. Philip Narod be appointed Assistant Doctor, on a temporary basis, for one year, with salary at the rate of \$5,800 a year and living quarters.
- 3. Banking Authority: On motion, the following resolutions were adopted:

Murdoch, Doctor Mairi MacLean and Sergius DeBucy, or any two of them, are hereby so authorized;

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said Hospital and the Bank and to receive all paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release;

And That all other powers heretofore given in this matter be and are hereby revoked.

(b) Medical Services Account, The Royal Bank of Canada, Prince Rupert:

Be It Resolved: That, effective September 1st, 1956, John D. Murdoch, Doctor Mairi MacLean and Sergius DeBucy, or any two of them, are hereby authorized for and in the name of the Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital, Queen Charlotte City, British Columbia, to sign cheques upon The Royal Bank of Canada, Prince Rupert, on behalf of the said Hospital;

Also That, the said John D. Murdoch, Doctor Mairi MacLean, and Sergius DeBucy, or any two of the afore-named, are hereby authorized on behalf of the said Hospital to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the said Hospital account only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said Hospital, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or

4. It was agreed to authorize the advance of \$1,100 to the Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital to reimburse Dr. Ellingham for drugs owned by Drs. Watt and Ellingham, Dr. Ellingham having settled with Dr. Watt for his share; the amount to be refunded from the Medical Services Fund when there is a sufficient amount available in that Fund.

Pointe-Aux-Trembles French Institute

Dr. Macdonald explained the arrangement which had prevailed between the Pointe-aux-Trembles Board and the Montreal Protestant School Board, whereby Miss R. Boucher acted in the dual capacity of Principal and Director. Beginning with the next fall term, Miss Boucher will be on pension of \$2,682 from the School Board. She will no longer act as Principal but will continue as Director, being responsible for the overall supervision of the Institute and will be paid for her services in that capacity out of the grant from the Board of Home Missions.

Licences to Administer Sacraments

- 1. On recommendation of the Newfoundland Conference, it was agreed to recommend to the Executive or Sub-Executive of General Council that permission be given to all students and lay supply workers appointed to regular pastoral charges for the conference year 1956-57, to administer the Sacrament of Baptism.

Insurance

Dr. Elliott stated that consideration had been given to placing all insurance on real property of the Board of Home Missions with one Agent, or, alternately, insuring the properties on a provincial basis. The Insurance Agent had suggested placing all insurance through one Broker who would fix a scale covering church buildings, manses, hospitals, etc. The Broker would continue the insurance with the present local Agents, who would receive 50% of the commission, but the Board would deal only with the Broker.

The Secretaries were authorized to put into effect the suggested policy of placing all insurance through one Broker.

Property

Re Deposit Loans: It was agreed to authorize the paying off of all loans on deposit at the end of June, when the half-yearly interest is due.

BONEVISTA

Cape Freels (Newtown Charge) Church—Agreed to vote grant of \$2,000 towards cost of building new church.

Sympathy

The Executive heard with regret that the following persons had recently passed away: Mr. Fred Mann, a member of the Board of Home Missions from the time of Church Union until two years ago; Rev. F. G. Stotesbury; Rev. Y. Akagawa; Rev. Frank Milligan; Mrs. F. L. Brown, mother of the Rev. Jos. Brown. It was requested that the sympathy of the Executive be conveyed to the bereaved families.

The Secretary referred to the serious illness of the Rev. George P. Forsey of St. Catharines, and it was requested that sympathy and good wishes for a complete recovery be extended to Mr. Forsey.

Report of Action of General Council

It was reported that the General Council had taken the following action on matters affecting Home Missions:

Secretariat of Board-

The General Council authorized the appointment of an Assistant Secretary of the Board of Home Missions.

It was moved, seconded and carried, That the Rev. E. E. M. Joblin, B.A., B.D., be nominated to the Committee on Vacancies for the position of Assistant Secretary of the Board of Home Missions.

It was agreed, further, that the Secretaries in making the nomination state the duties which will probably be assigned to the Assistant Secretary.

Ministerial Salaries

The Council recommended that the minimum salary basis for married ministers be increased from \$3,000 to \$3,200, with a free, furnished house, and asked that the Board implement this increase over a two year period—\$100 in 1957 and \$100 in 1958, and increase the present scale of travel allowances as soon as possible. This was received for information.

Manse Perquisites

The Council directed that where the cost of heating a manse or parsonage goes above \$200 a year, the charge provide the difference; and also that the charge provide a telephone for the manse or parsonage. This was received for information, and it was agreed that so far as this Board is concerned, the provision take effect in 1957.

Commission on Indian Work

The Council continued the Commission for another two-year period, and adopted the recommendations of the Commission, including 'the

following: "That the Board of Home Missions be requested to give consideration to the appointment of one or two travelling missionaries, with experience in Indian work, who would be able to give to Indian workers the counselling and direction that are so urgently needed at the present time." This was received for information.

Commission to Study Church Hospitals

The Council continued the Commission for another two-year period, and adopted the recommendations of the Commission, including the following: "That an executive officer who has adequate knowledge of hospital work be appointed either on a full-time or part-time basis, to supervise and co-ordinate the hospital organization and work carried on by the Board of Home Missions and The Woman's Missionary Society." This was received for information.

Special Services

It was reported for information that certain functions formerly performed by the Inter-Board Committee on Special Services: (i) Preparation of mimeographed services and sermon outlines for use of laymen conducting occasional services; and (ii) organization of Church Veterans' Hospital Visiting Committees—were referred to this Board by the General Council.

British Caribbean Federation

A resolution urging a welcome for peoples of all nations who seek to enter Canada as immigrants, including students and others from the Caribbean Federation, was referred to this Board by the General Council. This was referred to Rev. J. R. Leng, who has responsibility for the Immigration Work under the Board.

Survey, Downtown Work

The General Council adopted a recommendation that the Council initiate a study, through the Presbyteries concerned and in co-operation with the Board of Home Missions, to survey and assess the downtown work in our major Canadian cities.

The Secretary stated that such a survey was already under way in Toronto and suggested that Dr. J. I. MacKay be asked to attend the meeting for the purpose of making a statement. This was approved and Dr. MacKay outlined briefly the steps which had been taken by the special committee set up early in the year to study the needs of downtown Toronto. He stated, also, that the Committee was dealing with the needs of the inner-city area.

McMillan is hereby authorized on behalf of the said Home Mission Office to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the said Home Mission Office account only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said Home Mission Office, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or signer of such Bills of Exchange, Promissory

Notes and negotiable paper to discount the same or to deposit the same otherwise than for collection purposes with the said Bank;

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said Home Mission Office and the Bank and to receive all paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release.

Authority was given to the Secretaries to continue the employment of Miss Cornforth on a month to month basis as required until after the annual meeting of the Board, when it is hoped that a new staff member will be secured.

Non-Anglo Saxon Work

Hungarian Refugees

1. The Secretaries were authorized to employ part-time or full-time workers at reception centres until January 31st, to assist the Hungarian refugees. Under this authority, the Secretaries have agreed to the employment of Mrs. Eva Kun, a member of the Hungarian congregation at the Church of All Nations, Toronto, on a full-time basis as from December 4th, salary suggested being \$225 a month. Mrs. Kun acts as interpreter, greeting and welcoming the refugees, answering their enquiries and helping them generally to secure clothing, place their children in school, and in other matters of this kind.

