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SUB-EXECUTIVE OF THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

MINUTES

May 2nd, 1960

The Sub-Executive met in the office of the Secretary of the Board at 9:30 a.m., on Monday, May 2nd, 1960. The Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, E. E. M. Joblin, George M. Morrison and Mr. E. D. Kingsbury, Regrets were received from Mr. Ralph S. Mills.

Rev. E. E. M. Joblin was appointed Minute Secretary.

Communications

Communications were received from: (a) Mrs. G. W. Morrison, in appreciation of sympathy extended at the time of the death of Mr. Morrison; (b) retired Superintendents of Missions, in acknowledgment of letters of greeting sent on behalf of the Board.

Resolutions

1. It was requested that sympathy be extended to Mrs. S. F. Ricketts, Vancouver, on the death of her husband, who for many years had taken a deep interest in our Chinese work.

2. It was requested that congratulations on behalf of the Sub-Executive be extended to the following who have recently been honoured by the conferring of the Degree of Doctor of Divinity: Rev. Russell Ross, Vancouver; Rev. Robert A. McLaren, Naramata; Rev. L. P. Archibald, Upper Stewiacke, N.S.; Rev. M. H. Manuel, Woodstock, N.B.; Rev. W. K. MacKay, Bass River, N.S.

Office Equipment for Superintendents

It was agreed that Superintendents who conduct the business of the superintendency from their homes be provided with necessary office equipment, and if, in order to provide office space in the home, it should become necessary for a Superintendent to pay considerably above what he would pay for a house to meet his normal needs, an amount up to \$200 annually be provided to help in meeting the extra cost.

Church Extension, Northern Ontario

The Secretaries were authorized to negotiate with Dr. J. A. Lyttle with regard to his undertaking Church Extension work in Northern Ontario, on a half-time basis, next fall.

Survey, Sudbury Area

It was agreed that Dr. J. A. Lyttle and Rev. F. L. H. Stymiest be asked to consult with the Home Mission Convener and nominate to our Executive in June a Committee of Five to study the Sudbury City area. as recommended by the Conference Home Mission Committee.

Hospital Work

1. It was agreed to approve proposal forwarded by Chief Judge N. V. Buchanan, Chairman of the Alberta Conference Hospital Board, and to offer a site on our hospital property at Lamont to the Provincial Government for the erection of an auxiliary hospital for the chronically ill.

2. Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital: It was agreed: (a) to accept, with regret, the resignation of Dr. George M. Robb as Medical Superintendent, to take effect about the end of September or later; and (b) to offer the superintendency of this hospital to Dr. R. B. Palmer, now at Hazelton, it being understood that if Dr. Palmer does not accept the position, the Secretaries shall have power to make an appointment, if necessary, and report to the Executive.

Immigration Work

The appointment of the Rev. J. P. C. Fraser as Immigration Chaplain at Halifax, on a half-time basis, was approved.

1. The following nominations and/or appointments to Boards and Committees of the Church were approved:

2. It was agreed that the Rev. J. R. Leng be appointed as the Board's representative to the Dominion Board, The Woman's Missionary Society.

3. It was agreed that the Rev. J. R. Leng and the Rev. E. E. M. Joblin be nominated as the Board's representatives on the Committee on Missionary Education of The Canadian Council of Churches.

Institutional Mission Work

1. Charlottetown, P.E.I.: The opening of institutional mission work in the Spring Park area, in co-operation with Trinity United Church, was discussed. It was agreed that if Trinity Church makes arrangements for the use of the old school building known as Spring Park School (which the city will offer rent free for one year) and equips it, this Board will pay one-half of the following items: salary of the third minister at Home Mission scale, house rent, car travel allowance and Pension Fund assessment.

2. Toronto, Fred Victor Mission: It was agreed: (a) That arrangements for the superintendency be referred to the committee appointed by the Board, report to be made to the June meeting of the Executive; and (b) that the committee be authorized to receive report of sub-committee on staff and report to the Board or Executive.

3. Montreal, Church of All Nations: It was agreed to authorize payment of employer's portion for purchase of Past Service Credit in the L.E.R.P., and the current annual assessment, for Mr. George Ceci, Caretaker.

Director of Fund-Raising

It was agreed that Dr. Macdonald, Dr. Leng and Mr. Kingsbury be a committee to interview and select a Fund-Raising Director, with report to the Executive in June.

1. Brandon Residential School: Agreed to authorize payment, if necessary, from Indian Work account of total cost of school bus — approximately \$6,000, plus trade-in allowance.

2. Indian Workers' Conference, Winnipeg: Agreed that the full expenses of missionaries (not wives) attending this Conference in June be cared for by this Board, with the understanding that if the total cost should exceed the \$500 voted by the Board, the Executive in June be requested to vote the additional amount required.

Oriental Work

The Secretaries were authorized to enquire if The United Church of Christ in Japan could assist the Board in securing a minister who speaks the Japanese language and who might be appointed as assistant to Dr. Shimizu in Toronto.

Manitoba Conference Home Mission Committee

It was agreed to accede to the request that the Board finance the total cost of the spring meeting of the Committee; details to be worked out with the Secretaries.

Date of Board Meeting

It was decided that the dates for the meeting of the Board in 1961 should be April 10, 11, 12 and 13, opening at 2:00 p.m. on Monday afternoon, April 10; the first meeting of pre-Board committees to be held in the afternoon of Monday, April 3rd.

EXECUTIVE OF THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

MINUTES

June 23rd, 1960

The Executive of the Board of Home Missions met in Committee Room 712, The United Church House, Toronto, at 9:30 a.m., Thursday, June 23rd. The Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer.

Rev. E. E. M. Joblin was appointed Minute Secretary.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, E. E. M. Joblin, George M. Morrison, F. L. H. Stymiest, George Telford, Harry M. Denning, Messrs. John Wedlake, Ralph S. Mills and J. W. Frid.

Regrets were received from Mr. Arthur H. Webster.

Confirmation of Minutes

The Minutes of the meeting of the Sub-Executive, held on May 2nd, having been circulated, were confirmed.

Communications

Communications, in appreciation of congratulations extended on the conferring of the Degree of Doctor of Divinity, were received from the following: Rev. Murray H. Manuel, Rev. W. K. MacKay, Rev. L. P. Archibald, Rev. Russell Ross.

Resolutions

1. It was requested that sympathy on behalf of the Executive be extended to Mrs. Scott on the death of her husband, Rev. Dr. Robert C. Scott, who had served the Church for so many years, particularly in the realm of Indian work.

2. Congratulations on their election to the presidency of their respective Conferences were extended to: Rev. L. A. D. Curtis, Newfoundland; Rev. E. D. Murray, Maritime; Rev. A. D. Stade, Saskatchewan; Rev. Gerald M. Hutchinson, Alberta; and Rev. Robert Moses, British Columbia.

3. It was requested that the Secretary convey to the Rev. Elliott Birdsall, who has resigned from the chairmanship of the Vancouver Institutional Council, the Board's appreciation for his valuable services as Chairman of the Council.

4. Women Workers under Board: (a) It was agreed to approve the appointment of Miss Angela Scattaglia, Italian Work, Toronto, to serve under the supervision of Rev. M. Di Stasi and Dr. J. I. MacKay; salary to be at the rate of \$2,700 and \$150 city travel. (b) Elliot Lake, Ontario: The appointment of a successor to Miss Gloria J. Westley, who has submitted her resignation, effective September 30th, was referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions.

5. Church Extension Work: The following appointments were approved on recommendation of the respective Presbyteries: (a) Kitchener, Forest Hill area, Guelph Presbytery, Rev. S. H. Soper, retired supply. (b) Halton Presbytery area, Rev. E. A. Chester, retired supply.

Police Court and Jail Chaplaincy, Toronto

It was agreed: (a) To confirm salary of the Chaplain, Rev. J. A. H. Hodgson at rate of \$3,550, travel \$600, rent allowance \$75 a month, and allowance for telephone \$35.00 a year; (b) to pay cost of stationery and chaplain's cards; and (c) to provide an amount up to \$150 as a revolving Fund for case work.

Fund for Retired Workers

It was agreed that an'allowance of \$30 a month from the Fund for

Retired Workers should be paid to Rev. R. B. Gibson, an ordained minister of the Church of God (not eligible for reception into the United Church), who has recently retired after serving pastoral charges of the United Church for twenty years or more; and that the case be reviewed at the annual meeting of the Board.

Institutional Missions and Non-Anglo-Saxon Work

1. Charlottetown, P.E.I., Spring Park Institutional Centre: Dr. Macdonald reported that negotiations for the opening up of this work had been completed. The arrangement as proposed by the Sub-Executive on May 2nd was confirmed as follows: The Board of Home Missions will share with Trinity Church one-half responsibility for this ministry namely, salary \$1,750; car travel \$250; rent up to \$680; employer's equivalent to Pension Fund.

It was understood that the Board would receive a refund of one-half the regular offerings from the new congregation, and that one-half the minister's time would include the provision of a preaching service each Sunday, supervising the Sunday School on Sunday and youth work during the week, and the necessary pastoral visitation.

It was further understood that the above arrangement is subject to the approval of Presbytery or its Executive and will be reviewed at the annual meeting of the Board in 1961.

2. Yarmouth Town Mission: Dr. Macdonald stated that the Trustees of the Mission, with whom he had met, had decided to agree to the requirements for the operation of this Mission as laid down by the Board at its annual meeting. The Executive agreed that provision should be made for a budget adequate to begin operations from September 1st, 1960, authorized the Secretaries to appoint a Superintendent, and approved the following further conditions:

- (a) That an agreement to lease the building to this Board for a trial period of two years for the sum of One Dollar a year be drawn up, it being understood that if either party is not satisfied with the operation, the lease may be terminated on one year's notice.
- (b) That the Trustees will have the property put in reasonably good condition, including repairs, painting, provision of washroom facilities, installation of a small kitchenette, provision of additional equipment, check of the furnace and heating equipment.
- (c) That it is understood that the revenue from capital funds of the Mission, estimated at \$435 a year, plus the amount of \$1,000 in the bank and an anticipated bequest of \$500, will be applied towards cost of repairs and renovations; and that the Board of Home Missions will provide an amount up to \$300 towards purchase of equipment and redecorating.
- (d) That the Trustees will be responsible for adequate fire insurance on the property, as well as taxes, if any.

- (e) That during the first year of operation the Board will be responsible for the salary of the full-time worker on married lap supply basis namely, \$3,100 per year, car travel expense allowance up to \$500 a year for use of own car, and assistance towards rent, beginning at \$40 a month and increasing, if necessary, up to \$50 a month; and that towards the budget, estimated at approximately \$5,200 for the first year, the Board will expect that there be applied donations and contributions estimated at \$1,000, thus reducing the Board's share of the budget by that amount.
- (f) That an Advisory Committee be set up, consisting of the Board of Trustees, plus five or six members to be nominated by the Presbytery of Yarmouth; the Superintendent of Missions to be an ex-officio member of this Committee.

3. Ottawa, Hungarian: Dr. Macdonald reported that the majority of the Hungarian congregation in Ottawa, which had made an approach to the United Church, had decided to remain with the Presbyterian Church. The Secretaries were authorized to make any provision which might be necessary for the care of the minority group seeking pastoral oversight by the United Church.

4. Toronto, Queen Street-Church of All Nations-College Street: At the request of the Executive, Dr. J. I. MacKay was asked to attend in order to make a statement regarding the request for reconsideration of the proposed arrangement for amalgamating of the work at these centres. After deliberation, the following decisions were arrived at:

- (a) That the closing of either the Queen Street or Church of All Nations building be postponed for another year.
- (b) That the work and services of the Finnish and Hungarian congregations at the Church of All Nations building, 423 Queen St. West, be continued.
- (c) That the English congregation be continued at 765 Queen Street West for the time being, in the hope that before the end of the conference year, June 30th, 1961, the process of amalgamation and intergration with College Street can be completed.
- (d) That the Rev. H. R. Ashford serve as Co-Superintendent of the total work with Dr. C. A. Gowans but centre his work at College Street; and that one of the Deaconesses, Miss Maimie Gollan, be transferred to College Street.
- (e) That the youth worker replacing Rev. Jos. Blakey be directed by the Co-Superintendents, serving in the whole area but having a major responsibility for the English work at 765 Queen Street West.

5. Toronto Fred Victor Mission: Mr. Ralph Mills reported progress on behalf of the committee which had been appointed by the Board to consider staff and related responsibilities. He stated that Dr. J. I. MacKay

and Dr. W. A. Hunnisett were both agreeable to acting as Co-Superintendents of the institutional work on completion of the new building that is, from July 1st, 1961, this arrangement to obtain for a two-year period. It was understood that Dr. MacKay would be in charge of the Senior Citizens and the initiating of Welfare Industries, and that Dr. Hunnisett would care for the mission programme and the work among transients. It was further understood that Dr. Hunnisett would carry on until June 30th, 1961, the normal programme of the Mission.

The Executive agreed: (a) That the grant from July 1st be continued as voted by the Board, with provision for the following extras involved: salary and travel adjustments for the two deaconesses, provision for three wardens, if necessary, and laundry and boiler maintenance; and (b) that any minor adjustments necessary be made by the Secretary and Superintendent concerned.

6. Toronto, St. Christopher House: Dr. Macdonald stated that, at the request of the St. Christopher House Board, its representatives had met with representatives of the Board of Home Missions to discuss our action in deciding to discontinue the grant at the end of the calendar year 1960. The proposal made to the representatives of the St. Christopher House Board was that if more religious content were included in their programme, our Executive might suggest to the annual meeting of our Board that reconsideration be given to providing a modified budget, with the understanding that the matter would first come before the Conference Home Mission Committee.

7. Toronto, German Evangelical Congregation: It was agreed that this congregation be permitted to continue holding services in Queen Street Church, but that, from September 1st, they be asked to pay \$60 a month, rather than \$50, for this privilege.

8. Survey, Sudbury City area: Mr. Stymiest reported that, as requested by the Board at its annual meeting, a committee had been set up to study this area, consisting of the following: Rev. J. D. Evans, Rev. W. R. Fritz, Rev. B. A. Warren, Rev. A. T. Kennard, Rev. E. J. Van Goudoever, Mr. Walter Muncaster and Mr. W. J. Tate. The Executive recommended that the Executive of Sudbury Presbytery be asked to clarify the terms of reference and suggested that two laymen from within the bounds of the city should be included in the committee and that the two outside ministers might be corresponding members. It was decided that this matter be left to Mr. Stymiest to consult with the Presbytery authorities.

9. Finnish Work, Superior Presbytery and Toronto: It was agreed:

(a) That the appointment of Rev. G. A. Koponen as missionary-at-large in Superior Presbytery, from September 1st, be approved: (b) that authority be given to the Secretaries and the Superintendent of Missions concerned to prepare budget and set grant for this work; and (c) that, on the departure of Mr. Koponen from Toronto, the necessary steps be taken to have Rev. Reino Hepolehto designated as minister of the Finnish congregation of the Church of All Nations.

10. Prince George (B.C.) Hostel: Dr. Macdonald stated that, because of the decision of the Prince George City Council not to make available a building for the proposed hostel, the project had had to be abandoned.

11. Prince Rupert, Friendship House: Mr. Joblin presented a progress report. It was agreed that the Secretaries and the Superintendent of Missions should continue study and negotiations and report.

12. Bursaries for Visits to Institutional Work: It was decided that the two Superintendents of Institutions who should be given the opportunity of spending two weeks visiting institutional centres in the United States and Canada, for special study, should be the Rev. W. A. Burbidge and the Rev. D. O. Reece.

Literature

It was agreed to authorize the purchase of a typewriter for use of Rev. R. G. Lindsey, Cross Lake, in typing English material for the Cree publication, "Spiritual Light"—at cost of approximately \$90.00.