The Secretaries have further agreed (a) that actual expenses, and perhaps a small honorarium be paid to Mr. Atilla Kun, who uses his truck to collect articles of furniture and clothing and help the people move into a house; and (b) that the man in charge of the supply room, which is being opened at the Church of All Nations on December 13th, be paid \$75.00 for December and \$150 for January.

2. The Secretaries were authorized to make available for Hungarian refugees until the end of June, 1957, if feasible, the residence at Pointe-aux-Trembles French Institute.

Andrew, Alberta

The appointment of Rev. W. Winiawsky, effective December 15th, was approved.

Indian Work

Survey, Red Lake

Authority was given to have Mr. Jim Shynkar visit Red Lake during the Christmas holidays to survey the Indian population, and to pay his travelling expenses and an allowance for board.

The Secretaries were directed to clear with The Woman's Missionary Society regarding the basis on which their Worker serves the Indian people living in Winnipeg and to get assurance that the Superintendent of Missions and the Home Mission Convener are members of any committee having oversight of this Worker.

Winnipeg, Metropolitan Council

It was agreed that the Secretaries be given authority, after consultation with the Solicitor of the Church, to make recommendations re the Constitution of the Winnipeg Metropolitan Council for Church Extension.

Letters of Sympathy

The Secretary was requested to convey sympathy on behalf of the Board of Home Missions to Mrs. F. W. Whitworth, formerly Superintendent of Settlement House, Regina, on the death of her husband, and to the family of the late Mr. H. G. Dawson, who was Chairman of the Winnipeg Presbytery Church Extension Committee.

Survey, Downtown Work-

In order to implement the recommendation of the General Council that a study and survey be made of the downtown work in the major Canadian cities, the following recommendations were adopted:

- 2. That such an analysis and study have special reference to Home Mission and/or Institutional Work and such other constituencies in the areas listed as may require re-adjustment, re-alignment of work or change of policy
- 3. That the findings and recommendations shall be reported to the Presbyteries concerned, which in turn will forward them, with any suggested revisions or Presbytery recommendations, to the Board of Home Missions
- 4. That in each area, the Committee making the analysis and study be constituted as follows:

Presbytery Home Mission Committee Two additional Presbytery nominees Two W.M.S. Presbyterial nominees Conference representative or representatives on the Board of Home Missions.

Rural Work

The appointment of six representatives to a Joint Committee on Rural Evangelism was referred to the Secretaries.

Authority to Sign Requisitions

It was agreed that Miss Dena Ippolito be authorized to sign requisitions for cheques on the Treasurer, replacing Miss Helen Cornforth who has retired.

Honorarium, Rev. W. Dormer

An honorarium of \$150 was voted to Rev. Wellington Dormer in recognition of his supervision of Home Mission work in the Peace River Presbytery and the Territories in 1956.

Case of Mr. Bernard King

It was agreed to refer the case of Mr. Bernard King to the February meeting of the Executive, pending further information.

Division of Home Missions

It was decided to take no action on enquiry if this Board would consider increasing its grant for 1956 to help meet deficit in the work of the Division of Home Missions (U.S.A.)

Non-Anglo-Saxon Work

It was agreed to authorize religious radio broadcasting in the Hungarian language in Southern Ontario centres.

Car Subsidies

It was decided that a change be made in the present policy so that in the case of Ordinands receiving advances prior to March 30th, the first payment on the subsidy shall become due on or before September 30th; also, that the advance shall be \$400, the balance to be made available after the Transfer Committee has assigned the Ordinand to a Conference.

Director of Fund Raising, Salary

It was decided: (a) That in view of the increase in the salary scale of General Council Officers as set by the General Council, the salary of Mr. Neil A. Campbell be the same as that of a Superintendent of Missions; and (b) that authority be given for payment of an amount in lieu of income tax deduction for house rent allowed ordained officers of the Church.

Montreal, Church of All Nations

Montreal, City Mission

It was reported that consideration was being given to the taking over and amalgamation of the City Mission (non-denominational) with the work of the Church of All Nations. Agreed to refer to the Board for action, following report and recommendation from the Montreal Presbytery.

Toronto, Church of All Nations

Agreed, subject to approval of Presbytery, to accede to the request of Rev. G. A. Koponen for one month's extension of holiday in order that he may visit Finland next summer.

Superintendencies of Missions

Southern Ontario

The Secretary stated that, for reasons of health, Rev. S. B. Stokes, D.D., had tendered his resignation, effective June 30th. It was agreed that the appointment of a successor be referred to the Board, and that in the meantime Dr. Macdonald follow the usual procedure of consulting with representatives of appropriate Committees of the three Conferences concerned and report any nominations that may be made.

Central and Northern Alberta

The Secretary reported for information that Rev. Thos. Hart, D.Th., would reach the age of retirement at June 30th, 1957, and that he

had arranged to meet with representatives of the Alberta Conference Executive and of the Conference Home Mission Committee in Calgary, when nominations may be made for submission to the Board, which will appoint a new Superintendent

Re-alignment of Work, Alberta and British Columbia

It was agreed to refer to the Secretaries for study the question of the possibility of any re-alignment of work in the Alberta and British Columbia Superintendencies.

Hungarian Relief

Dr. Leng reported briefly on what was being done by the Protestant Churches, and the United Church in particular, for Hungarian refugees. A total of \$50,000 had been sent from the United Church to Austria through the Canadian Council and the World Council of Churches. In Canada, efforts were being made to work in co-operation with other Protestant Churches, without too much success. Mimeographed material had been sent to Secretaries of Presbyteries for distribution to the local churches. Under authority given by the Sub-Executive, additional workers had been employed to help the Hungarian ministers in Montreal and Toronto.

It was agreed to authorize the employment of Mr. Edmond Seres to assist Rev. M. Feher with Hungarian refugee work in Montreal, for six months' period.

It was further agreed that a statement of expenses for special services among Hungarian refugees be submitted to the special Committee on the Hungarian Relief Fund, which reported a balance of approximately \$7,000 (over and above contribution of \$50,000 sent to the World Council of Churches) available for Hungarian Relief Work in Canada

Indian Work

Pensions, Lay Principals

It was decided to authorize the payment by the Board of the employer's equivalent on pension assessment for lay Principals of Indian Residential Schools, involving at the present time three Principals.

Revision, Indian Act

It was agreed that representations made to the Board regarding the eviction of Indians from the Hobbema Reserve in Alberta and the need for revision of the Indian Act should be referred to the meeting of the Board, and that in the meantime the Presbyteries and other church bodies in Alberta desiring to make representations should be asked to

co-ordinate their recommendations, including a summary of events leading up to the present situation, so that, if possible, this may be submitted to the Conference Home Mission Committee for transmission to this Board.

Pointe-Aux-Trembles French Institute

The following appointments to the Board of Management of the Pointe-aux-Trembles French Institute were confirmed: Mr. H. A. Lariviere and Mr. Robert Rivard, on nomination of Montreal Presbytery, and Rev. Carson W. Duquette, on nomination of the Ottawa Presbytery.

Licence to Administer Sacraments

It was agreed to recommend to the Sub-Executive of General Council that a licence to administer the Sacraments be issued to Mr. Robert Peebles, lay supply serving the Denbigh-Matawatchan charge, as requested by the Renfrew Presbytery

Case of Mr. Bernard King

The Secretaries were authorized to continue payment of the salary grant for the Edwin-Long Plains charge to Mr. Bernard King to the end of December, less amount of \$100 previously paid him on compassionate grounds.

Hospital Work

Bella Coola General Hospital

- 1. The appointment of Dr. Hugh A. Rose as Medical Superintendent, effective July 1st, was confirmed; salary to be at the rate of \$6,000, plus \$1,400 for administration, and \$500 a year to be retained out of the Medical Services Fund for post graduate study.
- 2. The Secretaries were authorized to carry on negotiations looking towards the appointment of a second doctor, if thought advisable, and the provision of a residence.

Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital

- 1. Agreed to confirm the appointment of Dr. George E. Singer as Medical Superintendent, with salary at the rate of \$5,600, plus \$2,400 for administration, and \$500 a year to be retained out of the Medical Services Fund for post graduate study; appointment effective July 1st.
- 2. Agreed to confirm the appointment of Dr. J. H. Bowyer as Assistant Doctor, effective July 1st; with salary of \$6,000 plus \$500 a

year, to be retained out of the Medical Services Fund for post graduate study.

3. Agreed that a loan up to \$600 be made to Dr. J. H. Bowyer towards cost of car or station wagon, if he so desires.

Burns Lake Hospital-W.M.S.

Mrs. C. M. Loveys, whose presence had been requested for presentation of this item, made a statement regarding the need for a new hospital and plans for financing the project. It was agreed that the Secretaries, on behalf of The Woman's Missionary Society, should approach the Indian Health Services and the Headquarters of the Mennonite Church with a request for financial assistance towards the cost of the building.

Special Grants for 1956

- 1. Dr. Macdonald stated that there was available for special grants a sum of approximately \$166,300
- 2. It was agreed to confirm the action of the Sub-Executive authorizing the Secretaries to deal with special grants on salary and/or travel for 1956, with the understanding that exceptional cases be reported to the Board for action.
- 3. It was directed: (a) that special grants be voted for salary and/or travel in accordance with the resolution adopted by the Board at its annual meeting, April 1956, and recorded on page 119 of the Digest of Minutes; and
- (b) That any requests for special grants on salary and/or travel to be paid out of the 1956 appropriation must be in the hands of the Secretaries not later than June 30th.
 - 4. Special grants as paid for 1956 are appended.

Car Subsidy

It was agreed to write off balance of \$187.50 owing by Rev. John R. McDonald on car loan of \$250 made in 1944, Mr. McDonald having resigned from the Ministry and gone to the United States.

DIGEST OF MINUTES THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

April 2-4, 1957

The Board of Home Missions met in the Board Room, Wesley Buildings, Toronto, on Tuesday, April 2nd, 1957, at 9.45 a.m. The Chairman, Rev. W. M. Mustard, D.D., presided and conducted devotions.

On motion, Rev. Harold M. Bailey was appointed Minute Secretary.

Roll Call

The following members were present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, R. W. K. Elliott, F. L. H. Stymiest, D. M. J. Buttars, L. A. D. Curtis, J. Milton Fraser, J. Maxwell Allan, George Telford, W. A. Burbidge, Harold M. Bailey, S. W. Anderson, R. Douglas Smith, Gordon McLaren, Chief Judge N. V. Buchanan, Messrs. Sidney T. Green, Arthur H. Webster, John Wedlake, Kenneth G. Partridge, Ralph S. Mills, Mesdames C. M. Loveys, C. S. Patterson and J. L. Halpenny. Corresponding Members: Revs. H. Maxwell Dawe, W. S. Godfrey, Gordon W. The Chairman welcomed the new members of the Board.

Hours of Meeting and Adjournment

It was decided that, unless otherwise agreed upon, the hours of session be: Tuesday—adjourn at 12 noon; reconvene at 2.00 p.m.; adjourn at 5.30 p.m. Wednesday—meet at 9.00 a.m.; adjourn at 11.45; reconvene at 1.30 p.m.; adjourn at 4.30 p.m. Thursday—meet at 9.00 a.m.; adjourn at 12 noon; reconvene at 1.30 p.m.

Appointment, Executive and Sub-Executive

1. On motion, the Executive of the Board was established as follows:

Rev. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, R. W. K. Elliott, F. L. H. Stymiest, D. M. J. Buttars, George Telford and Harold M. Bailey, Messrs. Arthur Webster, John Wedlake, K. G. Partridge and Ralph S. Mills.

2. On motion, the Sub-Executive was stablished as follows: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, R. W. K. Elliott; Messrs. John Wedlake, K. G. Partridge and Ralph S. Mills

Ratification of Minutes

It was agreed: (a) that the Minutes of meetings of the Executive held May 16th, May 23rd, June 27th, 1956, and of the Interim Executive, held November 7th, 1956, and February 6th, 1957, be ratified; and (b) that the action taken by the Interim-Sub Executive at its meetings on December 6th, 1956, and January 8th, 1957, be confirmed and the minutes ratified as circulated.

Communications

Communications in acknowledgment of expressions of sympathy sent on behalf of the Executive on the occasion of bereavement were received from the following: Mrs. J. W. Woodside, on the death of her husband, the Very Rev. Dr. John W. Woodside, Mr. Gordon Forbes, on the death of his mother, Dr. Jean Gordon Forbes; Miss Edith Cochrane, on the death of her mother; Dr. George McMillan, on the death of his brother; and Rev. K. G. MacMillan, on the death of his mother.

Reference of Items to Standing Committees

The Board approved the action of the Secretaries in having certain items on the agenda referred to standing committees, which have already met and which will bring in recommendations to the Board.

Resolutions Committee

A resolutions committee, consisting of Revs. J. Milton Fraser, D. M. J. Buttars and Gordon McLaren was appointed by the Chairman. The following were asked to prepare special resolutions, to be included in the Report of the Committee: Revs. J. C. Torrance and J. A. Lyttle with regard to the retirement of Dr. S. B. Stokes; Dr. J. C. Pincock and Dr. G. A. McMillan with regard to the retirement of Dr. Thos. Hart; and Dr. J. I. MacKay with regard to the retirement of Miss Helen Cornforth.

Expenses of Members

It was decided that the scale of expenses of members of the Board should be the same as last year, namely:

- (1) That members be paid the cost of railway and sleeper tickets to Toronto and return; the cost of meals en route—such cost not to exceed \$6.00 per day; and the cost of hotel and meals in Toronto.
- (2) That those travelling by motor be paid on the basis of railway fare
- (3) That the amount for Sunday supply shall not exceed \$20.00 per Sunday.

Superintendencies of Missions

On motion, it was agreed that a nominating committee be appointed to bring in recommendations for the appointment of a Superintendent to succeed Dr. Thos. Hart, who is retiring from the superintendency of Central and Northern Alberta, and of a successor to Dr. S. B. Stokes, who is retiring from the Southern Ontario superintendency, effective June 30th in each case

The following committee was named: the Chairman, the Secretaries, Rev. W. A. Burbidge, Mr. K. G. Partridge, Mr. Ralph Mills, Judge N. V. Buchanan, Rev. R. Douglas Smith, Mr. John Wedlake.

At a later session, the Chairman presented the following report of the committee:

1. Southern Ontario: It is recommended that the Rev. H. M. Bailey, B.A., B.D., be appointed Superintendent of Missions for Southern Ontario, effective July 1st, 1957. On motion, it was agreed that the recommendation of the committee become the action of the Board.

Mr. Bailey signified his acceptance of the appointment and expressed appreciation of the confidence placed in him by the Board.

2. Central and Northern Alberta: It is the recommendation of the committee that the Rev. C. Dwight Powell, B.A., B.D., be appointed Superintendent of Missions for Central and Northern Alberta, effective July 1st. On motion, the recommendation was adopted, and the Secretary was directed to communicate at once with Mr. Powell as to his acceptance of the appointment.