Hospital Work

1. Bella Bella, R. W. Large Memorial Hospital: (a) Banking authority: It was agreed to authorize Dr. David R. Preston, Rev. Hugh McKervill and Miss Christine Laidlaw to sign cheques and conduct other business with the Canadian Bank of Commerce, Vancouver, on behalf of the R.W. Large Memorial Hospital, to implement which the following resolution was adopted:

Be It Resolved: That David R. Preston, M.D., Medical Superintendent, Hugh W. McKervill, United Church minister, and Christine Laidlaw, bookkeeper, or any two of them, are hereby authorized for and in the name of the R.W. Large Memorial Hospital, Bella Bella, B.C., to sign cheques on the account of the said Hospital and on the Medical Services account of the said Hospital, carried in The Canadian Bank of Commerce, Vancouver, B.C.;

Also That the said David R. Preston, Hugh W. McKervill, and Christine Laidlaw, or any two of them, be and are hereby authorized for and on behalf of the said Hospital account and the said Medical Services account to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the two accounts aforenamed only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said Hospital account and the said Medical Services

account, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or signer of such Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes and negotiable paper to discount the same or to deposit the same otherwise than for collection purposes with the said Bank;

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said Hospital and the said Bank and to receive all'paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release.

And That all other powers heretofore given in this matter be and are hereby revoked.

(b) Interim Hospital Board: Pending the approval of the new Hospital Constitution by the Provincial Minister of Health Services, it was agreed that the appointment of the following Interim Board be approved: Mr. Oscar Bainbridge, Chairman; Provincial Government representative; Rev. Hugh McKervill, Dr. D. R. Preston, Miss Mildred Empey, Mr. Herman Schafer, Mr. Clarence Martin, and Mr. J. L. Homan, Indian Agency Superintendent.

2. Hazelton, Wrinch Memorial Hospital: (a) The appointment of Dr. Ormond Uptigrove as Assistant Doctor for one year, from July 1st, was approved; salary to be at the rate of \$6,000 and living quarters.

(b) On nomination of the Prince Rupert Presbytery, the following members were appointed to the Hospital Board: Rev. H. W. Boyd, Mr. David R. Goodridge, Mr. N. H. Kilpatrick, Mr. R. C. Telford, Mr. A. Markuson, Dr. G. W. J. Fiddes, Dr. J. E. Whiting, Rev. R. W. K. Elliott.

3. Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital: (a) It was agreed that Dr. R. B. Palmer be appointed Medical Superintendent, succeeding Dr. G. M. Robb; salary to be at the rate of \$9,000, with furnished house. It was agreed, also, that if the Hospital is unable to bear all or any part of Dr. Palmer's moving expenses, the Board would be responsible.

(b) Constitution: Approval was given to the Constitution which was prepared for the Hospital, it being understood that it will be sent forward for approval by the Executive or Sub-Executive of the General Council and then to the British Columbia Department of Health Services, for approval by the Minister.

4. Lamont, Archer Memorial Hospital: It was agreed to appoint the following as members of the Alberta Hospital Board: Chief Judge Nelles V. Buchanan, Chairman; Rev. D. J. C. Elson, Vice-Chairman; Rev. Gerald Hutchinson, Mr. L. R. Adshead, Rev. C. D. Powell, Mr. R. B. Christie, Mr. W. O. Doige, Mr. M. T. Nemirsky, Rev. L. Musto, Dr. Morley A. R. Young, Mr. J. P. Matwichuk.

It was decided that the matter of ex-officio members of the Alberta Hospital Board should be clarified and report made to a later meeting of the Executive.

5. Stewart (B.C.) Hospital: Dr. Macdonald reported that, after investigation, it appeared that it was not advisable to take any action on the approach to the Board regarding the possibility of its taking over operation of this hospital. This was received for information.

Licenses to Administer the Sacraments

1. At the request of the Newfoundland Conference Home Mission Committee, it was agreed to recommend to the Executive of General Council that all candidates and lay supplies of that Conference "appointed to regular pastoral charges for the 1960-61 Conference year be licensed to administer the Sacrament of Baptism, and that a license or renewal of licence to administer the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper be given only to those who serve in remote areas on the recommendation of the Presbytery concerned and the Superintendent of Missions."

2. At the request of the respective Presbyteries, it was agreed to recommend to the Executive or Sub-Executive of General Council that licences to administer the Sacraments be granted, for one year from the date of issue, to the following lay supplies while serving on their present charges:

Alert Bay Aircraft

Dr. Leng reported that, in view of the seriousness of the decision of the Board at its annual meeting to initiate the use of aircraft to serve the Alert Bay Marine Mission, it was decided that this action should be reported to the Executive of General Council, which body was given a detailed explanation of the plan of operation, as well as of the precautions taken to cover all contingencies with regard to training, basis of operation, insurance, etc. The Executive of General Council, not only expressed its warm approval of the action of the Board, but also its commendation of the extreme care with which this significant form of serving this marine mission was introduced.

Dr. Leng stated, further, that a plane had been purchased at an initial cost of \$10,358.97 and that Rev. W. O. MacKenzie was taking instruction and expected to have his pilot's licence soon.

Appointment Director of Fund-raising

Dr. Macdonald reported that it was not yet possible to make a nomination for the position of Fund-Raising Director. He stated, further, that the Board of Finance had appointed a committee to study the advisability of setting up a fund-raising department under that Board.

It was decided: (a) that we should co-operate with the Board of Finance in this matter; and (b) that the Secretaries be given authority to make the appointment, if a suitable man should be found, after consultation with the Chairman, Mr. Mills and Mr. Kingsbury.

Indian Work

1. God's Lake, Man., Use of Aircraft: It was agreed that, in the light of the action taken by the Executive of General Council with regard to the use of aircraft at the Alert Bay Marine Mission, we recommend that a similar report be made to that body regarding the Board's desire to authorize the use of privately owned aircraft by the missionary at God's Lake, Rev. M. G. Millard, provided he secures the necessary licence and the requisite insurance; further, that if no objection is made, the Executive of the Board will grant approval.

2. Morley Residential School: (a) The appointment of Mr. Ronald F. Campbell as Principal, effective July 1st, was confirmed.

(b) Banking authority: On motion, the following resolution was adopted:

Be It Resolved: That Mr. Ronald F. Campbell, Principal, is hereby authorized for and in the name of the Morley Indian Residential School, Morley, Alberta, to sign cheques upon the Imperial Bank of Canada, Calgary, Alberta, on behalf of the said School; Also That the said Ronald F. Campbell be and is hereby authorized on behalf of the said School to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the said School account only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said School, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or signer of such Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes and negotiable paper to discount the same or to deposit the same otherwise than for collection purposes with the said Bank;

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said School and the said Bank and to receive all paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release.

And That all other powers heretofore given in this matter be and are hereby revoked.

3. Prince Rupert, Hostel: Mr. Joblin reported on the proposal to purchase a building, to be used as a residence for native young people. It was agreed that the Secretaries should confer with The Woman's Missionary Society and have the building evaluated, after which they would have authority to purchase, if deemed wise, in consultation with Dr. Mustard, Mr. Mills and Mr. Kingsbury.

Toronto, Evangelical Church of the Deaf

Dr. Macdonald stated that certain problems had arisen with regard to the administration of the Carter Trust Fund. It was agreed to recommend that conversations be held between the Trustees of the Fund and representatives of the Toronto East Presbytery.

Church Extension

Policy of Assistance for 1959

Establishment of grants for 1959 sites, churches (or church halls) was left to Secretaries.

Resolution of Calgary Presbytery

The Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer. Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, E. E. M. Joblin, George M. Morrison, Emerson G. Knowles, R. Douglas Smith, H. G. Lester, Messrs. Ralph S. Mills, Arthur H. Webster, and E. D. Kingsbury. Rev. F. L. H. Stymiest was present as a corresponding member. Mr. Hugh Campbell, Accountant, was present, also.

Regrets were received from Rev. H. M. Denning and Mr. J. W. Frid.

Rev. E. E. M. Joblin was appointed Minute Secretary.

Communications

The following communications were received:

1. From Rev. L. A. D. Curtis and Rev. Robert Moses, in appreciation of congratulations extended on their election to the presidency of their respective Conferences.

2. From Rev. R. A. McLaren, in appreciation of congratulations on his receiving the Degree of Doctor of Divinity.

3. From Rev. Harry S. McDonald, Vice-Chairman of the B.C. Tuberculosis Society, advising of a contribution of \$1,500 made by the Society towards cost of proposed new out-patients building at the R. W. Large Memorial Hospital, Bella Bella. The Executive expressed its appreciation of this gift.

Resolutions of Sympathy

1. Dr. Macdonald referred to the death on October 18th of the Rev. Oliver Darwin, D.D., a former Superintendent of Missions in Saskatchewan and British Columbia under the Methodist Church, who had celebrated his one hundredth birthday on August 3rd. He stated that the Board had been represented at the funeral by Rev. R. W. Henderson and Rev. R. M. Warne. It was requested that the sympathy of the Executive be conveyed to Mrs. Darwin and the members of his family.

2. It was requested that sympathy be extended to the following who had recently suffered bereavement: Mrs. J. C. Hill, widow of the late Rev. J. C. Hill, who had died as the result of a car accident; Rev. and Mrs. Russell Ross, both of whose mothers had recently passed away; the family of the late Mr. Ho Lem, an outstanding Christian leader of the Calgary Chinese community; the daughters of the late Mrs. J. A. Miller, widow of the late Rev. J. A. Miller, former Prison and Hospital Chaplain in Toronto.

Action of General Council Affecting Board

Action taken by the General Council at its meeting in September on matters affecting Home Missions was presented for information and for action, where necessary:

1. The Rev. Robert K. Shorten was appointed Assistant Secretary of the Board, effective June 1st, 1961; at which date the Rev. E. E. M. Joblin and the Rev. George M. Morrison become Associate Secretaries.

2. Ministerial Salaries: The Council directed that, if funds permit, the minimum salary of ministers be increased by \$150 in 1961 and by an additional \$150 in 1962; also, that the difference in salary between a married ordained and a single ordained minister be abolished. 3. The Council adopted the following recommendations of the Long Range Planning Committee: "That the Board of Home Missions, in consultation with the Board of Colleges and Secondary Schools, be authorized to appoint in 1961 from one to four hospital chaplains, the appointees to be ministers who have received or will receive special training for this functional ministry."

The Secretaries were instructed to seek out suitable men who might be appointed as Hospital Chaplains and, after study, to bring to the Board a recommendation as to where pilot projects might be established. The following cities were suggested: Edmonton, Saskatoon, Toronto, Montreal.

4. Provision of Manses: The Council referred to its Executive for study a memorial from Alberta Conference with regard to the growing practice of providing ministers with an allowance in lieu of manses, resulting in confusion and inconvenience to ministers. The Secretaries were asked to prepare a statement on this matter, to be submitted to the Sub-Executive of the Board and thence to the Executive of General Council.

Pertinent to this question, Dr. Macdonald stated that a letter had been received from Dr. J. C. Torrance, Superintendent of Missions, concerning the proposal of Westway United Church, Toronto West Presbytery, that the minister be allowed to purchase the manse, towards which the Board had given a grant of \$3,500 and a loan of \$8,500, the latter having been repaid. It was agreed that, through Dr. J. C. Torrance and the Presbytery, we should express disapproval of the principle involved, pointing out that, since the grant was given to the congregation and not to the minister, in the case of sale to the latter, the congregation would have a moral obligation to repay the grant.

5. Immigration: The Council adopted a recommendation that The Canadian Council of Churches give careful consideration at its forthcoming meeting to the responsibility of the Churches for assistance in refugee work; and, further, that it study the whole problem of normal immigration from various lands, and submit its recommendation to the Federal Government.

Appointments

1. The following appointments were confirmed:

- (a) Central Winnipeg Mission: Mrs. Mark Parsons as second woman worker, from September 20th.
- (b) Vancouver, First Church: (i) Miss Muriel Richardson; salary at rate of \$3,150, plus \$125 city travel—to be shared on equal basis by the W.M.S.; from September 1st. (ii) Mr. Herbert Dearden, Assistant Worker; salary at rate of \$3,100, plus \$500 travel; from September 1st; (iii) Rev. Adolph Welke, New

Canadian work; salary at rate of \$3,400, plus \$500 travel; from September 1st.

(c) Indian Missions: (i) Island Lake, Norway House Presbytery— Mr. T. A. Hamilton, M.L.S.; (ii) Poplar River, Norway House Presbytery—Mr. Edward Saunders, I.L.S.; (iii) Oxford House, Norway House Presbytery—Mr. Gerald Kelly, S.L.S.; (iv) Pikangikum, Kenora-Rainy River Presbytery—Mr. Harold Ogimow, I.L.S.; (v) Long Plains, Portage la Prairie Presbytery—Mr. Whitney McConnell, M.L.S.; (vi) File Hills, Yorkton Presbytery —Mr. Thomas Phillips, M.L.S.

2. Montreal, German: The appointment of Mr. Lothar Boettcher to care for German Work in Montreal, and Quebec City if needed, and also to do such other work as may be determined, was referred to the Secretaries in consultation with the Home Mission Committee of Presbytery.

3. The following action was taken on appointments requested:

- (a) Toronto, Bathurst St. Church: The appointment of Mr. William Sanders as Youth Worker was approved, subject to a satisfactory interview by the Secretaries and the Superintendent of Missions.
- (b) All People's-St. Christopher's, Hamilton: The appointment of Mrs. Gloria Robinson (formerly Miss Gloria Westley) as fulltime Worker at St. Christopher's congregation, was approved, effective from the beginning of December.
- (c) Toronto, Wesley Church: The revision of staff and care for the work following the reported resignation of Miss Shirley Cameron in December were referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions, in consultation with the Presbytery Home Mission Committee.

Department of Fund-Raising

Mr. Walter Thomson was introduced and welcomed to the service of the Board as the Director of the Department of Fund-Raising.

(1) Dr. Macdonald stated that, in accordance with the authority given by the Executive in June, Mr. Thomson had been appointed Director of Fund-Raising and had assumed his duties on October 15th; salary to be at the rate of \$6,700 per year, with increments of \$150 for each of two vears, building salary up to a maximum of \$7,000.

(2) It was agreed that an outstanding account of \$95.67 for the services of Mr. Neil Campbell at White Fox, Sask., be cancelled.

Moving Expenses

1. Rev. Henry Macdougall, Port Royal, Bermuda. Agreed that Mr. Macdougall be allowed the normal amount on moving expenses, in line with the policy of the Board, when he returns to Canada next year for post-graduate studies.

2. Temiskaming Presbytery, Elk Lake: Payment of \$100.00 towards moving expenses of Mr. Robert Peebles was confirmed.

3. Mr. Harry J. Mullens: No action was taken on request that the Board assume payment of travelling expenses of Mr. Mullens from Wakaw, Sask.—which charge he served for one year on MLS basis—to Vancouver, where he is attending Union College.

4. Mr. J. G. Wannop, Good Fish Lake, Alta.: Agreed to authorize payment of \$506, being moving expenses from Cape Mudge, B.C.

5. Mr. Herbert Dearden, First Church, Vancouver: Agreed to pay moving expenses from Prince Rupert to Vancouver, amounting to \$446.77.

6. Rev. J. P. C. Fraser, Port Chaplain, Halifax: The Secretaries were authorized to pay moving expenses from Ottawa when facts are available.

Division of Home Missions

1. It was decided that Dr. Macdonald should be the Board's representative at the Assembly of the Division of Home Missions, National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A., to be held in San Francisco, December 4-9, 1960.

2. It was agreed that the grant to the Division of Home Missions for 1961 should be \$2,000, being an increase of \$500, to be allocated as follows: General \$1,300; Urban Church \$400; Town and Country \$300.

Conference on Church and Family

It was agreed that Rev. Edgar F. File, Superintendent of North Winnipeg Missions, should be nominated to represent the Board at the Conference on Church and Family, to be held at Green Lake, Wisconsin, April 30-May 5, 1961, under the auspices of The Canadian Council of Churches and The National Council of The Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.

Inter-Church Conference on Home Mission Work

The appointment of the following to represent this Board at the Inter-Church Conference on Home Mission Work, to be held at St. Catharines, November 8th, was confirmed: Revs. M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, J. I. MacKay, H. M. Bailey, W. A. Burbidge, E. C. Armstrong.