Later, the Secretary reported that Mr. Powell accepted the appointment and had asked that the Board be informed that he pledged his best to the task.

Re-arrangement, B.C. and Alberta Superintendencies

It was agreed that the Executive be instructed to study the possibility of a re-arrangement of work in the Alberta and British Columbia Superintendencies and to bring in a recommendation to the next meeting of the Board.

It was further agreed that, in the meantime, the Superintendent of Missions for Central and Northern Alberta, after July 1st, give supervision to Whitehorse in the Vancouver Presbytery.

.Address by Moderator

The Moderator, the Right Rev. Dr. J. S. Thomson was welcomed by the Chairman. Dr. Thomson addressed the Board, speaking of the special place the Board of Home Missions has in the life of our Church and of the place which the United Church has in the life of the nation. The Chairman expressed the appreciation of the Board to the Moderator.

Statements by Superintendents of Missions

Statements were made by the Superintendents on the work in their respective areas,

Chief Judge Buchanan asked that consideration be given to the alloting of a larger place on the agenda to the Superintendents of Missions, suggesting that perhaps the holding of an evening meeting for the reception of their reports might be justified.

Report of Secretary

The Secretary made a report to the Board, covering the various phases of Home Mission work and calling attention to several problems in urgent need of solution, one of which was the shortage of ordained ministers.

In the ensuing discussion concerning the shortage and distribution of ordained ministers, it was moved and agreed, that the sections of the Secretary's report dealing with the shortage of ordained ministers and short pastorates be publicized through "The United Church Observer," Presbytery and Conference Home Mission Committees, and Settlement Committees, and that a committee of five be set up to prepare further recommendations to be presented to the Executive of the Board for action.

It was agreed that the Chair should appoint the Committee of Five. The following were named: Dr. J. I. MacKay, Dr. M. C. Macdonald, Rev. J. M. Fraser, Rev. A. D. Stade and Mr. Ralph Mills.

The Report of the Committee, presented later, was adopted as follows:

We would again lay upon the conscience of the whole Church the very serious shortage of ordained ministers and also of workers in the various phases of Home Mission activity, such as: Women Workers, Nurses, Teachers, staff personnel for Indian Residential Schools, other lay workers, in church institutions.

In spite of the fact that we have more candidates in our colleges than ever before, our situation is probably more critical now than at any previous time. In order that we may have some hope of meeting this situation, we urge:

- 1. That every Presbytery re-examine the work within its area, with a view to re-alignment wherever possible of charges in close proximity to each other and thereby releasing men for service in much more needy areas
- 2. That every minister seek out the most promising of his young people and inform them of the need and the opportunities for satisfying service in the full-time work of the Church.

Further, we would express our serious concern about the fact that so many of our ministers, and in particular the ordinands, serve for such short periods as to limit the total effectiveness of their ministry. We would urge them to think in terms of a pastorate of four or five years rather than the necessary two years in the case of ordinands.

We would also call this matter to the attention of Presbyteries, Settlement Committees and College Principles, urging those concerned to do what they can towards the end referred to above.

It was further agreed that a digest of the Secretary's Report be sent to all active ministers through the medium of the Home Mission Bulletin and that portions be published as opportunity occurs in the columns of The United Church Observer and The United Churchman; and that a full copy of the Report be sent to all Home Mission Conference and Presbytery Conveners.

Division of Home Missions

On motion, a grant of \$850.00 was voted to the Division of Home Missions, National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A., divided as follows: General Budget—\$550.00; Town and Country—\$100.00; Urban Church—\$200.00

Bissell Bursary Fund

The Secretary repoted that the anticipated amount in the Bissell Bursary Fund for 1956-57 was \$995. To this was added a gift of \$500 from the Estate of the late Rev. S. L. Toll, this amount being available only for the one year

The Trustees in September considered 24 applications and voted ten Bursaries of \$75.00 each and two of \$50.00 each from the Bissell Fund and four of \$75.00 each and three of \$60.00 each from the Toll Fund. As in the past applications from Newfoundland were taken care of from the Pitts Sustentation Fund. Following the meeting, two additional bursaries of \$75.00 each were awarded to late applicants.

The report was received for information.

The Secretary requested that the Superintendents keep the Bissell Fund in mind as they travel around their areas, seeking out the children of ministers, planning to attend university, who might be eligible for bursaries.

Use of Amount in Sundry Funds

It was agreed to authorize the use of the sum of \$18,342.67 in Sundry Funds under the Board and designated as the Missionary Emergency Salary account, for the following purposes: \$5,000 to be set aside to continue assistance (formerly provided from the Church of Scotland Fund, now exhausted) towards ocean travel of ministers and lay workers in the Old Country coming to Canada to serve the United Church on aid-receiving charges; the balance of \$13,342.67 to be designated for Church Extension in frontier areas.

Department of Fund Raising

Mr. Neil A. Campbell, Director of Fund Raising, presented his annual report, which was distributed in mimeographed form. The Department had shown considerable growth in the year and a half since its initiation. Fourteen canvasses had been conducted in 1956, resulting in the raising of \$178,000 for new building and expansion projects.

The Board expressed appreciation of the work which Mr. Campbell was doing

Report of Hospital Committee

Dr. G. A. McMillan presented the Report of the Hospital Committee. It was considered item by item and adopted as follows:

General Statement

The Secretary stated that the past year had been an encouraging one so far as the Home Mission Hospital work was concerned. It had been possible to secure five new doctors, but great difficulty was being experienced in obtaining sufficient nurses to staff the hospitals.

Cruise Memorial Hospital, Vita

Dr. J. C. Pincock reported that because of inability to secure adequate nursing staff, it had been necessary to close the hospital temporarily. He emphasized the importance of re-establishing the work as soon as possible.

R. W. Large Memorial, Bella Bella

Agreed: (1) that the appointment of Dr. Ian Chisholm as Assistant Doctor be confirmed; and (2) that a letter of appreciation be sent to Dr. David Preston, who is resigning as Assistant doctor, embodying the hope that he might find it possible to return to church hospital work.

· Bella Coola General Hospital

It was agreed: (1) that the Board record its satisfaction at the decision of Dr. W. Donald Watt to continue in the medical work of the United Church and as Superintendent of the Bella Coola Hospital; (2) that the action of the Executive in February in appointing Dr.

Hugh A. Rose as Medical Superintendent be revised, and that his appointment as Assistant Doctor be confirmed, with salary at the rate of \$6,000, plus \$200 for assistance in administration and \$500 for post graduate studies; and (3) that, at his own request, the granting of leave of absence to Dr. Watt for post graduate study be postponed for one year.

Wrinch Memorial Hospital, Hazelton

Agreed to confirm the appointment of Dr. Eldon Lee as third doctor, with salary at the rate of \$6,000, plus \$500 for administration work in Dr. Whiting's absence for post graduate study, and \$500 for post graduate study.

Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital

It was agreed: (1) that a travel allowance up to \$500 be authorized for the doctor, to be paid from Medical Services Fund; (2) that on his assumption of office of Superintendent, the name of Dr. G. E. Singer be substituted for that of Dr. Mairi MacLean in the authorization for conducting business with the Bank; (3) that a resolution of appreciation be sent to Mr. and Mrs. John Murdoch of Skidegate Mission for the very fine services rendered to the Hospital and the community during the past year; and (4) that the appointment of Dr. J. H. Bowyer as Assistant Doctor be confirmed. (Salary basis of both doctors recorded in Minutes of February 6th Executive).

Berens River, Man.

Agreed to adopt the following resolution: That, because the area is served by a Roman Catholic Hospital and strong disapproval has been registered by the Norway House Presbytery of the reported proselytizing practices of the Roman Catholic Church and the inadequacy of the staff and services, the Department of Health and Welfare, Indian and Northern Health Services, be requested to establish a Nursing Station at Berens River

- Dr. Macdonald made a statement concerning Church Extension developments and need and drew attention to the statistics provided on mimeographed sheets circulated to members of the Board.

Treasurer's Statement

Dr. V. T. Mooney addressed the Board and presented mimeographed copies of the financial statement of the Board of Home Missions.

The Treasurer drew attention to the value to the Church of encouraging people to include bequests to the Church when making their wills, and also to the General Council's action in asking Presbyteries to consider seriously the stewardship of accumulated possessions.

On motion of the Secretary, the Board expressed appreciation to Dr. Mooney and the members of his Department for the fine co-operation received during the year.

Report of Committee on Appointment of Students

The Report of the Committee was presented by Dr. Elliott and adopted as follows:

- 1. During the summer of 1956, 243 students served the Board under its co-operative plan (ordinarily called the "Students' Pool") and of these 10 served in Institutions, 8 in Church Extension, and 1 in Immigration work.
- The Committee, to date, has appointed to fields this year 240 students.

- 3. To date 280 students have made application for fields. Of these 93 are in Theology, 154 in Arts and 33 miscellaneous. There were 30 non-candidates. 21 young women applied for fields and 14 were appointed. Of the 280 applications, 250 were candidates for the ministry. There were 21 withdrawals and we were unable to appoint 13.
- 4. The Plan for the Co-ordination of Salaries of students was carried out in 1956. The policy of setting allocations to fields is meeting with continued response and proving a more effective means of financing our student work. To illustrate the effectiveness of this policy the following table shows what has happened in field contributions:

The increased response enabled us to advance payments to our student missionaries to \$35.00 a week plus board and travel on the field. The more experienced students serving their 3rd, 4th and 5th terms were paid at the rate of \$36.00, \$37.00, and \$38.00 per week respectively, plus board and travel on the field. The married students received an additional \$1.00 per week for board. An additional \$5.00 per Sunday was paid to those students who served over 18 Sundays.

It is recommended:

- 1. That the Plan for Coordination of Salaries of students be continued for 1957 with an interim payment of \$33.00 per week.
- 2. That the Appropriation for 1957 be set at \$112,000 for 240 students.
- 3. That it be understood that where the necessary Sunday travel does not exceed 25 miles, the travel grant shall not be more than \$70.00 for a 18 Sunday summer; that the bicycle rate of \$20.00 shall obtain and that the student be advised not to take a car in the expectation that the extra allowance shall be made; and that the only exception to the above shall be on fields where for valid reasons the Board of Home Missions has listed such field or fields as "car" fields.
- 4. That final payment shall not be made to students until all financial statements, records and forms have been received by the Superintendent of Missions and office of the Board notified.

- 5. That the study of a plan for permanent records on student fields be referred to the Secretaries for action in 1958.
- 6. That assistance be available for student cabins on a dollar for dollar basis up to \$500 for building and furnishings.
- 7. That an expression of appreciation be tendered to The Woman's Missionary Society for assistance in Student Work through Student Kits and financial aid.

Report of Committee on Rural Work and Immigration

Rev. D. M. J. Buttars spoke to that part of the Report which dealt with Rural Work and presented the following recommendations, which were adopted:

Scholarships

Rural Life Sunday

Rural Depopulation

That the problem of rural depopulation be referred to a committee to study and give direction to those engaged in surveys, this committee to be named by the Sub-Executive of the Board.

Rural Evangelism

That a committee on Rural Evangelism be appointed to meet with a committee of the Board of Evangelism and Social Service, this committee to be appointed by the Sub-Executive of the Board.

Rev. D. M. J. Buttars suggested that in planning future meetings of the Board, consideration might be given to inviting rural ministers in the Toronto area to attend the session of the Board at which the Superintendents of Missions present their reports.

Immigration

Dr. Leng presented a mimeographed report on Immigration Work, including a statement on the Hungarian Refugee movement and reports of the various Port Chaplains and other Workers. The work had increased during 1956 mainly due to the increased number of immigrants admitted. A total of 164,857 entered Canada in the Calendar year of 1956 as compared with 109,946 in 1955.

On recommendation of the Committee on Immigration, the following action was taken:

Appointments

- (1) Agreed to re-affirm former approval of the appointment of a Chaplain at the Port of Halifax, at least on a half-time basis; this appointment to be referred to the Secretaries.
- (2) Agreed that the Secretaries be authorized to appoint replacements for the Chaplains at Glasgow and Bremerhaven and to appoint a Chaplain at Le Havre.

Halifax

Agreed to confirm appointment of the Halifax Immigration Committee as follows: Home Mission Convener, President of the Presbytery W.A., President of the Presbyterial W.M.S., Rev. N. M. Slaughter, Rev. J. R. Williams, Dr. Ian Mackinnon, Miss Eileen Ratz.

The following recommendations of the Committee were adopted:

(1) That a letter of appreciation be forwarded to Rev. H. R. Cornish, formerly Port Chaplain, Southampton, England, for the excellent work he has done among British emigrants on behalf of The United Church of Canada.

- (2) That in view of the very large number of "old refugees" still remaining in Europe, among whom are many ill, blind or those maimed during World War II, the Department of Citizenship and Immigration be strongly urged—
 - (a) to include a larger number of those classified as "older refugees" than in past quotas, and
 - (b) to provide for the admission, as Canada's share of a liberal number of the ill, blind or maimed refugees.
- (3) That the Department of Citizenship and Immigration be commended for its plan to increase the numbers admitted to Canada in 1957 from the British Isles, and be requested to continue this policy in the future.
- (4) That the Department be commended, further, for its action in admitting Hungarian refugees, following the Hungarian Revolution in the fall of 1956, and be urged to develop and implement its programme for their settlement, giving special attention to the operation of reception centres.
- (5) That The Canadian Council of Churches be requested to provide the means whereby a liaison be established between the Department of Citizenship and Immigration and its constituent members in order:
 (a) to obtain information from the Department concerning general immigration, with the exception of British immigration, which is predominantly Protestant and concerning which information should be made available directly to the larger Protestant Churches; and (b) to be the agency whereby the constituent members of the Council shall make joint representations where necessary to the Department on matters regarding general immigration; with the understanding that this is not to be construed as relinquishing the Board's right to make direct representations to the Department on matters affecting The United Church of Canada.
- (6) That the Executive of the General Council urge the Department of Citizenship and Immigration to provide the totals according to the denominational affiliation of immigrants admitted to Canada, and that this information be channelled through The Canadian Council of Churches to its constituent members.
- (7) That, in view of the large number of Hungarians already in Canada, many of whom spend too many long days in reception centres, and of the fact that others are landing almost daily, for all of whom the local congregation can be a powerful agency of mercy in extending the hand of helpfulness and friendliness through sponsorship of those who have suffered so much, United Church congregations be alerted to the urgent need for sponsors to provide accommodation and employment for Hungrian refugees.

Dr. J. I. MacKay presented the Report of this Committee. Its recommendations were considered seriatim and adopted as follows:

2. Agreed that the Board request the Transfer Committee to allot three ordinands for Indian work and that the Secretary of the Board nominate them to the Settlement Committees concerned.