Oriental Work

1. A grant up to \$250 was authorized towards cost of publication of "A History of Japanese Canadian Churches."

2. It was agreed to authorize the setting up of a Committee on Japanese Integration.

Institutional Missions and Non-Anglo-Saxon Work

1. Vancouver, First Church: An enquiry was presented as to whether the Board would assume payment of the employer's assessment on behalf of Rev. James Rinta, Finnish minister, who for the present is retaining his relationship to the Pension Fund of the Congregational Church in the U.S.A. It was agreed to pay up to \$200 for one year towards the employer's assessment.

2. German Evangelical Church: A proposal was received from Rev. Horst Rueger that steps be taken to have The United Church of Canada become the official representative in this country of The German Evangelical Church. It was agreed that if a request should come from the proper body in Germany, we would be prepared to give favourable consideration to it.

3. Kirchentag: At the request of Dr. H. H. Walz, General Secretary of the Kirchentag, it was agreed to nominate Rev. Horst Rueger to the Executive of General Council as contact man in Canada for the next Kirchentag, to be held in Germany in 1961.

Pension Fund, Employer's Equivalent

It was decided that in the case of men serving marine missions and other fields where there is no allowance for travel, the employer's equivalent should be paid to the Pension Fund on salary plus an amount up to \$500.

Eleonore Hemmings Legacy

With regard to a bequest under the Will of the late Mrs. Eleonore Hemmings of "one share (of residue of estate) to The United Church of Canada Home Mission Fund at Vancouver, British Columbia," (which amounts to \$3,175), the B.C. Conference Home Mission Committee passed the following resolution: "We recommend to the Board of Home Missions of the United Church re the legacy of Mrs. Eleonore Hemmings, of Cloverdale, that three trustees be appointed to handle this money; two of whom should be the B.C. Superintendents, Rev. R. W. Henderson and Rev. R. M. Warne, and the third named by the Executive of the Board of Home Missions. We therefore recommend further that this money be used for Home Mission work in British Columbia as was evidently the wish and intention of Mrs. Hemmings."

It was agreed that the proceeds of this bequest should be administered by the Board of Home Missions in the usual way and used for its work in British Columbia.

Superintendents' Car Insurance

With regard to enquiry by Rev. A. D. Stade as to whether Motor Club dues might be included in car insurance costs, it was directed that he be informed that these were not a legitimate charge on car insurance.

Indian Work

1. Education Grants: It was agreed to approve: (a) Grant of \$200 a year for each of two children of Rev. D. A. Richardson of Norway House, attending school in Winnipeg; and (b) grant of \$200 a year for daughter of Mr. Thos. Phillips, missionary at File Hills, Sask.

2. Aircraft, God's Lake, Man.: On motion, the following resolution was adopted:

A thorough study having been made of the use of aircraft in the service of the Church, the Executive of the Board of Home Missions recommends:

- (a) That Rev. George Millard be permitted to use his own aircraft in the work of his charge at God's Lake, provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) All safety measures will be taken, such as regular inspection and overhaul of his aircraft, as required by the proper authorities in Manitoba.
 - (ii) Mr. Millard will carry his own insurance on the plane and liability insurance for his own protection, as well as insurance on his own life.
 - (iii) The Board of Home Missions will protect the Church by maintaining liability insurance in the amount of \$250,000 (at an estimated cost of \$110 per year), as provided for the churchowned aircraft at Alert Bay.

(b) That the Executive of General Council be informed of this decision.

3. Training School for Indian Workers: Agreed to vote a grant of \$100 towards expenses of Training School for workers, elders and interpreters in the Kenora-Rainy River Presbytery, to be held during the coming winter.

4. Fairfield Museum and New Fairfield Church: Agreed to approach the Executors of the McGeachy Estate with the request that they make an annual contribution of \$1,000 towards the maintenance of the site, a total budget of \$1,730 having been estimated.

5. Edmonton Residential School: The appointment of Mr. J. William Garvock as Director of Christian Education, succeeding Rev. J. Ludford, effective October 1st, was approved.

6. Naramata Christian Leadership Training School: Agreed to concur in the action of the Trustees of the Maud Raley Fund in authorizing payment up to \$500 from the Fund for remuneration of a Study Supervisor for native students, and to vote an additional grant of \$300 from Home Mission funds, which will provide payment of \$100 a month from November 1st to the end of the school term.

Fund for Retired Workers

Agreed to confirm payment at rate of \$200 to Mrs. Adam Fiddler, widow of the late missionary at Sandy Lake, for the months July-October, and to authorize continuance of the allowance at the same rate until the meeting of the Board in 1961, to be paid from Fund for Retired Workers.

Car Subsidies

1. Regulations: Mr. Hugh Campbell presented the following proposed revisions in Car Subsidy regulations. It was decided to accept these as a basis of operation until the meeting of the Board, and to direct that they be referred to the Conference of Secretaries and Superintendents for consideration and recommendation to the Board.

(a) Re Conditional Grant: That the conditional grant (\$500) be cancelled at the rate of \$125 annually (July 1st-June 30th), providing that the ordinand continues to be in receipt of salary and travel allowance that does not exceed the current Home Mission scale by an amount greater than the \$125 to be cancelled; and that in the event that the salary and travel received are in excess of \$125 above the current minimum scale, the amount of the cancellation will then be reduced by the amount being received in excess of \$125 and the minister will be required to repay this difference.

Further, that each ordinand's case be considered on its own merits and dealt with individually, using the above proposed conditions for cancellation as a general policy for guidance.

(b) *Freight Differential*: That where there is no trade-in and where there is a substantial reduction which more than absorbs the freight differential, the Board should not be expected to provide the differential, since by so doing we are discriminating against those who have to pay the normal list price.

(c) Subsidies for Lay Supplies: That consideration be given to clarification of the regulations pertaining to car subsidies given to lay supplies.

2. Late Rev. J. C. Hill: Agreed that the unpaid balance of the conditional grant-\$375—be cancelled,

3. Re Rev. J. B. Reynolds: Agreed to cancel outstanding loan of \$200, circumstances having obliged Mr. Reynolds to sell his car and later purchase another, suffering considerable loss.

Compassionate Grant

It was agreed: (a) to confirm payment of \$100 to Rev. A. H. Mundy, Vanderhoof, B.C., on compassionate grounds, because of serious illness of his wife; and (b) that the Secretaries negotiate with the Department of Pensions in the hope that it will agree to share on a 50-50 basis in a grant of \$50 a month, and that, failing this, the grant of \$50 a month be paid by this Board.

Licences to Administer Sacraments

The action of the General Council in adopting the following recommendations of the Committee to Review Section 117 (v), iii of The Manual, was reported for information:

"(a) A licence to administer the Sacrament of Baptism and/or the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper for one year at a time on a specified charge or charges may be granted by the General Council or its Executive on recommendation of the Board of Home Missions or its Executive to a Lay Supply who is engaged in full-time preaching and pastoral service and for whom Presbytery or its Executive has made application.

"(b) Application should not be made for such licence to administer the Sacraments on behalf of Lay Supplies unless there are very special reasons and specific needs to be met such as remoteness, Indian mission fields, or in a Presbytery area where, because of the number of Lay Supplies, a situation is created where it is almost impossible for ordained ministers to provide regular administration of the Sacraments."

1. At the request of the respective Presbyteries, it was agreed to recommend to the Executive or Sub-Executive of General Council that licences to administer the Sacraments be granted to the following lay supplies for one year, while serving on the charges specified:

(d) Moving Expenses, Dr. G. M. Robb: It was agreed that the Board should be responsible for the travelling expenses of Dr. Robb and his family from Queen Charlotte City to Vancouver and for the cost of moving his personal effects to Vancouver.

3. Re Conference of Doctors, Lamont, September 12th-13th:

(a) It was agreed that an honorarium of \$100 should be sent to the Archer Memorial Hospital, Lamont, in recognition of kindness in the provision of facilities for the Doctors' Conference.

(b) At the suggestion of the Doctors' Conference, the Secretary was requested to send a letter to Dr. George M. Robb, expressing appreciation of his services while Medical Superintendent of the Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital.

(c) The following recommendations of the Doctors' Conference re Scholarships for student nurses were submitted:

- "(i) That consideration be given to the provision of eight or ten scholarships, in which The Woman's Missionary Society would be asked to share, such scholarships to provide for travelling expenses to Lamont and other essential expenses during years of training (which might average \$150 per year) at the Archer Memorial Hospital.
- "(ii) That consideration be given, also, to the provision of assistance to the extent of, say, \$100 to students who may have the necessary requirements for entering nurses' training schools in their own Provinces but not in Alberta, so that they might complete

High School and take their training at the Archer Memorial Hospital."

It was agreed to adopt the recommendations, with the proviso that the recipients of scholarships be required to give two years' service in Church hospitals.

(d) Relationship of Hospitals to Presbyteries: It was agreed to adopt the recommendation of the Doctors' Conference that the expenses of a delegate to Presbytery should be charged to hospital operating expenses and not to the Medical Services Fund, as directed by the Board of 1960.

It was agreed to approve the holding of a Conference of Lay Supplies in the Kamloops-Okanagan Presbytery and to vote a grant up to \$150 toward expenses.

Niagara Presbytery, Survey

With regard to request of Presbytery for a grant of \$300 towards cost of house-to-house surveys, to be conducted by the Commission on the Industrial Parish, it was agreed to vote a grant up to \$150, if needed, with the understanding that the Secretaries are authorized, in consultation with the Superintendent of Missions, to increase the amount, if necessary.

Hospital Work

1. Archer Memorial Hospital, Lamont, Alberta: Dr. Macdonald referred to the part played by the doctors and nursing staff in connection with the tragic railway-crossing accident which occurred in the vicinity of the Hospital. The Secretaries were instructed to have a resolution of appreciation prepared, to be placed on the Minutes of the forthcoming annual meeting of the Board.

2. Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital: The Secretaries were authorized to approach the Rev. O. B. Strapp, with the idea of his assisting for a period of five months, February to June, in the administration and office work of the Hospital, thus relieving the Medical Superintendent until a permanent assistant could be appointed. It was understood that if the Medical Services Fund was unable to assume full cost of salary, this Board would contribute the amount necessary to build salary up to that of a married ordained minister.

3. Hospital Co-ordinator: An increase of \$150 per year was authorized in the salary of Dr. George E. Darby, from January 1st, 1961.

Indian Work

1. Edmonton Residential School: (a) Due to the retirement of the Rev. O. B. Strapp from the principalship at December 31st, it was agreed that Mr. A. E. Caldwell be appointed Acting Principal of the School for the six months—January-June.

(b) Banking Authority: Mr. A. E. Caldwell was authorized to transact business with the Bank on behalf of the School, to implement which the following resolution was adopted:

Be It Resolved: That Mr. A. E. Caldwell, Principal, is hereby authorized for and in the name of the Edmonton Indian Residential School, Edmonton, Alberta, to sign cheques upon The Imperial Bank of Canada, Edmonton, Alberta, on behalf of the said School; and from time to time to borrow money from the said Bank, either by overdrawing the account or otherwise, the said borrowing at no time to exceed the sum of Eight Thousand (\$8,000) Dollars;

Also That the said A. E. Caldwell be and is hereby authorized on behalf of the said School to deposit with, or transfer to the said Bank (but for credit of the said School account only) all or any Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, cheques or orders for the payment of money and other negotiable paper, and for the said purpose to endorse the same or any of them on behalf of the said School, provided that nothing in this authority shall be interpreted to entitle the drawer or signer of such Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes and negotiable paper to discount the same or to deposit the same otherwise than for collection purposes with the said Bank;

Also, from time to time to arrange, settle, balance and certify all books of account between the said School and the Bank and to receive all paid cheques and vouchers and to sign the Bank's form of settlement of balances and release; And That all other powers heretofore given in this matter be and are hereby revoked.

(c) Authority was given for transfer of the Church Trust Account to the Advisory Committee of Presbytery.

2. Norway House Presbytery: A grant up to \$500 was voted towards travelling expenses of members attending the meeting of the Presbytery.

3. Travel expenses, Rev. Wm. Robinson: Agreed to authorize payment of travelling expenses of Mr. Robinson, Klemtu to Vancouver and return (approx. \$85), for attendance at Vancouver Young People's Conference.

Institutional Missions

MINUTES

January 17, 1961

The Interim-Sub-Executive met in the office of the Secretary of the Board at 1:00 p.m., on Tuesday, January 17th.

The Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, E. E. M. Joblin, George M. Morrison, Emerson G. Knowles, Mr. Ralph S. Mills and Mr. E. D. Kingsbury.

Rev. E. E. M. Joblin was appointed Minute Secretary.

Letters of Sympathy

Dr. Macdonald referred to the death a few days before of the Rev. J. U. Tanner, D.D., for many years Superintendent of Home Missions for the Montreal and Ottawa Conference. The Secretary was requested to write, expressing the sympathy of the Board to Mrs. Tanner and the members of the family.

It was requested, also, that a letter of sympathy be sent to the Rev. R. J. Scott of St. Luke's Church, Toronto, on the death of Mrs. Scott, and to the Rev. Wm. L. Howie on the death of his father, Mr. Wm. Howie, lay supply at Waskatenau, Alberta.

Superintendents' Office Expenses

It was decided that the Board should pay 50 per cent of service charges, up to \$40—on telephones of four Superintendents who provide office facilities in their homes.

Institutional Missions and Non-Anglo-Saxon Work

1. Toronto, Queen Street-Church of All Nations: It was decided: (a) to refer to the meeting of the Board for consideration of proposed re-arrangement of work in the two centres; and (b) to request Rev. (2) Re Matron: The resignation of Miss Joyce Fennell as Matron was accepted and the appointment of Miss Vera Lyon as her successor was confirmed; and it was requested that the Secretary send a letter of appreciation for her services to Miss Fennell.

(3) Re Medical Service Fund: In order to relieve any temporary embarrassment which might be caused by the present state of the Medical Services Fund, it was agreed to authorize the advance of a short-term loan of \$1,500, if necessary, and to provide for an overdraft up to \$2,000 in the account of the Medical Services Fund carried at the Royal Bank of Canada, Prince Rupert, to implement which the following resolution was adopted:

Be It Resolved: That John D. Murdoch, R. Bruce Palmer, M.D., and William Davies, or any two of them, be and are hereby authorized for and in the name of the United Church Medical Services Fund from time to time to borrow money from The Royal Bank of Canada, Prince Rupert, B.C., either by overdrawing the account or otherwise, the said borrowing at no time to exceed the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars.

(4) Moving Expenses: It was agreed that the Board should care for the moving expenses of Dr. Douglas Archibald from Halifax, with the understanding that Dr. Palmer's moving expenses from Hazelton would be the responsibility of the Hospital.

(5) Re return expenses to Scotland, Dr. G. M. Robb: It was decided that the Hospital had already fulfilled its obligation with regard to travelling and moving expenses incurred by Dr. Robb in connection with his return to Scotland and that no further payment should be authorized.

Wrinch Memorial Hospital, Hazelton

(1) The appointment of Miss Rhena Gardiner as Matron, succeeding Miss Vera Lyon, was approved.

(2) Dr. Macdonald read a communication from the Rev. H. W. Boyd, Chairman of the Hospital Board, and also his letter to Mr. Boyd in reply, which latter was approved.

(2) It was agreed to pay 50%, up to \$500, to assist with moving expenses of Rev. O. B. Strapp from Edmonton to Colpoys Bay.

Superintendency of Missions

With reference to the retirement of Dr. J. I. MacKay from the superintendency of Home Missions at June 30th, the Secretary was authorized to attend a joint meeting of representatives of the Executive of Toronto Conference and the Conference Home Mission Committee, and, in accordance with the instructions of The Manual consult with these bodies in reference to the appointment of a successor.

Rural Work

It was agreed, without prejudice to future policy, to make available \$100 of the grant of \$150 for Rural Work Conferences (not used in 1960) for four lay supplies in Rev. H. M. Bailey's superintendency to take a two weeks' residential course at Five Oaks for the training of lay supplies.