Residential Schools

- 1. Dr. Macdonald stated that proposals had been made by the Dominion Government for revision of the method of financing and operating residential schools, regarding which negotiations between the Government and the Churches were still in progress. It was agreed that this matter be referred to the Executive when final agreement has been reached and that the information be made available to the Commission on Indian Work.
- 2. Brandon: Dr. G. A. McMillan reported on the illness and pending resignation of the Principal, Rev. G. R. Inglis, and the temporary provision that had been made for the supervision of the School by Mr. Lachlan McLean, Principal of the Portage la Prairie Residential School, and the Rev. Harry Atkinson.

It was requested that a letter of sympathy and greeting be sent to the Rev. G. R. Inglis.

It was agreed that in order to care for the financing of the School until the appointment of a new Principal, the following resolution be adopted:

Be It Resolved: That the Rev. Harry Atkinson and Mr. Lachlan McLean, or either of them, be and are hereby authorized for and in the name of the Brandon Indian Residential School, Brandon, Manitoba, to sign cheques upon the Imperial Bank of Canada, Brandon, Manitoba, on behalf of the said School, up to a total amount of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars;

Also That the said Harry Atkinson and Lachlan McLean be and are hereby authorized on behalf of the said School to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the said School account only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said School, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or signer of such Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes and negotiable paper to discount the same or to deposit the same otherwise than for collection purposes with the said Bank;

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said School and the Bank and to receive all paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release.

3. Edmonton: Re the following resolutions adopted by the Edmonton Presbytery at its meeting January 30, 1957:

- (a) That the Board of Home Missions "arrange for an annual fixed grant of \$42,500 for this School, and for an annual per capita grant of at least \$182 per resident pupil, such grant to be made up by The United Church of Canada to the extent that it cannot be obtained from the Department of Indian Affairs."
- (b) That the Board "assume the payment of the salary of the Chaplain and Christian Education Director at this School on the same basis that it assumes responsibility for the payment of other missionaries, and not as a charge against the per capita grant."
- (c) That the Board of Home Missions bring crowded classroom conditions and lack of facilities for extra-curricular activities "to the attention of the Department of Indian Affairs and petition for the provision, at the earliest possible date, of a new classroom block consisting of five classrooms, home economics lab., shop and auditorium."
- (d) "That the Department of Indian Affairs be asked to put the Main Building at the Edmonton School into such a state of repair that it will adequately serve the children and staff as home and recreation centre."

It was agreed that no specific action be taken at present but that the Secretary be instructed to forward to the Department those portions of the resolutions that are directed to the Department and are the responsibility of the Government in the operation of the School; and that those portions of the resolutions which are directed to the Board of Home Missions be referred to the Executive or Sub-Executive, to be dealt with following the decisions received from the Department of Indian Affairs.

The Secretary reported that in May there is to be a meeting held under the direction of the Deputy Minister to consider a new plan of operation, employment of staff and financing of Indian residential schools, at which time the Secretary will draw special attention to the resolutions of Edmonton Presbytery and, indeed, will present the requirements of all residential schools under the administration of the Board of Home Missions.

- 4. Alberni: It was agreed to approve the appointment of a High School Boys' Counsellor and Director of Christian Education as soon as a suitable person can be found.
- 5. Lines of Credit: Agreed that lines of credit with the respective Banks be continued as follows: Alberni \$4,000; Edmonton \$4,000; Brandon \$4,000; Norway House \$5,000.

Resolutions of Norway House Presbytery

1. Re relationship of Norway House Residential School to nearby Reserves: Agreed that the Board request the Indian Affairs Branch to set aside money for the purpose of drawing nearby Reserves into a closer liaison with the Norway House Residential School.

- 2. Re visitation of Missions by Superintendent: It was agreed:
 (a) that a visit once a year by the Superintendent be authorized and that decision re further visits be left to the Excutive or Sub-Executive; and (b) visitation of the following Indian Missions in the Presbytery be authorized: South Indian Lake by the missionary at Nelson House; Red Sucker Lake by the missionary at Gods' Lake; Poplar River and Little Grand Rapids by the missionary at Berens River; and Pekangecum, Deer Lake and Sandy Lake by the ministers at Red Lake and Chukuni.
- 3. Re Bible School: Agreed to approve the request "that there be established in Norway House Presbytery a Bible School which will prepare Indian Christians to spread the Word of Christ among their own people; that the first such Bible School be held in the summer of 1957; and that a grant of \$200 be made to help finance the School."
- 4. Re Survey, Churchill Line: That Rev. Chas. Catto be authorized to make a survey of the Churchill Line, having regard to our work among the Indians, at an estimated cost of \$200.00.
- 5. Re Services, Miss Annie Niddrie: Agreed that the Board devise a suitable certificate indicating the appreciation of the United Church of Miss Annie Niddrie's long years of devoted service to the Church and the Indian people at Berens River.
- 6. Compassionate Grant, Mr. Bernard King: That the request for a compassionate grant of \$100 a month to Mr. Bernard King, former missionary at Cross Lake, for the period January to June, 1957, be referred to the Executive.

Recommendation of Lambton Presbytery

Re recommendation that St. Clair congregation and Walpole Island congregation be reconstituted as a charge: Agreed that the St. Clair congregation be served from Burns-Moore Line for the present.

Amendment, Indian Act

Agreed that there be referred to the Indian Commission for study the question of the desirability of making any recommendation re Amendment to The Indian Act.

Oriental Work

Dr. J. R. Leng made a statement on the Oriental Work in general and distributed a mimeographed progress report of a study being made of our Oriental Missions.

Appointments and Nominations

Winnipeg, Japanese: Agreed to the appointment of Rev. Nozomu Furuya, to take effect as soon as he arrives in Canada from Japan, and that in the meantime Miss Eugenia Bates continue as supply.

Edmonton, Japanese: Agreed that Rev. Y. Ogura of Lethbridge make occasional visits for pastoral work.

Montreal, Japanese: Agreed that Mr. Gordon Imai, B.A., ordinand, be nominated to the Settlement Committee of the Montreal and Ottawa Conference for settlement.

Ottawa, Japanese: Agreed that this be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent, with power to issue.

Vancouver, Japanese: Agreed that this vacancy be referred to the 'Secretaries and Superintendent, with power to issue.

Calgary, Chinese: Agreed that Rev. Stephen Yee Tong be appointed Assistant to Rev. A. L. Day.

W.M.S. Appointments

Agreed to approve the following appointments under The Woman's Missionary Society:

Nanaimo, Chinese—Miss Lily Chin Vancouver, Chinese—Miss Pauline Topp Kelowna, Japanese—Miss Madeline Bock Edmonton, Chinese—Miss Winnifred Harris subject to approval of Presbytery

It was also agreed that the appointment of a W.M.S. missionary to the Ottawa Chinese work be referred to the Secretaries and Mrs. C. M. Loveys, with power to issue.

Greenwood, B.C.

Agreed to approve the closing of work at Greenwood, B.C., by The Woman's Missionary Society.

Conference of Chinese Workers

Agreed to approve the holding of a Conference of Chinese Workers in Toronto on May 10th.

Marine Work

Appointments or Nominations

Central Mainland Marine, "Thos. Crosby IV"-Agreed (i) that the

pending vacancy, due to the resignation of Rev. J. J. Towers, be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent, with power to make a nomination to the British Columbia Conference Settlement Committee; and (ii) that the request for the addition of a "deck hand" to the staff be approved and that rate of salary be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent, with power

Salary Scale

Agreed to approve the recommendation of the British Columbia Conference Home Mission Committee: "That qualified missionaries on our boats (i.e., ordained men who have taken a short course in navigation) start at \$200 above scale and that present increments operate as well;" with the understanding that this apply only to the following boats: "Thomas Crosby IV," "R. C. Scott," and "Melvin Swartout," on the Pacific, and "Glad Tidings III," and "Chalmers," on the Atlantic.