Education Grant

The payment of education grant for the Fall term of 1960, only, to Rev. R. A. Rose, retired minister without charge, was authorized.

Insurance of Properties

Bella Bella, The R. W. Large Memorial Hospital: Agreed to increase total fire insurance from \$230,000 to \$245,000.

Church Extension

Policy re Portable Churches: Review of policy was referred to the annual Conference of Secretaries and Superintendents.

MONCTON

Moncton, Mountainview Church—Agreed to give the following assistance, on condition that congregation have \$20,000 on hand:

- (a) Manse: Loan of \$3,000 to congregation repayable in five years, interest at 4½%.
- (b) Presbytery Church Extension Council: Loan of \$6,000 to Council, earmarked for Mountainview, repayable in two years, interest 4½%.
- (c) Manse Furnishings: Grant up to \$750.

MIDDLESEX

Middlesex Presbytery, Portable Church—Agreed to provide portable church for Middlesex Presbytery, to be used first at Fairmount, London; terms to be decided by the Board after policy decided upon.

Property

QUEBEC-SHERBROOKE

Quebec, St. John's Hall-Agreed to confirm payment of \$2,000 for repairs to end wall and rewiring and replacing fixtures.

NORWAY HOUSE

Island Lake, Manse—Request for grant of \$8,500 to complete and repair the manse was referred to the meeting of the Executive.

Gods' Lake Narrows, Manse—Request for grant of \$15,000 to repair manse was deferred to the meeting of the Board.

Little Grand Rapids, Log Manse—Agreed to vote grant of \$2,150 towards cost of manse, in addition to \$200 already voted for logs.

Nelson House, Church Hall—Agreed that an amount of \$25,000 be included in Special Projects and that a loan of \$10,000 be made to the George McMillan Memorial Fund from Property Fund, to be repaid by December 31st, 1962.

WINNIPEG

Winnipeg, Sparling Church—Agreed to vote loan of \$18,225 from the Grace Church Fund, to be repaid—\$4,555 on December 31st, 1961, and \$6,835 on December 31st, 1962 and 1963, with interest at 4%.

PEACE RIVER

Fort Nelson, B.C.—Agreed to vote grant of \$3,500 for purchase of trailer, and to authorize payment of \$50 per month ground rent.

VANCOUVER-BURRARD

Vancouver, 1177 Connaught Drive—Agreed to vote grant of \$25.82 for purchase of new venetian blind and repairs to present blinds.

Maintenance

QUEBEC-SHERBROOKE

St. John's Hall—Payment of a special grant of \$300 for 1960 towards deficit in budget was authorized.

ALGOMA

Gordon Lake—Agreed that grant for MLS be as follows: (a) for the month of December only at full salary, plus travel at \$670 and house allowance at \$300; and (b) from January 1st at \$1,500 on salary, plus travel and house allowance.

KENORA-RAINY RIVER

Sandy Lake—Advance payment for the following to be shipped to Sandy Lake was authorized: (a) four cylinders of propane at approximately \$13 each, including freight; (b) five drums of fuel oil at \$9 each, plus freight charges of \$129.40; (c) deposit on containers at \$30 per cylinder and \$12 per drum—total \$180.

YORKTON NORTH

Canora and District, Ukrainian—Agreed to increase in salary grant to \$2,320 for ordained supply who was married October 8th.

Edmonton

Waskatenau—Agreed to approve request that the widow of the late Mr. Wm. Howie serve as lay supply from January 1st and that grant be continued at same rate for six months.

VICTORIA

Cordova Bay—Agreed to vote grant up to \$280 for manse furnishings.

INTERIM-EXECUTIVE OF THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

MINUTES

February 2nd, 1961

The Interim-Executive of the Board of Home Missions met in Committee Room 712, The United Church House, Toronto, at 9:30 a.m., Thursday, February 2nd, 1961. The Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, E. E. M. Joblin, George M. Morrison, Emerson G. Knowles, R. Douglas Smith, H. G. Lester, H. M. Denning; Messrs. Arthur H. Webster, E. D. Kingsbury and J. W. Frid. Mr. Hugh D. Campbell and Rev. R. J. Shorten sat as corresponding members.

Regrets were received from Mr. Ralph S. Mills.

Rev. E. E. M. Joblin was appointed Minute Secretary.

Communications

Letters were received from Mrs. J. U. Tanner, Rev. R. J. Scott and Rev. Wm. Howie, expressing appreciation of sympathy in bereavement extended on behalf of the Board of Home Missions.

Institutional Missions

1. Yarmouth Town Mission: A grant up to \$150 was authorized, to enable the Superintendent to give assistance in cases of special need.

2. St. John's Hall, Quebec City: Agreed to authorize an advance up to \$500 on the 1961 budget, if urgently needed.

3. Queen Street-Church of All Nations, Toronto: A parking allowance at the rate of \$60 a year was authorized for Dr. L. Pokoly and Rev. R. Hepolehto, and also for Rev. H. R. Ashford during the remaining period of his superintendency.

4. Lakehead, Finnish Work: Agreed to approve in principle the suggestion of purchasing a large house, which would provide living accommodation and facilities for the Rev. G. A. Koponen, and to refer to the Secretaries, in consultation with the Superintendent of Missions, the implementation of this proposal.

5. Salary Scale, Superintendents of Institutions: It was agreed that for 1960, salaries of Superintendents of Institutional Missions be supplemented in the three categories as decided upon by the Executive at its meeting in February, 1960: namely, that \$400 additional be paid to those in the top category; \$200 additional to those in the second category; and \$100 additional to those in the third category. 1. Rev. F. J. Douglas, Director of Church Extension, Winnipeg: Agreed to authorize increase in salary for 1961 to conform to that of a Superintendent of Missions.

2. Rev. W. E. McDowell, Director of Church Extension, Montreal and Ottawa areas: An increase of \$150 in salary was authorized for 1961.

3. Rev. J. A. Lyttle, Church Extension Work, Northern Ontario: Agreed to increase of \$75 for 1961 in salary paid by Board on part-time basis.

Indian Work

Edmonton Residential School: Agreed (a) to confirm purchase of station wagon for school use at cost of \$2,950, paid from School Trust Fund; and (b) to authorize expenditure up to \$500 from School Trust Fund for purchase of piano for school use.

Group Accident Insurance

It was left to the Secretaries to recommend to the annual meeting of the Board a ruling to cover any eligible persons who have refused to participate in the Group Personal Accident Insurance plan because of the requirement of an annual payment of \$20; such persons, in the meantime, to be kept fully covered.

Moving Expenses

1. It was agreed to refer to the Conference of Secretaries and Superintendents, for recommendation to the Board, the question of the Board's responsibility for moving expenses of married students to fields adjacent to college centres, in order that they may attend college.

2. Re moving expenses of Mr. Douglas A. Soles from British Columbia to Pelly, Sask.—\$106.60—Agreed that this be referred to Conference of Secretaries and Superintendents for recommendation to the Board.

McGeachy Trust

It was agreed that \$1,800 allotted by the Trustees of St. Andrew's Church, Chatham, from McGeachy Trust funds, for a Home Mission project should be used for the payment of scholarships which are to be provided by the Board of Home Missions for student nurses training at the Archer Memorial Hospital School of Nursing, Lamont, Alberta.

Hospital Work

1. Appointment of Medical Students: (a) The Secretaries were authorized to make the appointments of medical students to summer internships in Home Mission hospitals; the Board being responsible for travelling expenses and the Hospital paying salary of \$200 a month and providing room and board.

(b) In the case of Archer Memorial Hospital, Lamont, Alberta, as the regulations of the Provincial Department of Health set the maximum salary which may be paid to a medical student, it was agreed that this Board would make up any discrepancy between the salary authorized and \$200 a month.

2. Scholarships for Student Nurses: It was agreed that Item (c) (ii) under this heading, adopted by the Interim-Executive at its meeting October 26th, 1960, should be revised to read: "That consideration be given, also, to the provision of assistance to the extent of \$100.00 to students who may wish to improve their educational standing to enable them to meet the standards required in Alberta and so make it possible for them to enter the Archer Memorial School of Nursing."

Oriental Work

Payment of \$34.80 to Rev. Thos. Choy, who conducted a survey of Chinese in the Lakehead area, was confirmed.

Muskoka United Charge

It was reported that Rev. John W. Wilkinson had resigned from the Muskoka United Charge at January 15th. It was agreed that the Secretaries should consult with the Chairman of Settlement Committee, and , with Presbytery if necessary, regarding the matter of a successor.

Licence to Administer Sacraments

The recommendation of Comox-Nanaimo Presbytery that a licence to administer the Sacraments be granted to Mr. F. E. Kempling, lay supply at Alberni, was referred to the meeting of the Board.

Hospital Chaplaincies

1. In connection with the appointment of hospital chaplains in consultation with the Board of Colleges and Secondary Schools, as recommended by the General Council, and the suggestion of the Executive of our Board at its meeting on October 26th that pilot projects be established in four major cities, it was decided, in the light of increased interest manifested in the larger cities, to recommend to the Executive of General Council that the Board be authorized to undertake up to eight projects, on the understanding that this Board would underwrite half the cost of salary and maintenance in each case and that the local Presbytery or City Council would be responsible for the other half.

2. Toronto, Sick Children's Hospital: Dr. Macdonald reported that a proposal—arising from the meeting of the Long Range Planning Committee—for the appointment of a Protestant Chaplain would be presented to the Executive of General Council. The suggested basis for financing this chaplaincy would be as follows: The Toronto Home Missions Council would pay the equivalent of what it now pays for a part-time Chaplain (at least \$1,200 a year), and the Board of Colleges and the Board of Home Missions would pay the balance on a fifty-fifty basis. It was agreed to approve this suggestion.

Special Grants for 1960

It was agreed:

1. That the Secretaries be authorized to deal with special grants on salary and/or travel for 1960, with the understanding that exceptional cases be reported to the Board for action.

2. That special grants be voted for salary and/or travel in accordance with the resolution adopted by the Board and recorded on pages 133-34 of the 1960 Digest of Minutes.

3. That any requests for special grants on salary and/or travel to be paid out of the 1960 appropriation be in the hands of the Secretaries not later than June 30th.

(List of special grants paid for 1960 is appended).

Church Extension

ST. JOHN'S

St. John's Presbytery Church Extension Council, Assistance for St. James-Agreed to extend repayment period from three to five years on loan of \$10,000 previously voted to Council (\$5,000 to be repaid by Wesley and \$5,000 by Gower Street Churches); first instalment to be due December 31st, 1962.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

Charlottetown Area, Portable Church-Agreed to confirm payment of \$2,790 in excess of \$18,000 previously voted.

OSHAWA

Oshawa, Westminster, Emergency Loan—Agreed to defer payment of instalments of \$5,000 on principal due December 31st, 1960 and 1961, to December 31st, 1961 and 1962, and to request that interest be paid.

TORONTO WEST

Toronto Home Missions Council, Emergency Loan for Elverston Park

-It was agreed that, as loan was not required until August, 1960, first repayment on principal should be advanced to December 31st, 1961.

PRINCE ALBERT

Prince Albert, Nisbet Memorial (East End), Christian Education Wing—Agreed to vote grant of \$1,500 and loan of \$2,000, repayable in five years, on the understanding that a campaign be conducted by Mr. Walter Thomson, Fund-Raising Director.

REGINA

Regina, Portable Churches (at Whitmore Park and Wesley).__Agreed to confirm payment of \$40 re installation of doors required by Fire Inspector.

Regina, Portable Church (at Whitmore Park)—Agreed to confirm payment of \$250, in excess of \$17,000 previously voted.

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SASKATOON

Saskatoon, Trinity (St. David's-Cory), formerly Montgomery Place --Grant of \$794.85 was voted for purchase of church site.

VANCOUVER-WESTMINSTER

Vancouver-Westminster Metropolitan Council for Church Extension —(a) At the suggestion of the Rev. R. M. Warne, it was agreed, subject to approval of the Council, to vote a grant of \$10,000 to the Council, to take the form of assistance for the initiation of new Church Extension causes.

(b) The Executive felt that there was need for consultation with representatives of the Metropolitan Council and recommended that the Chairman of the Council be invited to come to Toronto at the time of the annual meeting of the National Committee on Church Extension, so that the Secretaries might confer with him, the British Columbia Superintendents of Missions and other interested persons.

Property

BURIN

Fortune, Manse—Agreed to vote grant of \$1,500 and loan of \$1,500; loan repayable in five years at $4\frac{1}{2}$ %.

FREDERICTON

Oromocto, Church—Agreed to revise terms of payment on loan of \$15,000, voted by Sub-Executive in December, so that first repayment will become due December 31st, 1962.

TORONTO CENTRE

Toronto, 92 Binswood Ave.—Payment of \$23.50 for new motor for furnace, plus cost of labour, was confirmed.

NORWAY HOUSE

Island Lake, Manse—Agreed to refer to Board request for grant up to \$8,500 for rehabilitation of manse.

Nelson House, Church Hall—The Sub-Executive in January directed that \$25,000 be included in Special Projects for this hall. In view, however, of the fact that there is no possibility that this amount can be taken from Projects in 1961, it was agreed that it be paid from Church Extension account, this being in harmony with the policy requested by the Manitoba Conference, namely, that amounts raised in the Conference for such northern work as the Indian and Frontier be regarded as Church Extension.

Nelson House, Manse---Payment of \$30.10 to cover cost of new motor and express charges was confirmed.

SUPERIOR

Fort William, Broadway Church—Agreed to vote grant of \$5,000 and loan of \$7,500, on the understanding that Superior Presbytery Church Extension Council will underwrite an additional \$12,500; repayment terms of the loan from the Board to be determined by the Secretaries in consultation with the Superintendent of Missions.

Nipigon, Church—Re request for increase in grant and loan (voted by Executive, February 1960) to \$7,650 and \$12,750, respectively: It was agreed that grant should remain at \$6,000 and that loan be increased to \$12,000, repayable in ten years; first payment to be made December 31st, 1963.

ARCOLA-ESTEVAN

Midale, Manse—Request for grant of \$3,000 and loan of \$5,000 was referred to the Secretaries, with power, in consultation with the Superintendent of Missions.

REGINA

Bamfield, Manse and Engineer's House—Agreed to vote grant up to \$1,500 for construction of new float.

FRASER

North Surrey, Oak Avenue, Manse-Agreed to vote grant of \$3,000 and loan of \$2,700 for purchase of house; loan repayable in ten years.

PRINCE RUPERT

Bella Bella, Manse-Agreed to confirm payment of \$120 for new unit for furnace.

VANCOUVER

Deep Cove, Manse-Loan having been paid off prior to due date, it was agreed to comply with request for cancellation of interest of \$65.27 due December 31st, 1960.

Charlottetown, Spring Park—Agreed: (a) to vote a special grant of \$600 for 1960 and that the congregation retain all of the offerings to apply on local expenses; (b) to direct that this be set up as an institutional mission and that a budget be provided for 1961; and (c) that a letter of appreciation be sent to Trinity United Church, Charlottetown, for the fine part it played in the establishment of the work in the Spring Park area.

YORKTON NORTH

Canora and District Ukrainian—Agreed to approve rental grant at \$720 for ordained supply who was married October 8th, 1960.

FRASER

Royal Heights-Agreed to vote special grant of \$600 for 1960 re deficit on salary.

KAMLOOPS-OKANAGAN

Lumby—Agreed to vote rental grant at rate of 65 per month for MLS.

KOOTENAY

Fernie-Agreed to vote special grant of \$400 to apply on 1960 salary account.

INTERIM-SUB-EXECUTIVE OF THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS

MINUTES .

March 10, 1961

The Interim-Sub-Executive of the Board of Home Missions met in the office of the Secretary at 9:30 a.m., on Friday, March 10th. The Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer.

Present: Revs. W. M. Mustard, M. C. Macdonald, J. R. Leng, Emerson G. Knowles, Messrs. Ralph S. Mills and E. D. Kingsbury.

It was stated that Rev. E. E. M. Joblin and Rev. G. M. Morrison were unavoidably absent, being out of the city on Home Mission business.