Insurance

Agreed that the Secretaries be instructed to place public liability and property damage insurance on the following boats: "Thomas Crosby IV," "R. C. Scott," "Melvin Swartout," "Wm. H. Pierce," "Glad Tidings III," and "Chalmers."

Home Mission Projects

The Secretary reported that the Board had requested a total of \$294,000 for Special Projects in 1957. The Board of Finance had fixed the sum to be guaranteed at \$50,000, the additional amount in Contingent Projects to depend upon the total raised for the Missionary and Maintenance Fund.

Sunday School in the Home by Mail and Air

Miss Iris Daly, Supervisor of the Inter-Board Committee on the Sunday School in the Home by Mail and Air, addressed the Board of the work of the Committee. The Board recorded its appreciation of the work being done by Miss Daly.

It was agreed that the appropriation for 1957 be \$4,800.

Date of Board Meeting

The Secretaries and Superintendents were authorized to set the date of the meeting of the Board in 1958 and report to the Executive or Sub-Executive

Recommendations of Conference of Secretaries and Superintendents

Living Accommodation, S.O.

Re recommendation of the Montreal and Ottawa Conference Home Mission Committee that the Board review its policy with regard to provision of living accommodation for a single ordained minister: It was agreed that at the Settlement Committee, the Superintendent of Missions should give careful consideration before placing a single ordained minister in a city charge; and, further, that he urge that such charges and the Presbyteries concerned take steps as early as possible towards securing a manse, fulfilling the requirements for seeking Home Mission aid on the prescribed form, where such aid is necessary.

It was further agreed that the restriction imposed in respect to aid for building a manse on a charge served by a single ordained minister be removed.

Manse Furnishings

Re request of Superior Presbytery that the Board increase grant for manse furnishings to a maximum of \$750.00: It was agreed that in the furnishing of a manse for the first time the maximum grant shall now be \$750.000 and on the normal basis it shall be \$650.00; and, further, that no grant shall be made until the Superintendent assures the Secretaries that the manse is adequately insured and that when the furnishings are purchased, they will also be covered by insurance.

Retired Ministers Salary Scale

Re recommendation of Manitoba Conference Home Mission Committee that the Board "discontinue the practice of deducting pension from salary offered retired men who volunteer for post-retirement work on Home Mission charges": The following committee, named by the Chairman, was appointed to consider this question: Judge N. V. Buchanan (Chairman), Mr. K. G. Partridge, Mr. Ralph S. Mills, Dr. G. A. McMillan and Dr. J. C. Pincock. The Report of the Committee, received later, was as follows:

"Your Committee recommends that the clause dealing with Retired Ministers, appearing on Schedule 1 of the Report of the Appropriations Committee, as presented to the Board, be struck out, and that a Committee consisting of Dr. Macdonald, Dr. Mustard, Messrs. Mills and Partridge, draft a new clause in lieu thereof—the new clause to be based on the understanding arrived at by this Committee at its deliberations."

It was agreed that the above-named Committee should report to the June meeting of the Executive.

Statement re Vacancies

The Secretary presented a statement of prospective vacancies at June 30th and available supply. This was received for information.

Transfers to Property Fund

On motion, it was agreed that the Secretaries be authorized to transfer from Church Extension, Home Mission Projects or Home Mission Reserves to the Property Fund such amounts as may be required from time to time to take care of grants and loans voted by the Executive or Sub-Executive.

Caravan Work

Re request of the Manitoba Conference Home Mission Committee that the Board make a grant of \$100 to assist in Caravan Work during the coming summer: it was agreed that the Manitoba Conference Committee be asked to refer this matter to the Board of Christian Education.

Report of Resolutions Committee

The Report of the Resolutions Committee, as presented by Rev. J. Milton Fraser, was unanimously adopted, as follows:

Sympathy

- 1. That the sympathy of the Board be extended to the families of the following ministers who have recently passed away: Rev. T. S. Crisp, Rev. J. H. Hamilton, Rev. W. I. Green and Rev. Dr. Harry Joyce.
- 2. That letters of sympathy be sent to: Rev. Ezra Broughton, on the death of Mrs. Broughton; Miss Ida MacKenzie, on the death of her mother; Rev. Roy Anderson, on the death of his wife; Rev. J. R. Herdman, on the death of his father.
- 3. That the Secretary write to Rev. G. R. Inglis, Rev. Dr. D. R. Patterson and Mrs. A. MacK. Porritt, assuring them of our sympathy in their illness and of our prayers for their restoration to health.

Greetings

That Greetings from the Board be extended to all retired Superintendents of Missions.

Congratulations

1. That congratulations be extended to the Rev. Harold M. Bailey, who has been appointed Superintendent of Missions for Southern Ontario,

assuring him that, having noted his success in the pastorate and his ability in recording the proceedings of this Board, we feel that he will make a distinct contribution to his new sphere of service in our Church.

2. That congratulations be extended to the Rev. C. Dwight Powell on his appointment as Superintendent of Missions for Central and Northern Alberta and that we assure him of our confidence that, because of his ability and his intimate knowledge of the Church and the Home Mission work in Alberta, his services to the Board will be of a high calibre.

Appreciation

1. Rev. Thomas Hart, M.A., B.D., D.Th.: That the following resolution be recorded in the Minutes of the Board and a copy sent to Dr. Hart:

The Board of Home Missions pauses in its deliberations to note the coming retirement of the Rev. Thomas Hart, M.A., B.D., Th.D., as Superintendent of Home Missions for Central and Northern Alberta and to express its deep appreciation of his services during the past fifteen years. Dr. Hart has served the Church in Alberta since 1913, as student minister, pastor, teacher, and since 1942 as Superintendent of Missions.

Geographically, Dr. Hart's superintendency has covered a vast territory; in time it spans a period of rapid economic development in Alberta. This period, in turn, has seen great expansion in the work of The United Church of Canada in both rural and urban areas and a corresponding increase in Home Mission responsibility.

Dr. Hart has been a generous friend to many and above all to the student ministers; he has been ever ready with advice and practical help to those who needed it. He has been a welcome visitor at the several Presbyteries within whose bounds his work lay.

Dr. Hart's presence at the annual meetings of the Board has won for him the abiding affection of us all; his genial friendliness and ready smile, his imperturable good humour, we shall greatly miss.

The Board extends most cordial greetings to Dr. and Mrs. Hart and prays that for them there may be ahead many happy years of continued service to God and His Kingdom.

2. Rev. Sidney B. Stokes, D.D.: That the following resolution be inscribed in the Minutes and a copy sent to Dr. Stokes:

We wish to express our very warm and sincere appreciation for the valuable services the Rev. Sidney B. Stokes, D.D., has rendered to the Church in his home Conference and to the work of the Board of Home Missions in particular, during his term as a Superintendent of Home Missions in Southern Ontario.

During the five years he has held this office he has given himself

with quiet efficiency, with kindly understanding, and with keen foresight to the various problems of his superintendency.

His gracious personality and dignified presence have merited the respect and affection of his brethren. It is a matter of real regret to his area, his fellow Superintendents and to the Secretaries that ill health has made it necessary for him to lay down his durites before the time of his normal retirement.

3. That the Board extend its appreciation to:

The Moderator, The Rt. Rev. J. S. Thomson, D.D., for his visit to our Annual Meeting and his deep interest in our work as indicated by his message.

The Chairman, Rev. W. M. Mustard, D.D., for the very gracious and efficient manner with which he directs the proceedings of this Board.

The Secretaries, for their sacrificial service to the Church, for their personal friendliness and for their fairness in dealing with our problems.

The Superintendents, for their constant labours throughout the Church and for the inspiration they bring to this Board as they present us with a picture of our work across the nation.

The office staff for their sincere interest in the work of the Church and for their loyal and courteous assistance to this Board.

Miss R. Boucher for her excellent report to this Board and her notable services to the Church in our Pointe-aux-Trembles French Institute.

The minister and officials of Donway United Church for their kind welcome and the entertainment provided for our Annual Dinner, and to the ladies who served a delicious meal.

Mrs. Jean Newman, our special speaker, and to all others whose wit, humour and brilliance helped to make our Annual Dinner an event of such happy fellowship.

The Rev. George Telford, D.D., on his retirement as Minute Secretary, for a task performed graciously and efficiently, and express to him our satisfaction that he remains a member of this Board.

4. That the following resolution be recorded in the Minutes of the Board and a copy sent to Miss Helen Cornforth:

The Board takes this opportunity to express its deep appreciation to Miss Helen Cornforth, now retiring after thirty-seven years of service in the offices of the Board.

Miss Cornforth has served during the Secretaryship of Dr. J. H. Edmison, Dr. Colin Young and Dr. D. N. McLachlan of the Presbyterian Church, who held office before and for a short time after Union, and since

that time with Dr. Cochrane, Dr. Dorey, Dr. Macdonald and their Associates.

Those who have gone would have testified, as would also Dr. Dorey, Dr. Macdonald and their Associates, to the loyalty and resourcefulness of Miss Cornforth. She has proved herself to be a great servant of the Church which she loves, and we wish her many happy years of retirement and God's continued blessing upon her life.

Visitation of Troops by Dr. Leng

Dr. J. R. Leng reported that he had been nominated by the Chaplaincy Committee to visit the Canadian troops in Europe. It was agreed that Dr. Leng be authorized to accept this assignment and to take his holidays following the visit with the troops.

Report of Appropriations Committee

The Report of the Appropriations Committee was presented by the Secretary and was adopted as follows:

- I. Salary and Car Allowance
- (1) That we carry out the instructions of the Seventeenth General Council in reference to the minimum salary and travel allowance which reads as follows:

"That the General Council increase the minimum salary for married ministers from \$3,000 to \$3,200, together with a free furnished house, and that the Board of Home Missions be asked to implement this increase over a two-year period, \$100 in 1957 and \$100 in 1958, and to increase the present scale of travel allowance as soon as possible."

- (2) That for 1957 the salaries be built up to \$3,100 (for a married ordained minister) and that the travel allowance in force be the same as in 1956.
- (3) That all aid-receiving charges be notified, through the Presbytery Home Mission Convener and the Superintendent of Home Missions, of the new salary and travel scale for 1957.

The realization of this scale will depend on each charge fulfilling its salary promise and increasing it where possible.

(4) That charges not now aid-receiving and whose salary scale is below \$3,100 (for M.O. with furnished manse) and whose car travel allowance is below the new Home Missions travel scale, shall, through proper Presbytery action, make application to the Board of Home Missions for adjustment by way of special grant as soon as possible after the end of the calendar year. That to qualify for such special grants, these charges must conform to the regulations re canvass, as follows:

- (a) Conduct an every-person and family canvass as soon as possible, but in any case before the fall meeting of the Presbytery concerned. Such canvass must produce a minimum increase in contributions towards the salary of \$100 over the amount paid in 1956.
- (b) Further, these charges must pay, in addition to salary, a car travel allowance within \$100 of the Home Mission scale. Thus the maximum special on travel that they can receive will be \$100.
- (5) That adjustment of car travel allowance will be made only where the minister owns and operates his car in the pursuit of his duties.
- (6) That, to assist charges in reaching the General Council scale, each Presbytery be asked to appoint a Committee on Salaries (composed of three or more laymen and the Home Mission Convener), which will visit all charges requesting salary and/or travel grants. This Committee will advise and inform the charges concerned on matters of church finance, but especially on the salary and travel scale and the regulations, and also the method of conducting a proper canvass.

Before recommending that the Board of Home Missions pay a special grant on salary and/or travel to any charge not now on the list, Presbytery should be certain that a proper canvass was conducted and that the assistance requested is fully justified.

(7) That on the basis of estimates of contributions from congregations, the scale of salaries for 1957 be as on Schedule 1, below.

II. Education Grant

- (a) That a special grant of \$100 be made to any married, ordained minister or lay supply, in receipt of salary not above the Home Mission minimum, for each child who has to leave home to pursue undergraduate studies at any University or Teacher's College, and that it be understood that such a grant is not applicable to students taking a Theological course; special cases to be dealt with on their merits.
- (b) That a grant be made for not more than four years for a student in Arts or Science course and for not more than five in a Medical or Dental course; and that if a student fails in his year, the grant will not be paid for the year in which he repeats the course.
- (c) That in making application a prescribed course be defined and the required university term be indicated.
- (d) That payment of the grant shall be made in two instalments the first on receipt of a certificate of enrolment or attendance for the Fall term from the Registrar of the institution; the

second on receipt of similar certification that the student is enrolled and in attendance for the term following the New Year.

III. Special Allowance for Transportation on Fields

That in harmony with the intent of Section 104 (e) of the Manual-

- (a) Every ordained minister or lay supply on an aid-receiving charge or one eligible for assistance from the Board of Home Missions, and serving 100 or more families, on two or more appointments, where the Sunday drive is not less than 10 miles and not more than 39 miles, shall receive a yearly car depreciation allowance of \$350. Where the Sunday drive is 40 miles or more, the depreciation allowance shall be \$375.
- (b) To the depreciation allowance in the above categories, shall be added 15 cents per mile of Sunday travel. This not only cares for Sunday travel, but adds something for pastoral work.
- (c) An ordained minister in the active work, serving a 1-point charge with 150 or more families, and on which a minister (in the active work) would normally be settled, and which cannot be linked up by Presbytery with another appointment to make a larger charge, shall receive \$400 a year towards car maintenance and depreciation.
- (d) An ordained minister on a charge of two or more appointments with 100 or more families, where the Sunday drive is less than 10 miles, and where Presbytery re-arrangement is impossible, shall receive \$400 a year towards his car maintenance and depreciation.
- (e) In charges where the summer and winter travel vary, the travel allowance will be worked out on the basis of three-quarters summer travel and one-quarter winter travel.
- (f) Charges, large or small, with exceptional conditions as to travel and location, and where re-arrangement by Presbytery is impossible, shall be dealt with on their merits.
- (g) Where there are two or more appointments and the minister is unable to operate a car to reach his preaching appointments or in the performance of pastoral duties, he be allowed up to the rate for Sunday mileage, without depreciation, after submitting accounts to the Board of Home Missions; each case to be dealt with on its merits.
- NOTE: When the Secretary receives from the Treasurer of the Church the financial statement for the month of October, if in the judgment of the Sub-Executive of the Board the balance available for the rest of the year can provide an additional \$25.00 to

the car depreciation portion of the travel allowance for all who receive it, this amount will be automatically added to the December Quarter grants for travel.

The Travel allowance to be as on Schedule 2 below.