Chaplaincy, Waterfront Community Centre, Toronto

Dr. Macdonald reported on the project in connection with the Waterfront Community Centre, supported by the Toronto Harbour Commission, which would involve the appointment of Chaplains of various Churches to serve the seamen who will visit the Toronto Harbour during the open season. This Board has been asked to share in the project, which would involve the part-time services of a United Church minister.

The suggestion was approved that this service might be carried out by a student for the months of May and June, and it was agreed to authorize the appointment of a chaplain on a part-time basis for the balance of the term; the Secretaries to negotiate with Dr. Herman Campbell, who will be retiring as Superintendent of Brunswick St. Church at June 30th and will be living in Toronto for a year, with the idea of his undertaking the duties of chaplain.

Approval was given, also, to the proposal that, in addition, Dr. Campbell might undertake the supervisory duties at the Church of All Nations.

Illness of Mr. Louis Foisy-Foley

The Sub-Executive expressed sincere regret on receiving the information that Mr. Foisey-Foley, who directs special French Work in Montreal Presbytery, had suffered a heart attack. It was agreed that salary be continued until the meeting of the Board, when necessary further action will be taken.

Education Grant

It was agreed that education grant should be paid to the Rev. Charles Rennie, Lion's Head, Ont., whose son, in order to take Grade 13, has to live away from home, with the understanding that payment for this school year would count as one of the four years for which the grant is available.

Maintenance

TEMISKAMING PRESBYTERY

Larder Lake—Agreed to vote grant of \$50 per month for four months (March-June) for retired supply during illness of minister.

SUDBURY PRESBYTERY

Sudbury, All People's-Agreed to vote grant at rate of \$3,000 to June 30th only, after which charge will be self-supporting.

Property

ALGOMA PRESBYTERY

Sault Ste. Marie, All People's Mission-Action was taken as follows:

(1) The appointment of Rounthwaite and Fairfield as Architects for the new building was approved, with the understanding that there be consultation with the Board of Home Missions.

(2) It was recommended that the local Committee should for the time being advertise sale of the present property in the local papers only; that at present no advertising should be done outside the city of Sault Ste. Marie, but that instead letters should be sent to possible interested purchasers, such as Loblaw's, Dominion Stores, Red and White Stores, and any other large business concerns which, in the judgment of the Committee, might be interested; report to be made to the Board of Home Missions.

(3) It was recommended that, since arbitration might be involved, the possibility of employing a Real Estate Broker or some other agent, whose speciality is arbitration, should be explored; it was also deemed advisable to secure the services of an appraiser, preferably in the city of Sault Ste. Marie, failing which a competent person might be sent from Toronto.

Church Extension

Halifax Presbytery, Portable Church—It was agreed to assure the Presbytery that a portable church would be made available (which would be the property of the Board of Home Missions), to be used first by Cole Harbour Congregation; terms to be determined by the Board at its annual meeting.

Church Extension Board of Halifax Presbytery—It was agreed: (a) to make available a grant of \$15,000 over a three-year period, one-half of which would be paid in 1961 and the balance in equal instalments of \$3,750 in 1962 and 1963; and (b), if urgently needed, to authorize a loan of \$10,000, to be repaid over a two-year period, with interest at $4\frac{1}{2}$ %.

Prince Albert, Nisbet Memorial, Christian Education Wing-Agreed to approve payment of second half (\$2,000) of loan voted, pending receipt of Certificate of Release.

- 3. That the amount for Sunday supply shall not exceed \$20 per Sunday.
- 4. That members from points east of Truro, N.S., and from points west of the Head of the Lakes, who travel by air, shall be allowed expenses on the basis of tourist air rate.

Superintendencies of Missions

Dr. Macdonald made a brief statement with regard to the retirement of Rev. Dr. J. I. MacKay as Co-Superintendent of Missions for the Toronto, York and Simcoe Presbyteries, and of the resignation of Rev. Dr. Gordon W. Porter as Superintendent of Missions of the Bay of Quinte Conference.

Immigration

A brief statement on the Immigration Work of the Church was made by Dr. J. R. Leng.

The following recommendations were adopted:

- (a) That the editing of the pamphlet, "Welcome Leaflet for British Immigrants", and the advertising in Overseas papers be referred to a Committee, consisting of the Chairman and Secretaries of the Board.
- (b) That the salary of the Rev. Dr. A. S. Murray, Immigration Chaplain, Montreal, be \$4,150 for 1961.
- (c) That the total budget for Immigration Work be \$16,000. The Report as a whole was adopted

Report of Committee on French Work

The Report of the Committee was presented by Rev. K. G. MacMillan, who made a general statement on the French Work.

The following recommendations of the Committee were adopted:

- 1. That section 1 of the recommendations of the Commission on Evangelism in the French Language, dealing with l'Eglise St. Jean and l'Eglise Unie du Sauveur, as adopted by General Council, be drawn to the attention of the Inner City Commission of the Montreal Presbytery; and that sections 4 and 5, dealing with publications, radio and television, be left with Rev. George Morrison to discuss and investigate with the Secretary of the Board of Information and Stewardship. (See Record of Proceeding, 1960, pp. 224-225).
- 2. Re Pointe-aux-Trembles French Institute:
 - (a) That fees be increased to \$800 per year for French pupils and to \$900 for pupils attending the Institute who are not French.
 - (b) That the Local Board make every effort to secure, at least, the Family Allowance from those families who are unable to make any other payment to the School towards the cost of board.
 - (c) That the Local Board be asked to approach the Provincial Government for assistance.
 - (d) That the Alumni Association of the Institute be approached with the suggestion they undertake some definite financial responsibility towards the School and its pupils, and that the Superintendent and the Rev. R. Douglas Smith arrange to meet with representatives of the Alumni Association to discuss this matter.
 - (e) That \$1,000 be made available from the Super Gift Fund of the Board as a nucleus of a Bursary Fund, to be used to assist that special group of pupils who are unable to pay the cost of board.

Re Camp Matambin: The Rev. Jacques Beaudon outlined the existing situation. It was agreed that the following resolution be adopted;

That the Montreal Presbytery be asked to investigate the relationship which exists between the United Church and the Dorcas Society, Inc.; And, further, that it be suggested that if the Dorcas Society will relinquish its claim to the property, the Board may be disposed to cancel the outstanding indebtedness; but that if the Dorcas Society continues to claim ownership of the property, then the Board will have no alternative but to foreclose.

Re the French Forum: Rev. Jacques Beaudon made a brief statement regarding the work of the French Forum.

Re Mr. Louis Foisy-Foley: It was requested that greetings and best wishes for his complete recovery be extended to Mr. Foisy-Foley.

Bissell Bursary Fund and Other Bursaries

The Secretary reported as follows: At the meeting of the Trustees of the Bissell Bursary Fund in September last, 30 applications were considered. It was decided that no help would be given to students who had received a Bachelor of Arts degree and were proceeding to take postgraduate work, to married students, nor to those who had sufficient funds on hand to see them through the current academic year. Bursaries of \$75 each were awarded to eighteen students.

In addition, bursaries of \$75 each were awarded to two Newfoundland students from the Pitts Sustentation Fund; to one Ontario student from the Florence M. Thompson Bursary Fund; and to two British Columbia students from the Edith M. Wilson Estate.

The Report was received for information.

The Superintendents were asked as they cover their territories in the Spring to keep in mind prospective applicants for bursaries, in order to ensure as far as possible that applications may be received in good time for consideration at the meeting of the Committee in the fall.

The Secretaries were requested to express to Mrs. Bissell the sincere appreciation of the Board for her generous gift which has been of help to so many students over the years.

Report of Hospital Committee

The Report of the Committee was presented by the Rev. R. W. Henderson, and the following action was taken on its recommendations:

General Statement

Dr. G. E. Darby, Co-ordinator of Church Hospitals, gave a brief report on the work of the United Church hospitals.

Agreed that the Co-ordinator of Church Hospitals be asked to attend the meetings of the Hospital Committee and the Board each year.

Archer Memorial Hospital

1. Agreed that the Constitution of the Archer Memorial Hospital, as submitted, be adopted with minor amendment.

2. Agreed that a grant at the rate of \$1,200 per year be provided towards the salary of the Rev. Kathryn E. Hurlburt, Hospital Chaplain, retroactive to January 1st, 1961.

Queen Charlotte Islands General Hospital

Agreed to refer the proposed Constitution of this Hospital to the Executive of this Board for action, after suggested changes have been studied.

Wrinch Memorial Hospital

Agreed that the Conference Home Mission Convener be permitted to deputize the Convener of Prince Rupert Presbytery to attend the meetings of the Wrinch Memorial Hospital Board, with the understanding that the deputy be only a corresponding member of the Board.

Recommendations from Conference of Doctors, September 1960

1. Agreed to authorize holding of a Conference of Medical Superintendents in 1961 at Hazelton, the date to be determined later.

2. Agreed that no action is necessary with regard to the initiation of hospital care for the aged and chronically ill, as this matter is now under study by the Long Range Planning Committee.

3. Agreed that no action be taken at the present time with regard to the employment of a doctor on'a permanent relief basis, but that the matter be kept under study.

4. Agreed to refer back to the 1961 Conference of Doctors for clarification the recommendation that the employer's portion of medical insurance premiums for hospital employees be charged to the operating expenses of the Hospital, if not paid by the B.C.H.I.S.

5. Agreed to adopt the following resolution:

Whereas the present policy of the Board of Home Missions with regard to post-graduate training for its permanent staff physicians of allowing them to take six months' furlough at the end of five years' service—during which time the physicians stay on salary to their own Medical Services Fund and receive up to \$500 per year of service (i.e., \$2,500) as needed towards expenses of post-graduate work—is not suitable to the needs of all physicians;

Be It Resolved that it be permissible for such physicians, after two years' service, to take up to five weeks of short courses each year and be allowed up to \$500 a year for the expenses of such courses, it being understood that the timing be approved by the Board of Home Missions and that should a physician take his post-graduate work in this way, he would not be eligible for the six months' furlough at the end of five years;

And that it be further understood that at the desire of the physician and with the agreement of the Board of Home Missions, this post-graduate work may be taken after two, three or four years, allowing five weeks and up to \$500 expenses for each year of service.

Employees' Retirement Plan

Dr. G. E. Darby and Dr. H. G. Tuttle made statements regarding the relationship of the Lay Employees' Retirement Plan to the B.C. Government Hospital Superannuation Scheme.

It was agreed that this Board ask the Department of Pensions to seek from the Executive of General Council its judgment concerning the following recommendations:

- 1. That the Constitution of the Lay Employees' Retirement Plan be amended to permit employees of the hospitals, who are under Plan B, and who elect to change to the Government plan, to obtain a refund of their payments as if they were severing their employment; also that a refund of payments made by the Board of Home Missions as employer be permitted.
- 2. That employees covered by the Lay Employees' Retirement Plan in other Provinces who wish to work in one of our British Columbia Hospitals be allowed, if they elect the privilege, to rest their credits so that there will be no loss should they change to other Church work in British Columbia or leave the Province for Church work elsewhere.

It was agreed, also, that we inform the Hospitals that we are seeking such judgment.

Port Hardy, B.C.

Agreed that no action be taken at present re tentative equiry as to the possibility of the Board's operating a hospital at Port Hardy.

(c) Lines of Credit: Agreed that lines of credit be approved as follows: Brandon \$4,000; Norway House \$8,000; Morley \$4,000; Edmonton \$8,000; Alberni \$12,000.

7. Indian Work Conferences:

- (a) National Fellowship of Indian Workers Conferences, Estes Park, Colorado, July 12th-17th, 1961: Agreed to provide grant up to \$800 to send three delegates in addition to Mr. Joblin.
- (b) Conference of Indian Workers, British Columbia Conference, 1962: Agreed to give high priority to request for grant for this Conference in 1962.
- (c) Annual Conference at Five Oaks, Paris, Ontario: Agreed to vote grant of \$250.
- (d) Norway House Presbytery, Bible School: Agreed that, if funds permit, to approve grant of \$1,600 and to request The Woman's Missionary Society to share in the cost.

8. Recommendation of Manitoba Conference H.M. Committee re Instalment Payments: Agreed that, where purchases of supplies by ministers or lay supplies serving churches in Indian communities involve large expenditures of money once or twice a year, the Board of Home Missions advance the necessary funds to the minister or lay supply, deducting equal monthly amounts for repayment with: (i) 10 instalments for supplies lasting one year; and (ii) 5 instalments for supplies lasting six months.

Agreed, further, that regulations be adopted as follows:

(1) For each purchase of supplies for which an advance is desired, the applicant must: (a) furnish the Board of Home Missions with the original copy of the invoice; (b) sign an Agreement to Repay, authorizing the Board of Home Missions to make monthly deductions from his salary cheques.

- (2) The privilege of obtaining such advances, with instalment repayments, can only be claimed by ministers and lay supplies serving Indian communities in isolated areas.
- (3) "Supplies" shall mean commodities such as groceries, gasoline, fuel oil, kerosene, propane gas, and wood, and shall not include equipment or other commodities for which the minister or lay supply can make his own private arrangements for financing.
- (4) The Agreement to Repay shall specify:
 - (a) The amount of monthly deductions to be made;
 - (b) The months in which the deductions will be made;
 - (c) In the event of the 5 or 10 instalments extending beyond the end of the calendar year, the Board of Home Missions will be authorized to reduce the number of payments to keep within the calendar year:
 - (d) In the event of a minister or lay supply completing his term of service on June 30th,
 - (i) any balance due on grocery purchases would be due as of June 30th;
 - (ii) any balance due on fuel for motors, light or heat, would be assumed by his successor, after an appraisal of value had been made by an impartial third party;
 - (e) In the event of the minister or lay supply terminating his term of service other than at June 30th, all unpaid balances would be due for payment as of the date of termination of service.
 - (f) In the case of a commodity such as fuel for light or power for both church and manse, the Board of Home Missions shall collect the full cost from the minister or lay supply, in instalments, and he, in turn, shall receive a fair reimbursement from the congregation for the portion used for the church.
 - (g) The amount to be advanced to be limited as follows: the monthly deduction for repayment to be not more than one-half of the monthly grant for salary.

9. Isolation Breaks: Re recommendation of Manitoba Conference Home Mission Committee that Board authorize grants totalling \$2,750 per year to enable missionaries and their families to fly out to a nearby town or city at least twice during the year: Agreed that this be referred to the Board for future study.

10. Supervisor of Indian Missions: Re recommendation of Manitoba Conference H.M. Committee for "the immediate appointment of a Supervisor of Indian Missions": Agreed that no action be taken but that a careful study be continued by the Board, in consultation with the Superintendent of Missions for Manitoba. 11. Travel to Presbytery Meetings: Manitoba Conference H.M. Committee requested that the Board assume full travel costs for delegates to Presbytery meetings from Northern Indian Missions in view of proposed changes in Presbytery bounds: Agreed that, in the event of a division of the charges of Norway House Presbytery among Kenora-Rainy River, Winnipeg and Hudson Bay Presbyteries, the Board pay travel expenses of delegates from isolated Indian fields, (a) to two meetings of Presbytery each year in Kenora-Rainy River and Hudson Bay Presbyteries, and (b) for Winnipeg Presbytery, expenses above the normal travel rates for two meetings per year; it being understood that this arrangement does not involve the Board in expenses at the time of the annual meeting of Manitoba Conference.

12. Re resolution of B.C. Conference, May, 1960, with regard to education in the *problems of beverage alcohol* among Indian peoples: Agreed that the matter be referred back to the Conference, with assurance of support from this Board.

13. Bella Coola, Kindergarten Teacher: Agreed to accede to request of B.C. Conference Home Mission Committee that the Board make available, if necessary, a grant to bring salary of Kindergarten Teacher, who will assist in church work, up to Board's minimum scale, with the hope that the W.M.S. will share in this.

14. Sarnia and Kettle Point Indian Reserves: Agreed to approve the recommendation of the London Conference Home Mission Committee that the agreement made with the Anglican Church in 1933 be abrogated; that we ask Lambton Presbytery to investigate the situation on the Kettle Point Reserve with a view to recommending a course of action to our Board or its Executive; and that appreciation be expressed to the Bishop of Huron.

15. Summer Supply, Isolated Communities: Agreed to vote a grant up to \$200 for summer supply of isolated communities in the Manitoba Conference.

16. Native Indian Service Council, Vancouver: Agreed to vote grant of \$300.

17. Indian-Eskimo Association: Agreed to vote grant of \$250 and to approve payment of membership fee of \$25.

18. Klemtu Indian Mission: Agreed that a letter of appreciation be sent to this congregation on the recent dedication of their new church.

Oriental Work

1. Manitoba Japanese: Agreed that no action be taken re enquiry of Rev. Cam. Furuya as to the possibility of his being given a special grant which would enable him to return to Japan for a visit every four or five years. 2. Chinese Work, Appointments or Nominations: Agreed that appointments to Chinese Work in Ottawa, Hamilton, Calgary, Moose Jaw and Winnipeg be referred to the Secretaries and the Superintendents concerned.

3. Appointments under W.M.S.: Agreed that Miss Mildred Mossop be appointed to the Chinese work in Toronto, and that appointments to Saskatoon and area, Chinese, and Kamloops-Okanagan, Japanese, be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendents concerned.

Marine Work

1. Tahsis Inlet: Agreed (a) that Mr. Virgil Plager, ordinand, be nominated to the Settlement Committee of the British Columbia Conference for appointment to this charge, subject to the action of the Transfer Committee; and (b) that we record our appreciation of the services of Rev. W. L. Howie, covering a period of five years, first at Bamfield and then at Tahsis.

2. Re Recommendations of Conference on Marine Planning: Agreed that action be taken as follows:

- (a) Port Hardy: That a resident ordained minister be stationed in the Port Hardy area and that a house there be rented and furnished.
- (b) Mission Boat, "George H. Raley": That this boat be sold, on the understanding that the name cannot be used by the purchaser.
- (c) Mission Boat, "Robert C. Scott": That this boat be moved from Alert Bay to Tahsis and operated in Nootka Sound as a one-man boat, the minister to be authorized to employ occasional help as required for maintenance.
- (d) Alert Bay: That the engineer's house be retained.
- (e) That it is desirable to employ men in marine work who have had some pastoral experience.
- (f) That before 1963, study be given to the possibility of serving all isolated points on the west coast of Vancouver Island by aircraft and that if this is proven feasible, the "Melvin Swartout" be then sold or transferred.
- (g) That revenue from the sale of the "George H. Raley" and from the possible sale of the "Robert C. Scott" and the "Melvin Swartout" be held in trust to provide for the future care of the work of the area presently covered by the "Thomas Crosby IV."
- (h) That conversations be begun with The Anglican Church of Canada, through the Superintendent of the Columbia Coast Mission and the Bishop of Caledonia, to enquire into possible co-operation in service in the Alert Bay area and the vicinity of the Skeena Mouth.

- (i) That if and when the "Robert C. Scott" is moved from Alert Bay to Tahsis, the rental rate of the engineer's house at Alert Bay be increased from \$35 to \$45 per month to Mr. H. M. Porteous.
- (j) That with the consent of the donors and with the provision of a supplementary grant of approximately \$200 from the Board of Home Missions, the "George H. Raley Radiophone Fund" (now approx. \$300) be used for the purchase of a movie projector for the Tahsis Inlet Marine Mission.

The following recommendations of the Conference on Marine Planning, to be dealt with by the Board in 1962, were reported for information:

- (a) "That a resident ordained minister be stationed at Ucluelet, that a house there be rented and furnished and that this minister serve Ucluelet, Ucluelet Indian village, Tofino and Tofino airport.
- (b) "That the mission boat 'Robert C. Scott' be sold, or:
 - (i) should aircraft prove inadequate returned to Alert Bay;
 - (ii) should another field be opened (e.g. Skeena Mouth), moved elsewhere.
- (c) "That the vessel 'Melvin Swartout', operating from Bamfield, serve all the isolated points on the west coast of Vancouver Island from Barclay Sound north to and including Nootka Sound.
- (d) "That the resident minister at Tahsis serve only Tahsis, Gold River and Zeballos, reaching these latter points by scheduled boat service and by water taxi."

3. Camp Fircom: Agreed that the new boat be named "Fircom III."

The Treasurer, the Rev. Dr. V. T. Mooney, addressed the Board. The Chairman expressed the Board's appreciation to Dr. Mooney.

It was agreed that the Rev. H. M. Bailey be the nomination of this Board to the Sub-Executive of General Council for appointment to the Commission re Relationship of certain Lay Workers to the Courts of the Church.

4. Dr. J. I. MacKay presented the Report of the Committee, the recommendations of which were considered item by item and action taken as follows:

Nominations and Appointments

1. Agreed that Rev. Arthur W. Verrall be nominated to the Settlement Committee as Superintendent of Brunswick Street Church, Halifax, from July 1st, subject to the action of the Transfer Committee; salary to be at the rate of \$3,900.

2. Agreed that Rev. Donald B. Atkinson be nominated to the Settlement Committee as Superintendent of United Mission, Sydney, from July 1st, subject to the action of the Transfer Committee; on mimimum salary scale.

3. Agreed that Rev. Herman E. Campbell, D.D., be appointed as Retired Supply for one year to Queen Street-Church of All Nations, Toronto, and Toronto Harbour Chaplaincy, from August 1st; his time to be divided between each.

4. Agreed that Rev. S. W. Pattison be designated as Superintendent of Wesley Church, Toronto, at his present salary.

5. Agreed that Mr. Marvin Pickering be appointed student assistant at First Church, Vancouver.

Requests for Appointments

1. Halifax, Brunswick Street: Agreed that we approve request for a lay worker for boys' work, preferably a single man.

2. Vancouver, First Church: Agreed that the appointment of an assistant minister be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions.

Appointment Women Workers under Board

1. Agreed that the appointment of a successor to Miss Dorothy Naylor at Saint John, Exmouth Street, be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions.

2. Agreed that Mrs. Colena Schatzley be appointed to Toronto, Wesley Church, from July 1st, at salary of \$3,300.

3. Agreed that the appointment of Matron and Assistant Matron to Toronto, Fred Victor Mission, be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions.

4. Agreed that the appointment of a successor to Miss Ruby Lough, Winnipeg, All People's Mission, be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions.

5. Agreed that the appointment of a successor to Miss Gladys Ansell, St. John's Hall, Quebec, be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions.

6. Agreed that Miss Elizabeth Marlin be appointed to Borderlands Pilot Project, Assiniboia Presbytery. 7. Agreed that Miss Shirley Munro be appointed as part-time worker to Telfordville Pilot Project, Edmonton Presbytery.

Appointments under W.M.S.

Montreal, Institutional Work

Rev. E. C. Armstrong, Superintendent of Montreal Central Mission, made a statement with regard to institutional mission work in Montreal, outlining for consideration proposals re future policy.

After discussion, the following resolution was adopted:

The Board of Home Missions, having heard with great interest the statement by Rev. E. C. Armstrong on the suggested project of building in Montreal a multiple storey building on a lease-back basis, amortized over a number of years, to house the City Mission, Eglise St. Jean French Work, and other United Church ministries or office responsibilities, recommends that a continued exploration and study be made of this challenging proposal by the Montreal Inner-City Commission, the Finance and Extension Board of Montreal Presbytery, the Montreal Presbytery, and finally the Board of Home Missions; and recommends, further, that when more complete and authentic data is secured as to costs, plan of financing, management, United Church agencies or Boards requiring space in such a building, and related matters, the final proposal be submitted to the Long Range Planning Committee which, in turn, will refer it to the Board of Finance, on the understanding that that Board will report its findings to the General Council or its Executive for any necessary action.

Toronto, Queen St.-Church of All Nations

Dr. J. I. MacKay made a statement with regard to the re-organization of the work. This was received for information.

Toronto, Fred Victor Mission

The Secretaries of the Board, Mr. Ralph S. Mills, Mr. E. D. Kingsbury and Dr. J. I. MacKay were appointed a committee to consider the enlargement of the Advisory Committee and the date of opening.

Work in Niagara Presbytery

1. Retirement of Rev. H. G. Forster, D.D.: The Resolutions Committee was requested to prepare a suitable resolution for incorporation in the Minutes of the Board.

2. Re Recommendations of Commission to Review Work of All People's Missions: Agreed that recommendations of the Commission be adopted as follows:

- (i) That the English-speaking congregations of the All People's Mission, and other congregations which might profitably be included, be constituted a Pastoral Charge as of July 1st, and that a pilot project in industrial evangelism be carried on within the organizational unity of the said Pastoral Charge.
- (ii) That the English-speaking congregations of Welland South, Maple Leaf, Thorold South, Port Colborne-All People's, plus Allanburg and Dain City be constituted a Pastoral Charge as of July 1st, 1961, and that before this is done, the Presbytery or committee thereof, visit the congregations involved.
- (iii) (a) That full-time language work among the Ukranian people be discontinued as of June 30th, 1961, and arrangements made for a part-time ministry among these people.

(b) That full-time language work among the Italian people be continued in Niagara Falls, and in such other areas as may in the future be determined by the Presbytery.

(c) That a full-time language ministry among the Hungarian people be continued in Niagara Falls, Welland and Port Colborne.

(d) That the language ministers be responsible directly to the Home Missions Committee of the Presbytery and the Superintendent of Home Missions.

(e) That where two or more congregations share the same building, the control over the use of the building and the cost of maintenance be shared by both congregations under the direction of a Property Committee consisting of equal representation from both congregations, and that the ministers concerned and the Superintendent of Home Missions be ex officio members of this Committee.

(f) That an effort be made to promote the closest cooperation

between the newly established Pastoral Charge and the work of the language ministers.

- (iv) That the staff of the new Pastoral Charge consist of two ordained ministers and one full-time lay supply.
- (v) That the Official Board of the new Pastoral Charge appoint an Executive Council consisting of:
 - (a) One lay representative of each congregation.
 - (b) One member of the Presbytery Committee on Home Missions.
 - (c) One member of the Presbytery Committee on Evangelism and Social Service.
 - (d) The Staff.
- (vi) That the Chairman of the Official Board of the new Pastoral Charge be the Chairman of the Executive Council, it being understood that the Executive Council is responsible to the Official Board.
- (vii) That the Chairman of the Official Board of the new Pastoral Charge be one of the ordained ministers on the staff as arranged between them (See Manual, sec. 110).
- (viii) That all the foregoing be subject to review by the Presbytery after two years.
 - (ix) That if the experiment commends itself to the Presbytery and to the Board of Home Missions, consideration be given to the transferring of Church property presently held by The United Church of Canada and administered by the Board of Home Missions to the congregations concerned.
 - (x) That the Home Missions Committee be requested to recommend grants for housing allowance at the rate of \$65 a month, beginning July 1st, 1961.
 - (xi) That the new Pastoral Charge be asked to pay the cost of telephone for the staff, and the cost of fuel for heating in excess of \$200 a year.
- (xii) That the Rev. Robert Wright be nominated to the Board of Evangelism and Social Service to attend the Industrial School of Religion at Luton, England, this summer.

3. Designation of Ministers: It was agreed that the ministers on this charge be designated as "Co-Pastors" and that the Settlement Committee be so informed.

4. Description of New Charge: Consideration was given to the choice of a term to describe the charge, and it was agreed that this be left to the Superintendent of Missions and Presbytery for decision.

5. Re Rev. A. Babiuk: Agreed that the relationship of Rev. A. Babiuk be referred to the Secretaries and Superintendent of Missions, who shall report to the Board or to the Executive.

Sudbury, All People's Mission

Agreed to approve the recommendation of Presbytery that this charge be constituted as a normal pastoral charge; that the congregation consider changing the name to one which is more suitable and descriptive of its type of ministry; that it become self-supporting as of January 1st, 1962; that Dr. Macdonald and the Superintendent of Missions meet with the interested parties before that time; and that the content of this resolution be conveyed to the congregation.

Hungarian Work, Southern Ontario

Agreed that the responsibility of Mr. Karolyfalvi be discontinued as at May 1st, 1961, that a Hungarian student be appointed, but that the Board continue to pay Mr. Karolfalvi's salary till June 30th, 1961, and also try to find some other work for him during the months of May and June.

Sault Ste. Marie, All People's Church

Agreed to authorize the Sub-Executive to issue in this matter if an urgent situation should arise.

Pointe-aux-Trembles French Institute

Agreed that the Board pay out of 1960 funds the deficit of \$2,904 incurred for 1960; also \$600 for heating and lighting the residence occupied by Rev. Carson Duquette.

Prince Rupert, Friendship House

Agreed that the Constitution of Friendship House, as submitted, be approved.

Vancouver, First Church

1. Resolution of Vancouver-Burrard Presbytery re salary of Superintendent: Agreed that no change can be made at the present time in the salary scale for Class A Institutions but that every effort be made by this Board to see that the contingent supplement is assured.

2. Communication from Vancouver-Burrard Presbytery re status of Rev. Adolph Welk: Agreed that Dr. Macdonald's reply to the Vancouver-Burrard Presbytery's communication be confirmed by this Board, and that the Board request a report from the Board of Colleges and Secondary Schools on Mr. Welk's academic and ministerial standing.

Bursaries for Visits to Institutional Centres

Agreed that the usual type of bursaries be provided for Rev. D. O. Reece of Calgary and Rev. E. C. Armstrong of Montreal.

Conference Superintendents, Institutional Missions

Agreed that the matter of holding a Conference of Superintendents of Institutional Missions in 1962 be referred to the Executive.

Hospital Chaplaincies

1. Dr. Macdonald stated that the Board had been authorized to undertake up to eight pilot projects in hospital chaplaincies rather than the four originally contemplated.

Agreed to approve appointment of four chaplains, the Board underwriting half the cost of salary and maintenance in each case and the local Presbytery or City Council being responsible for the other half, as follows:

> Edmonton—Rev. F. S. Jennings Saskatoon—Rev. A. M. Greenaway Ottawa—Rev. Dr. Frank LeGras Halifax—Rev. M. A. MacMillan

It was further agreed that the Executive or Sub-Executive should name the other four chapains after consultation with the Superintendent concerned and the Board of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

2. Mental Hospitals: Agreed that the question of chapains for Mental Hospitals be referred to the Executive of the Board.

Downtown Surveys

Rev. George M. Morrison made a progress report, mentioning Halifax, Montreal and Vancouver as sites of surveys contemplated or under way.

Travel, Women Workers

Agreed that travel grant of Women Workers in the cities be increased to range from \$125 to \$200.

Apprentice Training, WoodGreen Centre

Mr. Morrison made a progress report with regard to the proposal to bring to WoodGreen Centre for one year's training men who had had four or five years in the pastorate, this Board and WoodGreen Foundation contributing annually \$1,500 each towards upkeep of such person.

Wesley Centre, Hamilton

A brief statement on the situation was made by Rev. H. M. Bailey.

Unemployment Counselling Services

A communication on this subject was referred to the Executive for study.

Language Publications

Agreed that grants for 1961 be as follows:

Statement, Director of Fund-Raising

Mr. Walter Thomson, Director of Fund-Raising, addressed the Board briefly.

Report of Committee on Appointment of Students

The Report of the Committee was presented by Rev. George M. Morrison and adopted as follows:

1. Summary of 1960

- (a) During the summer of 1960, 249 students were appointed by the Board under the "Student Pool" arrangements. Of these, 209 served on regular fields and the remainder, 40, were assigned to special work in Church Extension areas, on Immigration duty, to Inner City Institutional work, to week-end preaching in construction camps, etc.
- (b) The Plan for the Co-ordination of Student Salaries (i.e. "Student Pool") again governed the whole operation. A summary of the "Pool's" results over the past three years is presented. Of interest in the payments to the student missionaries are the following:
 - ---The 'Pool's' receipts enabled the Board to pay a basic weekly salary of \$39.00. More experienced students received bonuses of from \$1.00 to \$3.00 per week.
 - -Married students received an additional \$75.00 for the term.
 - -A supplement for lengthy service of \$10.00 per week was paid.

2. Summer of 1961

- (a) A large increase in the number of applicants for Student Fields over the 1960 numbers brought the total this spring to 321. However, of these 34 have already withdrawn their applications. Of the remainder, 58 were non-candidates who have shown some interest in a church vocation. Of the actual candidates for the ministry, 126 were applying for the first time.
- (b) The Committee, to date, has appointed 245 students under the following Superintendents:

Recommendations:

A. That, if possible, at least 250 students be appointed.

B. That detailed arrangements for 1961 "Pool" operations be as follows:

- (i) Continuation of "Student Pool" arrangement with an interim payment of \$37.00 per week.
- (ii) Travel Allowance as follows:

Church Extension—\$100. car per term (\$75. in 1960)

Institutions -\$75. car per term (\$50. in 1960)

----or actual public transportation costs.

- (iii) Married Students' Board Supplement: As an experiment for this year, a married student, whose wife is with him on the field and not employed in other remunerative work, should receive a board supplement of 50% of the rate applicable to the single student on that field.
- (iv) Car Depreciation Allowances ranging from \$75. to \$125. as last year.
- (v) The allowance for travel to the field for a wife be adjusted to be equal to the fare allowance paid the single student. (i.e. student and wife are to receive double the clergy coach fare plus berth, meals, and incidentals.)

(vi) No change in bonus payment for extra weeks served.

(vii) That every effort be made to forestall "early leavings" from the fields.

- (viii) No final payment to be made to any Student until his completed reports are in the hands of the Board.
 - (ix) The Literature Committee be asked to include an amount of \$500. in its Budget to cover the costs of *packets of materials* etc., for the students.
 - (x) The Literature Committee be asked to include an amount of \$1,500. in its Budget to provide each student proceeding for the first time to a field with two volumes of the *Interpreter's Bible*. Should the cost exceed this amount the Secretaries are asked to seek out alternative sources of income to cover the excess.
- (xi) The increased use by Congregations of the Student Adoption Plan.
- (xii) The Literature Committee be asked to include in its Budget an amount of \$100. to cover the revision and publication of the pamphlet "You and Your Student" as a spur to stewardship on student fields.
- (xiii) The Superintendents be asked to submit a list of fields requiring W.M.S. kits for use in *Daily Vacation Bible School* work and that the Board express its appreciation to the W.M.S. for this fine assistance.
- (xiv) The Budget for 1961 to cover this work be \$185,000.00.
 - (xv) A Committee comprised of Rev. G. M. Morrison, Rev. R. K. Shorten, Rev. H. M. Bailey and Mr. H. D. Campbell be asked to confer with the Secretary of General Council to investigate the possibility of simplifying the *Statistical Report* submitted by all Student missionaries, possibly by bringing it more in line with the regular statistical reports prepared by normal congregations.

Pacific North-West Missionary Conference

It was agreed that a total grant of \$300 be made available for delegates from the Conferences of British Columbia and Alberta attending the Pacific North-West Missionary Conference, and that, in addition, Rev. C. D. Powell be authorized to attend, his expenses to be paid by the Board of Home Missions.

Sunday School in the Home by Mail and Air

A report on the work of this Committee was presented by Miss Marion Brillinger, the National Supervisor. The Secretary expressed the appreciation of the Board to Miss Brillinger for her dedicated and efficient leadership, and to her assistant, Mrs. Abraham.

It was agreed to approve a grant of \$5,900 as the Board's share of the budget for this work.

Request of Bermuda Synod

1. The Secretary of the Board was authorized to visit the Synod of Bermuda at a time to be arranged.

2. Re Grace and Port Royal charges: Agreed to vote a grant of \$5,538 toward maintenance of the proposed new arrangement, as outlined by Rev. Milton Fraser.

3. It was further agreed that we ask Dr. A. S. Butt to answer a communication relative to the appointment of a supply for the newly arranged charge.

Report of National Committee on Church Extension

The recommendations of the Committee, submitted by Rev. H. M. Bailey, were adopted as follows:

1. That the handbook entitled "A Church Extension Handbook" be approved in principle, with each member of the Committee being invited to send suggestions to the Secretary of the National Committee on Church Extension by June 30, 1961, and that the final editing be referred to the Executive of the National Committee.

2. That a copy of the actions and recommendations on Church Extension passed by the Nineteenth General Council in 1960 be forwarded to all Conveners of Presbytery and Conference Committees on Church Extension, and that where there is no committee on Church Extension in the Presbytery it be sent to the Convener of the Home Missions Committee.

3. That the Executive of the Committee be: Rev. M. C. Macdonald, Chairman; Rev. H. M. Bailey, Secretary; Rev. W. M. Mustard, Rev. G. M. Morrison, Mr. A. H. Webster, Rev. H. E. D. Ashford, Rev. V. T. Mooney, Mr. R. S. Mills, Mr. W. Lockwood Miller, Mr. John Wedlake, Rev. J. C. Torrance.

Home Missions Library, Winnipeg

It was agreed to vote a grant of \$100 towards the establishment of a Home Missions Library in Winnipeg in 1961, the amount to be paid from the Super-Gift Fund.

Statement re Recruiting

Rev. G. M. Morrison made a brief statement on the work of the Inter-Board Committee on Recruiting.

Special Maintenance Grants

Halifax Presbytery, Edgewood: Agreed to make available the furniture grant in force at the time the manse was furnished, namely, \$600. Dauphin Presbytery, Winnipegosis-Ethelbert: Agreed to vote special grant of \$425.

Portage la Prairie Presbytery, Edwin-Long Plains: Agreed to authorize payment of \$35.33, outstanding account due the Manitoba Power Commission.

Norway House Presbytery, Red Sucker Lake: Agreed to authorize payment of \$90 to cover expenses of supervision in excess of amount previously voted.

Date of Annual Meeting

It was decided that the annual meeting of the Board should be held April 2nd-5th, 1962, with pre-Board Committees beginning March 26th.

Recommendations of Conference of Secretaries and Superintendents

The following action was taken on recommendation of the Conference of Secretaries and Superintendents:

Lay Supplies, Salary Scale

Re recommendation of Newfoundland Conference H.M. Committee with regard to grading the salaries of lay supplies:

(1) That in the appointing of Lay Supplies to full-time work it be the policy of the Board of Home Missions that in the case of such being under the age of twenty-eight, the salary be set at \$200 below the regular scale for the first year of service; that after the first year of satisfactory service, the salary be set at \$100 below the regular scale, and thereafter at the regular scale.

(2) That beginning January 1st, 1962, the salary differential between a married lay supply and an ordained minister be \$500.

Remuneration, Student Lay Supply

(1) That for weekend supply the rate be \$23 a week, to cover either:

- (a) providing Sunday services, including preaching and other Sunday assistance.
- (b) assisting with Sunday services and other programmes, plus leadership in a mid-week activity in institutional work.

(2) Re request of Sudbury Presbytery that consideration be given to salary basis of married, student lay supplies attending college: That the following be the basis of remuneration:

(a) During College term, six months: to cover provision of Sunday services and preaching and one other day of pastoral activity, including visiting and supervision of mid-week activities: salary—\$140 per month; travel—5 cents per mile to and from college, weekly; 5 cents per mile on field (Sunday mileage).

(b) Other than college term: salary at top minimum rate for lay supply.

That the above salary rates be retroactive to January 1, 1961.

That for single student lay supply, the above scale apply only in exceptional circumstances and as approved by the Board.

The Superintendents were requested to urge that such Presbytery supply be provided as close to college centres as is practicable in the interests of both students and economy in use of grants.

Lay Supplies, Study Course

That the Study Course for Lay Supplies be re-established; such course to be required for and available to all Lay Supplies under 60 years of age and recommended by the Superintendent of Missions, except those attending school or preparing for college and ordination; and that this become effective in 1962.

Lay Supplies, Moving Expenses

That the Board of Home Missions advance the moving expenses of lay supplies on the same basis as those of ministers under appointment by the Board, and that the charge be expected to refund an amount equal to the cost of the average move within the Conference.

Indian Lay Supplies, Salary Scale

That the following resolution be adopted:

Whereas a number of Indian laymen have proven themselves to be effective as lay supplies of the United Church;

Whereas their effectiveness is enhanced, when serving among their own people, by their knowledge of the language and culture of the people;

Whereas we believe this service can only be fully effective when such laymen have some training in the work of the ministry, including a knowledge of the English language; and

Whereas we have found that the Cook Christian Training School in Phoenix, Arizona, is equipped to be the most effective training school for this type of preparation known to us at the present time;

Be It Resolved that when an Indian serves as a full-time lay supply, the basis of his salary be:

(1) The full lay supply salary if he is a graduate of Cook Christian Training School (a minimum of three years) or has training which, in the judgment of this Board, is the equivalent thereof.

(2) Five hundred dollars less than the prevailing scale for lay supplies in the case of those who have not this training.

And that the above salary scale become effective May 1st, 1961.

Salary Increments, Indian Fields

(1) That, on the recommendation of the Presbytery and Superintendent, lay supplies serving Indian fields be given the benefit of the salary increment, effective July 1st, 1961, on the same basis as it is being paid to ordained ministers.

(2) That before recommending this increment for lay supplies, Presbyteries should be assured that: (a) the major part of the work is with Indians; and (b) the lay supply is rendering effective service.

(3) That, whereas working conditions and salaries have greatly improved since the system of increments was introduced; whereas we believe that if this system is continued indefinitely, it could well lead to criticism and resentment throughout the Church toward our workers because of this preferred treatment; and whereas we believe that other methods are already in effect by which special needs can be met (e.g., cost-of-living bonus), which are applicable to other workers in isolated areas; Be It Resolved that we look forward to the discontinuance of the system of paying salary increments above the prevailing scale to workers on Indian fields, and that to this end we suggest the following method:

That the present maximum (\$3,650 plus \$500, or \$3,200 plus \$500, as the case may be) be considered the maximum payable to any worker until such time as the general scale for minimum salaries reaches this figure; and that thereafter salaries be based on the scale used for other workers.

Christian Island, Missionary-Teacher

That remuneration for supply work by missionary-teacher be at rate of \$125 per month, retroactive to January 1st, 1961.

Travel Rates, Charges with Student Assistant

That sympathetic consideration be given to the request of Saskatchewan Conference H.M. Committee that the Board "review its policy of reducing the travel rates of Sunday mileage on aid-receiving charges with the addition of student assistance when the regular Sunday mileage is over 75 miles a Sunday, and where the minister is still responsible for work in the whole area."

Pilot Projects

That the following action be taken:

(1) That a Pastoral Charge, where four or more preaching appointments are justified and where a ministry (ordained or lay) of two or more is justified, may be designated as a special area in which the salary of the senior minister may be graded as in the case of Superintendents of Institutional Missions; and that the procedure for designating an area as "special" within the above terms of reference be the same as in the case of establishing an Institutional Mission, namely, Presbytery and Conference Home Missions Committee recommendation and final approval by the Board of Home Missions.

(2) That in such special areas: (a) a special allowance may be requested for secretarial help and office maintenance; and (b) a special allowance may be requested for field equipment.

Church Extension

(1) Hamilton Conference: That the Board of Home Missions make available a sum of money at the annual rate of \$3,500 toward the cost of providing a Church Extension planner for Hamilton Conference under the following arrangements:

(a) The appointee to be a layman.

- (b) The salary to be at the rate of the existing maximum for the Superintendent of an Institution (\$4,250), plus travel at \$500 and house allowance of \$1,000.
- (c) The appointee's work to be in the Halton Presbytery for the first twelve months and the Halton Extension Council to provide support at the rate of \$2,250 for one year.
- (d) The proposed appointee to be nominated by the Superintendent of Missions to the Executive or Sub-Executive of the Board of Home Missions for appointment.
- (e) The Hamilton Conference Home Missions Committee to be asked to make a recommendation to the 1962 meeting of the Board concerning future areas of work for the appointee and the arrangements for financing.

(2) Policy of Assistance for 1960: That decision be referred to the Executive of the Board.

(3) Grants to Church Extension Councils: That the following resolution be referred to the June meeting of the Executive:

Whereas some Extension Councils are experiencing difficulties in finding financial resources with which to accomplish Church Extension work because of (a) the unequal distribution of financial strength throughout the country; (b) the accidents of Conference or Presbytery boundaries, and/or (c) the varying degrees of competing demands for capital funds; and whereas the Board of Home Missions is making a limited number of grants available to such Extension Councils; therefore be it resolved that such assistance shall be for new work only and that it shall be repayable by the local congregation to the funds of the Church Extension Council.

Re Lynmour and Strawberry Hill, B.C.: Agreed that the Board should be prepared to give financial assistance directly to these two charges.

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(4) Relation of Minister's salary to Charge's eligibility for property grant: That in cases where a Church Extension congregation is calling a minister for the first time, and where the salary is up to \$3,800, there should be no penalty against the grant for a manse, and that where the salary is from \$3,800 to \$4,100, the grant should be reduced by the amount of salary in excess of \$3,800 and that in all such cases the full furnishings grant should be available.

(5) Portable Churches: That the Board should pay up to \$18,500, plus freight for a portable church; that it should be made available to a congregation rent free for three months from date of occupancy; after which rent should be not less than \$60 per month and not more than \$80 per month; occupancy to be for not more than three years unless otherwise arranged; and that the local congregation should refund \$2,000 of the total cost.

Resolution of Brandon Presbytery

That no action be taken on request of Brandon Presbytery that correspondence be "handled through the Secretary of Presbytery" rather than through the Home Mission Convener.

Manitoba Conference, Chaplaincy Needs

That a grant up to \$100 be approved towards expenses of Committee of Manitoba Conference studying the needs for various types of chaplains.

Charges assuming Self-Support

That, in the case of charges assuming self-support at the beginning of the year, it should be assumed that no grant is required for the first quarter of the new year, unless Superintendent or Presbytery specifically names a different effective date.

Telephone Costs

That in the case of Wesley Centre, Hamilton, and Police Court Chaplaincy, Toronto, telephone costs should be paid by the Board.

Western Tour, Rev. G. A. Koponen

That no action be taken on proposed western tour by Rev. G. A. Koponen, Finnish minister at the Lakehead.

Car Subsidies

1. Cancellations: That the cancellation of a car subsidy at \$125 per year be permitted where the total of salary and travel allowance is not more than \$125 in excess of the current Home Mission rate; and that where the amount received in salary and travel exceeds the Home Mission rate by more than \$125, the amount cancelled should be reduced by that excess.

2. Lay Supplies: That the regulation now in force be revised as follows:

That a loan of \$500 be available once only, where needed, to each lay supply who, in the opinion of Presbytery and the Superintendent of Missions, is likely to give continued and acceptable service to the Church, and is *not* receiving more than the current minimum for salary and travel allowance. This is to be repaid in quarterly amounts of \$25, with the first payment due on the last day of the quarter following receipt of the loan. Interest at 3% per annum will be charged on the balance remaining at the end of each year except the year in which the loan is made. A grant to cover freight differential will be paid the same as to ordinands.

Insurance.

1. Comprehensive Liability Insurance: That comprehensive liability insurance on all properties operated by the Board of Home Missions, including Indian Residential Schools, be placed for \$200,000 inclusive, to be written for a three-year period at two and a half times the annual premium.

2. Alert Bay Aircraft: That Mr. H. D. Campbell ask the Board's insurance brokers to investigate what type of policy would best cover the needs, and report to the Executive or Sub-Executive for action.

3. Group Accident Insurance: That those persons who refuse to pay the personal annual premium of \$20 be covered only at the lower rate of insurance which formerly prevailed.

Vacancies and Supply

An estimate of vacant fields and available supply was submitted for information.

Compassionate Grant

On a compassionate basis, it was agreed that the Board would assist with the moving expenses of the Rev. A. H. Mundy from Vanderhoof, B.C., if he should move to a charge in the Bay of Quinte Conference.

Report of Appropriations Committee

The Report of the Appropriations Committee was presented by Dr. M. C. Macdonald and was adopted as follows:

I. Salary and Travel Allowance

(1) That we carry out the instructions of the Nineteenth General Council in reference to the minimum salary and travel allowance as follows:

> "That the General Council increase the minimum salary for married ordained ministers from \$3,500 to \$3,800, together with a free furnished house, and that the Board of Home Missions be asked to implement this increase over a two-year period, \$150 in

1961 and \$150 in 1962. (Single ordained ministers on the same basis as married ordained ministers in salary and travel only.)"

- (2) That for 1961 the salaries be built up to \$3,650 and that the travel allowance in force in 1960 be continued.
- (3) That all aid-receiving charges be notified, through the Presbytery Home Mission Convener and the Superintendent of Home Missions, of the new salary and travel scale for 1961.

The realization of this scale will depend on each charge fulfilling its salary promise and increasing it where possible.

(4) That charges not now aid-receiving and whose salary scale is below \$3,650 and whose car travel allowance is below the 1961 travel scale, shall, through proper Presbytery action, make application to the Board of Home Missions for adjustment by way of special grant as soon as possible after the end of the calendar year.

That to qualify for such special grants, these charges must conform to the regulations re canvass, as follows:

(a) Conduct an every-person and family canvass as soon as possible, but in any case before the fall meeting of the Presbytery concerned. Such canvass must produce a minimum increase in contributions towards the salary of \$100 over the amount paid in 1960.

(b) Further, these charges are expected to pay, in addition to salary, a car travel allowance equivalent to the Home Mission scale.

- (5) That car travel allowance will be made only where the minister owns and operates his car in the pursuit of his duties.
- (6) That, to assist charges in reaching the General Council scale, each Presbytery be asked to appoint a Committee on Salaries (composed of three or more laymen and the Home Mission Convener), which will visit all charges requesting salary and/or travel grants. This Committee will advise and inform the charges concerned on matters of church finance, but especially on the salary and travel scale and the regulations, and also the method of conducting a proper canvass.

Before recommending that the Board of Home Missions pay a special grant on salary and/or travel to any charge not now on the list, Presbytery should be certain that a proper canvass was conducted and that the assistance requested is fully justified.

(7) That on the basis of estimates of contributions from congregations, the scale of salaries for 1961 be as on Schedule 1, below.

II. Education Grant

(a) That a special grant of \$175 be made to any married, ordained minister or lay supply, in receipt of salary not above the Home Mission minimum, for each child who has to leave home to pursue undergraduate studies at any University or Teacher's College, and that it be understood that such a grant is not applicable to students taking a Theological course; special cases to be dealt with on their merits.

- (b) That a grant be made for not more than four years for a student in Arts or Science course and for not more than five in a Medical or Dental course; and that if a student fails in his year, the grant will not be paid for the year in which he repeats the course.
- (c) That in making application a prescribed course be defined and the required university term be indicated.
- (d) That payment of the grant shall be made in two instalments—the first on receipt of a certificate of enrolment or attendance for the Fall term from the Registrar of the institution; the second on receipt of similar certification that the student is enrolled and in attendance for the term following the New Year.

III Travel Allowance for Transportation on Fields

- (a) In applying the scale it is understood that the total travel allowance given will be that which is nearest to the five mile division. For example, if a minister's mileage is 26 or 27 miles he will get the 25 mile rate, but if it is 28 or 29 miles he will get the 30 mile rate. The same principle will apply at other divisional points in the schedule.
- (b) An ordained minister in the active work, serving a 1-point charge with 150 or more families, and on which a minister (in the active work) would normally be settled, and which cannot be linked up by Presbytery with another appointment to make a larger charge, shall receive \$500 a year towards car maintenance and depreciation.
- (c) An ordained minister on a charge of two or more appointments, where the Sunday drive is less than 10 miles, and where Presbytery re-arrangement is impossible, shall receive \$500 a year towards his car maintenance and depreciation.
- (d) In charges where the summer and winter travel vary, the travel allowance will be worked out on the basis of three-quarters summer travel and one-quarter winter travel.
- (e) Charges, large or small, with exceptional conditions as to travel and location, and where re-arrangement by Presbytery is impossible, shall be dealt with on their merits.
- (f) Where there are two or more appointments and the minister is unable to operate a car to reach his preaching appointments or in the performance of pastoral duties, he be allowed up to the rate for Sunday mileage, without depreciation, after submitting accounts to the Board of Home Missions; each case to be dealt with on its merits. The travel allowance to be as on Schedule 2, below.

Report of Resolutions Committee

The Report of the Resolutions Committee, presented by Rev. D. G. Ray, was adopted as follows:

Appreciation:

The Board expresses appreciation to:

The Chairman, Rev. W. M. Mustard, D.D., for his gracious direction of the business sessions of the Board;

Rev. M. C. Macdonald, D.D., and his colleagues for their faithful direction of the Home Mission work from coast to coast, and for their acceptance of direction given by the Board;

The Superintendents of Missions for their work, and the leadership which they give, especially to Congregations and Presbyteries;

The office staff for their courteous and efficient service, and for their concern for detail which assures that the whole work of Home Missions is done with due regard to our trust;

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Military Cross. He retired from the Chaplaincy Service with the confirmed rank of Major, having served for a time with the rank of Lieut.-Colonel.

After a year at Queen's as a Veterans' Adviser, John Leng came to the Board of Home Missions in 1946, and has served with distinction as Assistant and then as Associate Secretary, until his resignation effective May 31st, 1961. His work with the Board of Home Missions has been marked by a meticulous concern for the discharge of the responsibility the Board has, to carry out the missionary mandate our Church has in Canada. This has been balanced with a great compassion and concern for all who serve in places where the work is difficult and in many situations discouraging.

His total contribution to the Board, by way of being the person he is and working the way he does, has meant more than words can express to the Board of Home Missions and to the other Boards of the Church.

Beyond our own Church, Dr. Leng has given effective leadership in the World Council of Churches, with a particular concern for Immigration.

In 1956, Queen's University conferred upon him the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity—an honour which rightly becomes the man.

As Dr. Leng takes up his new work as the minister of St. Andrew's Church, Oshawa, Ontario, the Board of Home Missions extends best wishes for the continuing effectiveness of his ministry. Rev. C. D. Powell, who presided at the piano during the periods of worship;

Chief Judge N. V. Buchanan, who, as a member of the Board, conducted the mid-week prayer service in the Chapel;

Rev. J. M. Wilkie, the minister of Deer Park United Church, the officials of the congregation, and the ladies of the Women's Association, for the facilities and hospitality provided for our Annual Dinner and Social Evening.

Rev. Gordon Walsh Porter, M.A., B.D., D.D.

Gordon Porter was born in the village of Millbrook, Durham County, Ontario. His early education was in the Lakefield High School and in Peterborough Collegiate. His University education was received at Queen's, Kingston, where he graduated with the B.A. and B.D. Degrees, and received his Master's Degree in Arts from the same University. There followed post graduate study in Edinburgh University.

His first student mission field was in the Dauphin area, Manitoba, and later, he was at Lavant Station, Ontario. Ordained at Brockville in 1934, his first pastoral charge was at Apsley in Peterborough Presbytery. Dr. Porter served as a Chaplain in the R.C.A.F. at home and overseas from 1939 to 1945.

St. Paul's-Avenue Road Church, Toronto, called him to be their minister in 1947, from which Church, after nine years' service, he was called to be a Home Mission Superintendent in the fall of 1956.

Since that time, Dr. Porter has served his Church well, first as Superintendent of the whole Montreal and Ottawa Conference and the three Eastern Presbyteries of the Bay of Quinte Conference, and, for the past year, in the whole of the Bay of Quinte Conference, where he has had some responsibility for Church Extension as well.

While it would be very difficult, and perhaps embarrassing, for a Superintendent to pick out any particular part of his work as appealing to him more than some others, yet certainly the dynamic aspect of the work in Eastern Quebec has been one of the highlights of that work.

Dr. Porter now leaves the service of the Board to continue his ministry in the regular pastorate. The Board of Home Missions expresses now a deep sense of appreciation of the fine service rendered by Dr. Porter during these five years. As he turns to a different aspect of the on-going work of the Church, it is our wish that God's richest blessing may follow him in the pastorate, and that he may have a long and fruitful ministry in the service of our Lord.

Rev. Harvey G. Forster, M.A., B.D., D.Th., D.D.

On June 30th of this year Dr. Harvey G. Forster, Superintendent of the All People's Churches in the Niagara Presbytery, will retire from the active service of the Church. Dr. Forster began his service as a Home Missionary of the Methodist Church in 1923 when he was appointed to the work among New Canadians in the Niagara Peninsula.

Dr. Forster was particularly fitted for this work by ability, training and Christian concern for the welfare of the New Canadian. For thirtyeight years he has given imaginative and dedicated leadership in this

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Home Mission enterprise. Through the years Dr. Forster's chief concern has been to make the message of the church relevant and effective in contemporary society, taking as his own special field of witness the communities of people from Central Europe who have settled in the industrial areas of Niagara Falls, Welland, Thorold South and Port Colborne. He sought to accomplish his purpose through the identification of himself in the life and work of these people. Dr. Forster has been a very close student of the cultural and religious background of the people he chose to serve and has used his knowledge with great skill and understanding.

While Dr. Forster's main interest has been in the field of Home Missions, he has served the church in other important capacities. For many years he has been a member of the Board of Publications, he has served on a variety of committees and commissions of the church and has represented the United Church on several ecumenical bodies. Dr. Forster is also an author of considerable ability and repute. Among his better known publications is the study of the mission of the Church in urban society, "The Church in the City Streets". Although this book was written many years ago it is read still with real profit by those who are concerned about the witness of Christianity in the City. He is also known to a large number of church people in Canada and elsewhere as the author of the devotional study "Holy Days".

When Dr. Foster retires, the United Church will lose from active service a loyal, dedicated and gifted servant.

We suggest that this statement concerning the contribution of Dr. Forster to the life and work of the church be included in the minutes of the Board of Home Missions and that the General Secretary of the Board forward to Dr. Forster an expression of our deep appreciation of the service he has rendered, and sincere good wishes as he and Mrs. Forster enter a period of well-earned retirement.

Rev. O. B. Strapp

Having reached the age of retirement, and having served the Church for forty years, Rev. Oliver B. Strapp made application for retirement as of December 31st, 1960, and left the Edmonton Indian Residential School early in January. He has devoted his entire ministry to the service of the Indian people, thirty-one and one-half years being spent in the Residential schools operated by our Church.

Born in October, 1892, in Kent, England, he came to Canada in 1911, where he lived at Oshawa and Kingston. He served with the Canadian Forces overseas from 1916 to 1919 and returned to continue his education. He attended McGill University and was ordained by the Methodist Church in 1924.'He served on Indian fields at Cape Croker and Muncey and in 1929 was appointed as vice-principal at the Mt. Elgin Indian Residential School at Muncey, July 1st, 1929. He became principal in 1934 and continued until 1944, when he was transferred to the Brandon school. In 1955 he was transferred to the Edmonton school where he remained until his retirement.

He was active in a number of fraternities, particularly the Rotary Club, in which he was elected Governor of District 171 for the year 1952-53. While at Muncey he was given an honourary membership in the Mohawk tribe of the Six Nations Confederacy and given the name Da-Ho-Ta-Ra-Tey-Ah. The Church and the Indian people have reason to be deeply grateful for the devoted service of "O.B." Strapp. The Board of Home Missions, under which he has served, records its appreciation of his dedicated leadership in his chosen field.

Rev. Herman E. Campbell, M.M., B.A., D.D.

After twelve years as Superintendent of Brunswick Street United Church in Halifax, Dr. Herman Campbell this June 30th will retire from the active ministry. On ordination June 17th, 1924, Dr. Campbell commenced his ministry at Ingonish, N.S., and subsequently served in six other Maritime charges before moving to Halifax in 1949. Christian Education was always a driving force with him and, together with his passion for the needs of people, made his a ministry of great depth and zeal.

Dr. Campbell saw three years of service in the First World War and was awarded the Military Medal for bravery in action. In the Second World War he served as a Y.M.C.A. field man. As a presbyter his work was always well done and Halifax Presbytery in 1959 recognized this by making him its Chairman. In the same year, he was honoured by Pine Hill Divinity Hall in the conferring of the Degree of Doctor of Divinity. He will be remembered longest by countless mothers and children in the inner-city area of his work at Brunswick Street.

The Board wishes Dr. Campbell to know how much it valued his past services and hopes that his vast knowledge of Halifax will be used after his retirement for the bettering of our inner-city ministry.

Miss Elizabeth W. Sharp

Miss Elizabeth W. Sharp completed forty years of dedicated service in Home Missions in July, 1961, having commenced her employment with the Board of Home Missions and Social Service of The Presbyterian Church in Canada on July 11th, 1921. After serving under the late Dr. J. H. Edmison, Secretary of the Presbyterian Board, a few years after Church Union she became Secretary to the late Dr. R. B. Cochrane, in which capacity she continued until his death eleven years later. Under the succeeding Secretaries of the Board, Dr. George Dorey and Dr. M. C. Macdonald, she was in charge of recording real property and the grants and loans from the Property Fund. In this capacity the meticulous care and conscientious dedication which characterized her work have been and will continue to be felt in this most important phase of Home Mission work. As Miss Sharp approaches her well-earned retirement, the Board expresses to her its deep appreciation for a lifetime of devoted service.

Miss Mabel L. Turner

For many years, the Secretaries, Superintendents and members of this Board have been aware of their indebtedness to Miss Mabel Turner for her quiet, efficient guidance during the sessions of the Board and its Executive, as well as her loyal and faithful service in the work of the office.

Miss Turner began her work with the Methodist Missionary Society on October 1st, 1920, when Dr. C. E. Manning was General Secretary. Subsequently, she has worked with Dr. R. B. Cochrane, Dr. George Dorey and Dr. M. C. Macdonald, and upon retirement on June 30th, will have given nearly forty-one years to the life and work of the Church. Few people have been able to combine so well the qualities of efficiency, humility and courtesy.

This Board records its deep appreciation of Miss Turner's incalculable contribution to its life and work and expresses the hope that she may enjoy many years of health in which to participate in the life of the Church which she has served so well.

Appreciation, Archer Memorial Hospital

We record our sincere appreciation of the outstanding professional work of Dr. Morley A. R. Young, of the loyal medical and nursing staff of Archer Memorial Hospital, and of the many volunteer assistants on the tragic occasion of the train and school bus collision at Lamont, Alberta, November 29th, 1960. The Hospital has a fine record of performance over many years but at the time of this accident it excelled itself. The success of the medical-hospital effort in caring for the accident victims was due, in part, to the meticulous care with which a disaster plan and exercises had been formulated and carried out in May, 1957: the credit for devising the plan belongs to the medical staff. All those who participated in the care of the injured exhibited a keen sense of devotion to duty and a genuine concern for their fellow humans.

When the accident occurred just before nine o'clock on a winter morning, the disaster plan was immediately set into operation, and within thirty minutes all living victims were under care in the hospital an almost incredible record; within an hour volunteer doctors and nurses, with extra equipment and supplies, from Edmonton, over forty miles away, were assisting the regular hospital staff, and former nurses from Archer Memorial from a large area around were either on duty or converging upon the Hospital. There is no doubt that this splendid teamwork did much to keep the death toll to seventeen and in making less serious the injuries of the twenty-five survivors. Both the medical and nursing staffs performed with high efficiency for long hours, and are greatly to be commended. The secretarial and maintenance staffs worked beyond the call of duty. Our staff chaplain played an especially important part in her help with families of victims, as well as with the victims themselves. To all of those we extend our sincere thanks.

In Christian love our hearts go out to those who have been bereaved. We would express our deep sympathy to the families and relatives of the victims, and we pray that God may strengthen and sustain them.

Congratulations - Klemtu Congregation

We rejoice with the congregation of Klemtu and the minister, Rev. William Robinson, in the completion of their fine new Church building and its dedication on Sunday, April 9th, 1961.

This new Church building is the realization of a dream through much planning, work, sacrificial giving and Christian dedication of the people and the minister. We congratulate them and look and pray for continued increase in the work of the Church and spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ on this part of the West Coast.

Transaction of Business Between Board Meetings
